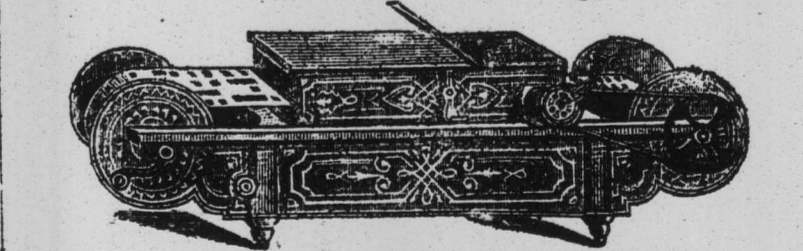

AROUND THE WORLD

A Mr. Frank Herman don, G. B., has just finished a tour of 106,000 miles. The following are notes by the fellow is an infidel scoffer, but his notes are interesting.

From London, he sailed to France, passed down to Spain and Portugal to Gibraltar, over into Morocco, Algiers, Corunna. Went down to country a short distance, to Malta and Port Said, through the Suez Canal, and thence by the Red Sea, to Aden, and thence by the deserts to Calcutta and the Pyramids, Alexandria, I viewed the Nile, which is now in York, and mused for quite a while on the beautiful drinking Queen manipulator in sewing buttons on trousers. Taking a day to Cairo, I spent 21 days in the pleasantest ever.

The weather was delightful, it seemed, to stretch one in the shade of the broad that care was banished to the world, and the milk of contentment was set along the banks, in the fields, the natives were just as they did, and with alter the same pattern, occasionally I would see a pigskin full of water on a tiny stream escaping in a nozzle, its flow being guided by his broad fingers.
