DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

OTTAWA, April 24.

A petition from the City of Toronto praying for the construction of the Ontario & Huron Ship Canal, but as it asked for a grant of money, it could nobe received.

Mr. Delorme inquired—whether it was the intention of the Government to take new measures for the purpose of placing on a more satisfactory footing the commercial relations existing between the United States and Canada.




