PIPE LINES AND PAVING.

Commissioner Jones has secured authority for a bond issue to the amount of one hundred and sixty-five thousand dollars or thereabouts for the purpose of extending existing water mains and renewing old ones. This is in anticipation of paving to be carried on in future seasons by the (Commissioner of Public Works. In the programme already outlined there are certain features to which objection should be taken.

Mr. Jones' programme asks, among other things for the replacement of the twelve-inch main running alons (City Road. This pipe line is old and its in very bad shape. It extends from the Marsh Bridge via City Road, across the railway tracks at the foot of Dorchester street and along Paradise Row to Hawker's corner, where it connects with other lines furnishing water to the North End. Renewal of this whole City Road-Paradise Row stretch is imperative before paving of any nature is undertaken in view of the age and condition of the pipe. And, while this work is being done it is perhaps advisable, in view of turner development, to increase somewhat the size of that pipe. This, however,


