FIRST EDITION. FIVE DAYS IN A DORY. FROZEN SAILORS PICKED UP AT SEA.

Dim Speck in Distance Proves to be Shipwrecked Men—Picked Up by Crew of Launch. By TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. BOSTON, April 7.—The schooner Sarah H. Pringle, says that on Friday, March 28, when he was under close reef he discovered a speck on the water fully two miles to leeward. Thinking it might be a man clinging to a spar he heaved down on the object, and as he neared found it to be a dory containing two men. As his vessel neared them one of the men was waved for a moment, then the signal dropped as though the one who waved it was in an exhausted condition. The men were rough and unshaven, and were breaking over the unfortunate occupants of the dory, but notwithstanding that, three volunteers manned one of the dories and were off to the rescue. They took the lost dory in tow, and on arriving at the vessel the men, who were overcome by fatigue, were lifted on board as carefully as possible. They were found to be somewhat frozen, and were rubbed with the soft loam that was picked up from about the dory. After three hours of hard work one of them was brought to his senses, but he could not speak and in answer to the question as to how many were lost he only held the dory he held up his frozen hand and counted five. Capt. McLaughlin took the utmost care of the men and hastened to Starbuck in the face of the gale. The authorities took charge of the men, who were unable to give any account of themselves or vessel.

THIRD EDITION. BOSTON WORKING GIRLS.

SOME OF THE CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THEY STRUGGLE. Over 30,000 Engaged in the Great Branches of Industry. There was a very large attendance last evening of voters at the Wednesday evening lecture of the Women's Educational and Industrial Union, given by Miss Katharine Compton, Wollsey College, Mrs. Abby Morton Diaz presided, and there were interesting numbers contributed by Miss Margson, with Miss Dore as accompanist. Miss Compton read a very interesting paper, which presented valuable statistics upon the life of the working women of the city who number 30,000, according to the census of '80. Of this number, 20,000 are engaged in purely professional work and about 10,000 in domestic service leaving about 10,000 engaged in the great branches of industry, trade and manufacture. The essayist addressed herself to four queries: "What is the working girl? 'How much does it cost them to live?' 'Can they lay up anything for a rainy day?' and 'What are the circumstances in which they live and work?' The average yearly income for the Boston working girl is \$25 a year, according to the report of 1888. Even New England girls can hardly make both ends meet, and one of these working girls had only ridden in a horse car once in four years. Yet the report reads that the average of these working women's organizations as giving a rose-colored view of a Boston working girl's wages. The report states that the working conditions are fairly good and above the average of other cities, but the girls complain bitterly of overcrowding, bad ventilation, bad drainage, basement rooms, attic rooms, and of immoral surroundings. The report upon living conditions does not show so good a state of affairs, for nearly one-third of the girls are in lodging houses. The report also pointed out that the girls are crowded into cheap, unhealthy shops. Skilled workers cannot get work, and a cheaper grade of clothing is put upon the market. A large share of the blame was laid upon the shoulders of the employers, and the abolition of the competitive system was the only remedy suggested. An animated discussion followed the reading of the paper, the session was adjourned after a pleasing song by Miss Margson.
