WEST WARD IMPROVEMENTS

Mr. McLagan presented an application from the representatives of the West Ward, praying for an increased grant of \$200 for street improvements in the West Ward.

Mr. McLagan moved, see Elliott, that the memorial from the West Ward Councillors be received and adopted. The Mayor thought that the proper

ourse was to refer the application to the Road and Bridge Committee. Mr. Elliott thought it was quite com-petent for the Council to consider the

application. If it were referred to the Road and Bridge Committee they would imply report "no funds."
