FULTZ ORDERS PLAYERS TO STRIKE ON FEB. 20

Sets Date for Same Day as the Chicago Nationals Are To Report for Spring Training Camp—Davy Hands Out More Hot Stuff to Press—Ban Also Talks.

NEW YORK, Jan. 10.—David L. Fultz, president of the Baseball Players Fraternity, today set February 20 as the date the players' strike is likely to become effective. "The Chicago National League players have been instructed to report in Chicago on that date to make the trip to their training camp at Pasadena, Cal.," said Fultz. "If the present baseball game is not straightened out by that time, however, not one of the eighteen leading members of the team will move. The other clubs, who have unsigned free-agent players, will be up against a similar situation when they order mobilization at the training camps. The players simply will not budge. "We needed something to bulwark up on, and there seems no doubt that affiliation with the American Federation of Labor will prove a great benefit," continued Fultz. "I believe such affiliation will strengthen us sufficiently to win the requests we now ask for without carrying this strike into the season. I do not believe the club owners will want to antagonize the Federation, as baseball is largely a workingman's sport, especially in the western circuit, which are unionized much more strongly than some in the east. It would hardly be to the advantage of club owners to have inferior players in such cities. "Not only did six to seven hundred players sign pledges last season not to sign until instructed to do so,
