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ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
OF THE
ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

The Committee of Management of the St. George's Society, have the honor to submit the following report of their operations during the year closing this day.

St. George's Day was, as usual, celebrated by the attendance of the Society at Divine Service in the Cathedral. The Patron of the Society, his Lordship the Bishop of Quebec, was present and assisted at the communion service: prayers were read by the Rev. G. V. Housman; and the Rev. A. W. Mountain, B. A., preached a most excellent sermon, in which he took occasion to allude in a touching manner to the recent bereavement which our beloved Sovereign had suffered in the loss of her mother, the Duchess of Kent. An admirable musical service, appropriate to the occasion, was performed by Henry Carter, Esq., and the ladies and gentlemen of the volunteer choir of the Cathedral. The collection, owing to the unfavourable weather, did not amount to more than forty dollars.

It affords the Committee unfeigned pleasure to announce that the affairs of the Institution continue in the same prosperous state as was reported at the last annual meeting. The roll of the Society has had added to it during the year the names of seven Life members and eight Ordinary members. The Committee would here take occasion to impress upon all Ordinary members the great advantage which would

result not only to themselves but to the Society by their at once becoming Life Members, the premium for which is now reduced to the lowest possible amount—Five Pounds. The late Lord Durham when commencing the list of Life Membership of this Society, in alluding to the magnificent charitable institutions of our beloved mother country, thus expressed himself:—"Many of those now gigantic charities in England had a beginning as humble as yourselves, but were made permanent and lasting by Life Membership."

The Society, in common with all Her Majesty's subjects, sympathize with their beloved Sovereign, in the great bereavement she has suffered during the past year. The loss of her Royal mother the Duchess of Kent, above alluded to, and of the Prince Consort, is a deep affliction for our Queen, and will be mourned in every land where the many virtues of the Duchess, and the ability and amiability of character of Prince Albert were known, and which have endeared them to all classes.

During the past year the Society has had to regret the decease of four members, viz: Henry LeMesurier, Esq., one of the original members, its Vice-President, which office he filled three several years afterwards. He was also a Life Member, and died deservedly esteemed and deeply regretted. Mr. James Taylor who died lately very suddenly was also a Life Member, and was much respected. Mr. J. W. Home, also recently deceased, was an Ordinary Member of the Society and much esteemed as a highly respectable and enterprising citizen. And lastly, the board has had to deplore the loss of John Robert Cole, M. D. E., one of the Physicians to the Society. In the discharge of his duties to the sick generally and to the distressed of British origin, as our Physician, he had acquired for himself public esteem and the gratitude of the Society.

Anthony Anderson, born at Eldwyn, Northumberland, 1768. Died at Hedley Lodge, Quebec, 3rd of April 1847, at the age of 80 years.

John Racey, M. D. E., one of the Physicians to the Society. Died at Quebec, 25th October, 1847, at the age of 39 years.

William Philips. Died at Quebec, 4th April 1849 aged 59 years.

John Charlton Fisher, L.L.D., past President. Died on Steamer "Sarah Sands," on her passage from Liverpool to New York, on the 10th August, 1849, at the age of 55 years.

Abraham Lenfesty, born at Guernsey, 1810. Died at Quebec, 13th July, 1849, at the age of 40 years.

Thomas Yates. Died at Quebec, 13th July, 1849 at the age of 62 years.

William Benjamin Poston. Died at San Francisco, 13th October, 1850, at the age of 25 years.

William John Chapman Benson, native of Stepney, London. Died at Whitehall, U. S., 3rd December, 1850, at the age of 33 years.

Peter Paterson, native of Whitby, Yorkshire. Died at his residence Montmorency Falls, 12th June 1851, at the age of 83 years.

Stephen Codman, native of the City of Norwich, England, came to Canada, in 1816, as an organist to the Cathedral. Died at Quebec, 6th October, 1852, at the age of 56 years. The congregation have erected a tablet to his memory in the Cathedral Church.

William Patton, born at Low Leyton, Essex, London, 26th July, 1789 came to Canada, 16th June 1819; seven years President of St. George's Society. Died at Quebec, 14th August, 1853, at the age of 55 years.

Charles Poston, born at Whitechurch, Shropshire, 3rd October, 1788; came to Canada, 23rd May, 1815; past President. Died in England, 5th April, 1853.

General Edward Boxer, C. B., born at Dover, Kent. Died at Bala-klava, 14th June, 1855.

Peter Sheppard, native of Guernsey, came to Canada, in 1809. Died at Quebec, 23rd August, 1856, at the age of 63 years.

John Racey, Senior, native of Bath, came to Quebec in 1801. Died in England, in 1856, at the age of 73 years.

The Earl of Ellesmere, K. G., visited the United States in 1854, as one of the Queen's Commissioners to attend the opening of the New York Crystal Palace, which made him favorably known to the American people. He visited Quebec also at that time, and was the guest of the Earl of Elgin. He expired at Bridgewater House, St James, on Wednesday, the 18th March 1857. The deceased was born on the 1st Jan., 1800.

George Germain Ardouin, born at Quebec, 16th January, 1824. Died in Quebec, 23rd February, 1857, at the age of 37.

William Dupont, native of London, England, Died at Three Rivers, 5th November 1857, at the age of 58 years.

Robert, Roberts, born in 1797, Halkin, North Wales, came to Canada, 1819. Died at Quebec, 2nd July, 1858, at the age of 61 years.

Zaccheus Williams, born at Bangor, North Wales, 12th July, 1797. Died at Quebec, 19th November, 1858, at the age of 61 years.

John Robert Nathaniel Symes, Justice of the Peace, (senior Life Member of the Society.) Born at Camberwell, Surrey, 6th Jan., 1794. Came to Quebec, 22nd May, 1816. Died suddenly at the residence of his son, Dr. T. Fargues Symes, Coroner, Meaford, C. W., 10th December, 1858, at the age of 64 years. Was Treasurer from the formation of the Society, for sixteen years consecutively.

John Shaw, born at Devonport, England 27 Oct., 1811, came to Canada, July 6, 1833. Died at Quebec, 8th July, 1859.

I. R. Eckart, born at Quebec, 16th March, 1805. Died by accidental drowning at Lake St. Charles, near Quebec, July, 1859.

Wm. Dawson, born in Sunderland, England, 1786, elected a member of the Society in 1837. Died at Quebec, May, 1859.

Francis B. Nond, born at Quebec. Died at Montreal, 18th February, 1860, aged 39 years.

W. W. Wheeler, native of England. Died at Quebec, 20th November, 1860, aged 45 years.

Henry LeMesurier, Justice of the Peace, born at Guernsey. Died at Quebec, 25th May, aged 69 years.

James Taylor, born at Northumberland. Died at Quebec, 15th Novr., 1861, aged 46 years.
