FEWER BURIALS IN NOVEMBER THAN FOR MONTHS PAST.

SE James' Cemetery Has the Lowest Record of Fourieen Vears—Analysis of the Ecturns of the City Interments—Diphtheria, Typhoid and Scarlet Fever Well Nigh Stamped Out.


The mortality returns for November are lower than for any, month this year. The interments at St. James' Cemetery were lower than they have been for any month during the past 14 years. Only on a few occasions of late years has the total of interments been under 200. the total deaths from the dreaded diphtheria, typhoid fever and scarlet fever were only 14, a very low figure compared with recent months.


Among the certified causes of tha 186 deaths were the following: Diphtheria 9, heart disease 6, scarlet fever 3, apoplexy 3, phthisis 3, pneumonia 3, typhoid fever 2, killed on tracks 2, drowning 2, found dead 1, harcotic poisoning 1, accident 1. Of the 186 interments in the month of the 186 latterments in the mon

typhoid or scarlet fever. Three persons died of diphtheria, one of apoplexy and one of heart disease.

At St. Michael's there was an increase of two deaths over November of last year, and a decrease of four compared with last October. Only four old persons were interred; the children numbered 18. 


