JOHN GOOCH came to Toronto, Canada, in 1854, as a Bibliographic-Bookseller; having previously procured to order, of Officials of the Parliamentary Library, various scarce and much wanted Books, and been promised their support here in the way of Trade; but, from this time he could not obtain their Notice of his Books or his Catalogue; they had changed the direction of their support in favour of other parties and, he is aware, orders were sent to New-York for Books wanted, which he had brought on and which were left on his hands.

When years had past, he refreighted a great part of his Stock to the U. States, and sold it there by auction at a loss.

A remainder, with additions made from time-to-time, make the Miscellany described, in this Catalogue.

He has extended the description of Books and Pamphlets so much in favour of those who are interested most in Literature; many enough he hopes they are and liberal enough to buy them all, at fair prices.


