THE ANNUAL REPORT of McGill university to the governor-general has just been sent in. It reviews the work of the year, the changes that have been made, the wants of the institution, etc.

THE ORANGE BILLS were before the legislature again yesterday and the regular annual discussion took place upon them. The general feeling seemed to be that the Orange society should incorporate under the general act, as several other societies have done.

THE ORILLIA TIMES puts in a strong protest against the proposal to lower Lake Simcoe and the other lakes in the same chain, in order to reclaim certain lands now covered with water in the upper part of the county of York.

THERE IS ONE clause of the market fees bill which clearly requires amendment. It is that which authorizes the imposing of fees only "so long as tolls are levied and collected by and with the authority of any county or township council, on the roads of the county or counties adjacent to such municipality for a distance of one mile therefrom."

THE FUNDING BILL now before the United States congress is creating a serious disturbance in financial circles. The compulsory and restrictive features of the bill regard national banks will, it is feared, hamper the banks, and perhaps lead to an extensive withdrawal of circulation.

A comparison of the number of licenses issued under the old and new license laws shows that while the average in the six years 1875-76 was 5,728, the average in the five years 1876-77 was 3,841.

The best debate was resumed by Messrs. Farrow, Girouard (Jacques Cartier), and Arkel in favour of the government's policy, and Mr. Fleming against. The whole went into committee of ways and means, and discussed in detail the various resolutions amending the tariff, and adopted the changes on and after February 20th which the committee report and reported the resolutions adopted.

Yesterday was the last day affording any chance for the consideration of notices of motion, and several were disposed of by the courtesy of the government. Mr. Merrick has permitted to move the reference of the Orange bill to a private bill committee, with instructions to report the preamble with the bill to move for its passage.

A historical relic in the shape of a bagpipe, which saw service at the battle of Culloden, was yesterday presented by Mr. P. King, of Wolfe Island, to Mr. W. R. MacRae, of Kingston.

An inquiry into the wounding of Sergt. Belliveau of the 10th battalion, at the Belleville range in October last, will take place shortly before Lieut. Col. Stranbennie, D.A.G.

Dr. Deary, one of the census staff, was at Belleville yesterday, and instructed the missionaries for the three divisions of the county and for the county of Princes Edward in their duties, and arranging the sub-districts.

George R. Jones, an American who was arrested in Montreal for having stolen watches in his possession, has been acquitted, but a charge of smuggling has been made against him, and the watches placed under seizure.

The enquiry into the state of affairs existing in the Bradford blind asylum was continued yesterday. The evidence of two teachers was taken. The testimony of Mrs. Montgomery was damaging to the principal, Mr. Hamilton.

A meeting of the Ottawa agricultural society for the purpose of securing the consent of the members to the sale of the exhibition grounds, will be held to-day. A syndicate composed of local capitalists propose to purchase the grounds.

Mr. L. Casgrain, of the post-office department at Ottawa, has received from the treasury a cheque to receive him the amount paid for income tax, he having recently instituted a suit against the city and obtained judgment for the same.


