

CAP. IX.

An Act to continue, until the Twentieth Day of February One thousand eight hundred, several Laws relating to the Prevention and Punishment of Attempts to seduce Persons serving in His Majesty's Forces; to the empowering His Majesty to accept the Services of such Parts of the Militia of this Kingdom as may offer to ferve in Ireland; to the Admission of certain Articles of Merchandize in neutral Ships, and the iffuing of Orders in Council for that Purpose; to the authorizing His Majesty to make Regulations refpecting the Trade to the Cape of Good Hope; to the establishing Courts of Judicature in the Island of Newfoundland; to the enabling His Majesty to permit Goods to be imported into this Kingdom in neutral Ships; and to continue, until the Thirtieth Day of September One thousand eight hundred, an Act of the last Session of Parliament, for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation, and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty. HEREAS an Act was passed in the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the better Prevention and Punishment of Attempts to seduce Persons serving in His Majesty's Forces by Sea or Land from their Duty and Allegiance to His Majesty, or to incite them to Mutiny or Disobedience, which was to continue in force until the Expiration of One Month after the Commencement of the then next Session of Parliament; and which said Act was by several Acts further continued until the Expiration of Six Weeks. after the Commencement of the present Session of Parliament: And whereas an Act was made in the Thirty-eighth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Let for empowering His Majesty for a Time, and to an Extent to be limited, to accept the Services of fuch Parts of His Militia Forces in this Kingdom, as may voluntarily offer themselves to be employed in Ireland, which was to continue in force until the Expiration of One Calendar Month after the Day of the Commencement of the then next Session of Parliament; and which said Act was amended and further continued, by an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act to continue, until the Expiration of One Month after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, an Act passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, Chapter Sixty-six; videlicet, on the Twenty-first Day of June One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, intituled, An Act for · empowering His Majesty for a Time, and to an Extent to be limited, to accept the Scrvices of such Parts of His Militia Forces in this Kingdom, as may vo-' luntarily offer themselves to be employed in Ireland,' until the Expiration of One Month after the Commencement of the present Session of Parliament: And whereas an Act was made in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for rendering effectual His Majesty's Orders in Council of the Sixteenth and Twenty-first Days of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, respecting the Admission of the Effects mentioned in the said Orders, into the Ports of this Country to be warehoused; and for indemnifying all Persons who have acted in consequence of such Orders: And whereas another Act was made in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to make further Provision respecting Ships and Effects come into this Kingdom, to take the Benefit of His Majesty's Orders in Council of the Sixteenth and Twenty first Days of January One thousand seven hundred and ninety-five; and to provide for the Disposal of other Ships and Effects detained in or brought into the Ports of this Kingdom: And whereas another Act was made in the Thirty-sixth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to indemnify all Persons who have acted in consequence of Orders in Council, issued since the Twenty-second Day of November One thousand seven hundred and ninetyfive, for the Admission of certain Articles of Merchandize in Neutral Ships, and to authorize the issuing of Orders in Council for the like Purpose for a limited Time; which faid several Three last recited Acts were, by several Acts, further continued until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the present Session of Parliament: And whereas an Act was made in the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act, authorizing His Majesty, for a limited Time, to make Regulations respecting the Trade and Commerce to and from the Cape of Good Hope; which said last recited Act was, by several Acts, continued until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the present Session of Parliament: And whereas an Act was made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of

His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for establishing Courts of Judicature 33 Geo. III, in the Island of Newfoundland, and the Islands adjacent, which was to Cap. 76. continue in force until the Tenth Day of June One thousand seven hundred and ninety-four, and from thence to the End of the then next Sefsion of Parliament; and which, by several Acts, was further continued until the Tenth Day of June One thousand seven hundred and ninetyfeven, and from thence until the End of the then next Session of Parliament; and which faid Act was also revived and continued by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, until the Expiration of Thirty Days after the Commencement of the present Session of Parliament: And whereas an Act was passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act to enable His Majesty, by Order in Council, to permit, until 39 Geo. III, Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, such Cap. 112 Goods as shall be specified in such Order, to be imported into this Kingdom in Neutral Ships, which was to continue in force until the Expiration of Six Weeks after the Commencement of the present Session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient, that the faid several recited Acts, and all the Powers, Authorities, and Provisions, therein contained, should be further continued: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the said several recited Acts, and all Recited Acts the Powers, Authorities, and Provisions therein contained, shall be, and Feb. 20, 1800. the fame are hereby continued until the Twentieth Day of February One thousand eight hundred.

II. And whereas an Act was made in the last Session of Parliament, 39 Geo. III, intituled, An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation and cited, and permit the Importation of Corn, and for allowing the Importation of other continued till Articles of Provision, without Payment of Duty, to continue in force until Sept. 20, 1800. Six Weeks from the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament, which was to continue in force until the Expiration of Six Weeks from the Commencement of the present Session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that the faid Act should be further continued; be it therefore enacted, That the faid Act shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until the Thirtieth Day of September One thousand eight hundred.
