

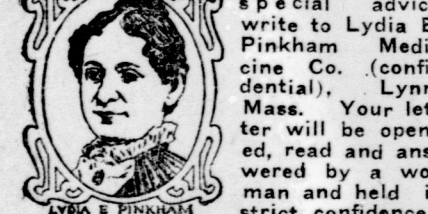

GERMANS WANT NO ENEMY IN BELGIUM

Why Assault On Antwerp Was Begun—First Tried Argument.

LONDON, Oct. 10.—3:40 a.m.—The correspondent of the Post at Antwerp, in describing the events leading up to the present situation at Antwerp, says: "About a month ago the German commanders began to realize the danger of the Belgian army occupying a fortified position, which continually threatened the German lines of communication."

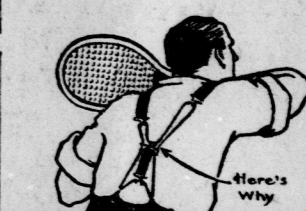

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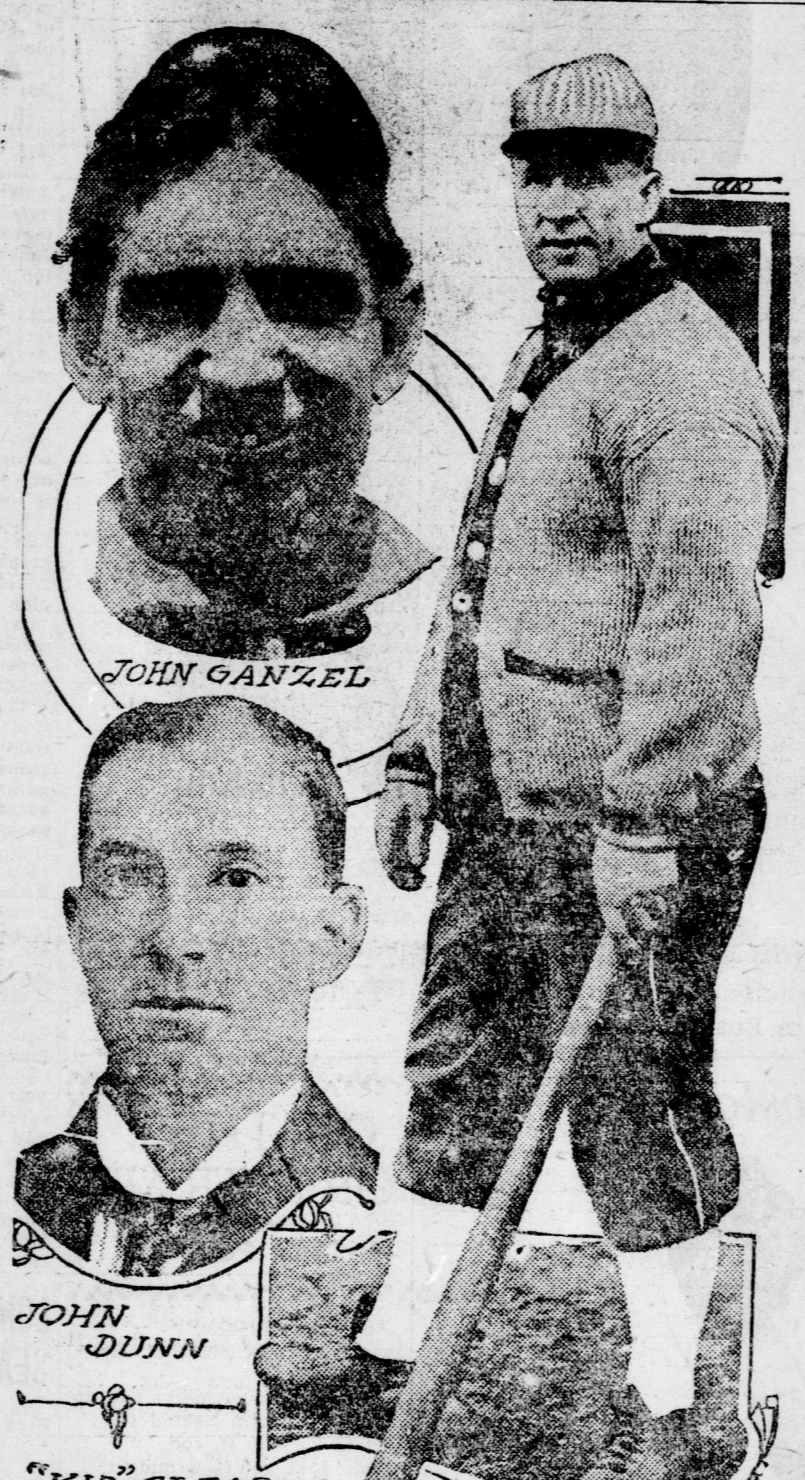

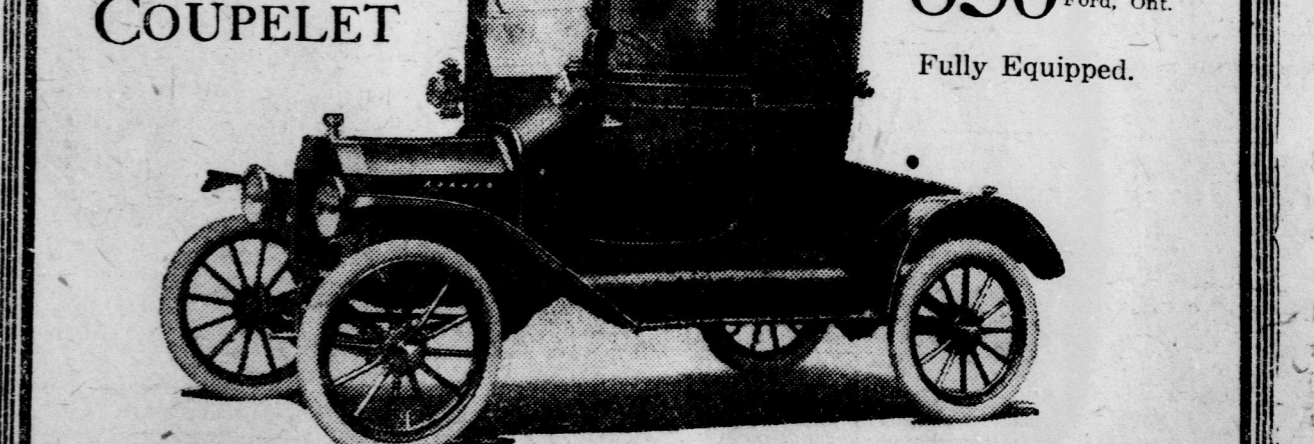
