Russian Empire.—In one of the foreign scientific journals there is a calculation, according to which the Russian Empire exceeds the terra firma of the Moon by 123,885 square leagues. The diameter of the moon is 803 leagues, consequently the surface is 2,505,261 square leagues. If in the moon, as in our earth, the fluid part, which we call sea, covers two-thirds of the surface, only 835.087 square niles remain for the terra firma. Now according to the calculations made in 1818, the Russian empire extends over a surface of 928,972 square leagues, the possessions in America included, consequently the express remains as above stated. According to another calculation, the Russian Empire extends over 170 degrees of longitude, and 26½ of latitude. It contains about 2-19th parts of terra firma, the 14th part of our femisphere, and the 28th part of our earth.
