Subsequently Mr. Johnston remarked to the reporters that he was acting for the Ministers on the charges made by Mr. Ganev in the House; if there are new charges there may have to be a new retainer.

Admission of the Charges.

This is taken to indicate that a fight will be put up against the manner in which the charges have been drawn. There is sure to be a fight, and a squabbling on many points of the indictment. That is certain."

Full Text of Charges.

Here are the charges in full:

1. Robert Roswell Ganev, a member

of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, and as a member of the district of Manitoulin, make the following charges under the Royal Commission, dated the 26th day of March, 1903:

1. That on the occasion of the general elections in the Province of Ontario for the Legislative Assembly of the said province, holden on the 22nd and 24th days of May, A.D., 1902, I was elected a member of the political party known as the Conservative party in the Province of Ontario and an opponent of the political party known as the Liberal party, which, for some years past, has controlled the affairs of the Province of Ontario; and as such I became a candidate at the election for the said electoral district and was duly elected a member of the Legislative Assembly of the said electoral district.

2. That by constitutional law and usage it is required that a political party should have and possess the support in the Legislative Assembly

of the said Legislative Assembly in order to their continuance in office as a government and members of the Executive Council of the said province.

Result of Election.

3. The result of the general election was that 51 supporters of the government, or Liberal party, were declared elected, and 49 (including the self supporters of the opposition or Conservative party, were declared elected.

4. Within a very short time after the result of the election became known and pending certain recounts of votes which took place one of the

members (the late Mr. J. W. Munroe and his brother, Mr. J. C. Munroe) were the most ardent and able supporters. He died, and his son (North Renfrew) was thereby incapacitated. He still lives.

7/ In the electoral district of Lennox the result of the recount in that constituency (which was held on the 25th about the 8th day of July, 1892) was to declare the Conservative candidate (Mr. T. G. Clark) elected over the Liberal candidate (Mr. M. S. Steele), and the relative strength of the said political parties was thereby altered, when all returns were finally in for the 17th.



Only One New Boat to Be Built, a
Leeboard.

Montreal, April 8.—There will be only one
new Seawanhaka cup defender this year.

This will be one of the leeboard type, and is being built for the vice-comandore, Mr.

There will not even be a syndicate boat. This might at first glance indicate a lack of interest in the coming races, but it is nothing of the kind. SHAMROCK III. TRIAL SPINS.

Challenger for America's Cup Show-

Weymouth, Eng., April 9.—Over a 50-mile course, 15 to leeward and 15 to windward, the Shamrock III, to-day beat the Shamrock I, by 37 minutes and 26 seconds. Hitherto the challenger had shown weakness down the wind, but to-day she proved as good on this point of sailing as on any other, and better on all points than she had heretofore shown herself. Over ten minutes on the windward tack, the turning point at Lulworth Cove, and over seven minutes on the beat hump were the chief

A 15-mile run to leeward and a beat

one, giving a leeward as a windward test of 30 miles under conditions as similar as possible to those to be expected during the races for the America's Cup off Sandy Hook, was the course set for the two Shamrocks to-day. The breeze was very light, not over five knots, as the boats under club topsails, ranged up for the start, and were sent off from the mark at 10.00 a.m. The starting times were: Shamrock 1, 10.00.55; Shamrock 11, 10.01.00. In the opinion of experts Shamrock III. was really driven for probably the first time on this windward turn. Shamrock II. was hopelessly beaten from the start. Shamrock I. was wholly unable to match the pace set by the challenger. The latter passed Shamrock I. in about 17 minutes ahead of him.




SCIENCE OF CITY CONTROL

Glasgow Has Reduced Municipal Ownership of All Public Utilities to an Art.

TORONTO MAY PROFIT IN THIS

Street Cars, Telephones, Light and Other Commodities in the Field.

Glasgow, or in the local vernacular, "Glesca," is one of the many reasons for Scottish pride and, perhaps, its best excuse. The name is not steeped in the romance and glamor which glorifies Edinburgh, but the municipality has reduced to a science the principle of public ownership of public utilities. The city stands forth an unrivalled monument of the qualities which have given Scotland its place in the world's history. He who owns Glasgow as his birthplace knows he is a citizen of no mean city, but of one rich in memories of the past and rich in life to-day. Only in January last the corporation celebrated the 1300th anniversary of the death of St. Kentigern, or St. Mungo—clerk of venerable memory—founder of the city, and its patron saint. His monument, the stately cathedral founded on the spot where he built his humble dwelling place—at once church and cell—has been enshrined in the ancient form of the city's motto, "Let Glasgow flourish by the preaching of the word."

Growth of the City. Scotland did not like the Union, but the Union made Scotland. In 1707 the population of Glasgow was only 12,000. A century later it was 75,000—in 1811 it reached the 100,000. By 1881 it had doubled; in 1901 it topped 300,000. It saw 478,000. The census of 1901 gave the population as 761,709, occupying an area of 12,088 acres. Including the independent burghs of Govan, Kinning Park and Partick—really integral parts of the city—and the outlying suburbs, the inhabitants of the geographical area of greater Glasgow today exceed a million. The average density of population is 51 per acre; in Glasgow it is 84, and in some districts 300 per acre. Twenty per cent of the population live in houses of one room, 45 per cent in houses of two rooms. All this could not be accommodated in the old Glasgow, which embraced the most romantic district, which embraces the most beautiful scenery, and which, under public ownership, has been brought to the city of the North in that finest of his homes, "The Lady of the Lake." These lakes yield a practically unlimited supply of what has been pronounced by experts to be the best water for domestic use. The works were opened by Queen Victoria on Oct. 14, 1850, and have been enormously extended in more recent years. It is not possible to estimate all that this measure has brought of benefit to the citizens. In the mere matter of cost the water supply is sold at a rate of 32 cents per 100 gallons.
