WHO PAYS THE DUTIES? On the question of "Who pays the duties" the Port Hope Globe takes the English lead, and makes out a good case by quoting a Toronto contemporary against itself. The Globe cannot believe that the price of the forty-five million bushels or thereabouts of barley grown in the United States in 1879 was fixed by that of the five and three quarter million bushels brought from Canada the same year.

It is clear, therefore, that we should get no benefit whatever from a commercial union with the States, for we should have a somewhat extended market for certain articles of produce at prices slightly higher than those now obtainable. For instance, inferior grades of barley now shut out by the duty might then be sent across the border. A few more wheat and corn crops, and their duty added might find an American market. The production of lumber would be stimulated, because the market would be more steady than it is now.

With American duties on our produce abolished we would have an "extended market" for the same, with "slightly better" prices. If this is not admitting that we are really paying the duties now on our produce exported to the States, then the English language is altered and reconstructed by the Globe for its own special use.

HOME MARKETS. Horace Greely used to insist that the principal effort of all fiscal legislation should be to bring the producer and consumer as near together as possible, or rather to hold that those whose interest it was to exchange the products of their labor should live as near each other as possible, in order that the expense of transport might be saved. This idea he used to condense into an axiom, the "plow and the loom should be neighbors." The sturdy old protectionist could never be brought to understand that the mere act of transporting goods, and the consequent employment of an army of men, is producing but in exchanging, could add anything to the wealth of the world.
