Everybody is discussing the industrial Exhibition and a number of the papers are calling in a pronounced way for a reform in its character and a reform in its management. And they seem to give reasons for their contentions. Their criticism, however, is too much of a destructive type. The thing to do is to reform the Exhibition and to improve it, and out of it to develop something that will be really magnificent and a credit not only to the city but to the country and an example to all others. The Industrial Exhibition, with all lis faults, is one of the most success-ful things of its kind in our day, and out of it could be made something still more progressive, and which would attract an immense number of people. Without discussing the question of reform in the administration at the present time, 1 would like to say one or two things as to its character and what could be made out of the like to say one or two things as to its character and what could be made out of the Industrial in providing a national spectacle for the amusement and education of the Canadian people. I would not for the present disturb the lidea of a collection and exhibition of the products of the soil, of our live stock and of our manufactures. I would keep that very much as it is and improve it, but I would take immediate steps to develop in connection with this exhibition a magnificent open-air spectacle on the lines of what now takes place in front of the Grand Stand, but improved im-mensely in every direction. I would get a committee to work, among which would be men who had a knowledge of the great national spectacles which were given by the balance becomes it would be augult possible to have in connection with our by the Hellenic peoples. It would be quite possible to have in connection with our annual Exhibition an immense amphitheatre, or grand stand, built on scientific lines, and which would have a proper stage or presentation lot in front of it. 1 would have the limits as to the size of this amphitheatre or stage defined only by the number of people who could be accommodated, and who could see the speciacie in front of it. It is for architects to find this out-it might be 50,000, it might be 75,000, or it might even be 100,000-but, having ascertained the limit, I would have this amphitheatre and stage designed in the best possible way for that limit. And having once had this arranged, i would have the performance repeated a sufficient number of times to accommodate all the people who wished to see it. If 50,000 could number of times to accommodate all the people who wished to see if. If 50,000 could see it twice a day, that would be 100,000 a day, and if haif a million wished to see it, it could be repeated for five days. Next, I, would airange for the spectacles, and they ought to be of the highest class, and of the most instructive kind. There could be gymnastic performances of all kinds, there could be spectacular comedy and pantomime, there could be exhibitions of trained animals, and there, could be high-class musical performances by bands of all kinds. Spiendid choruses could be personned. In the meetre could be are scale billecto poet could be presented. In the evenings the ineworks could be on a scale hitherto never contem-plated. And, above all, some kind or historical spectacle could be presented which would appeal to the national and patriotic scattlment, and which would be of great benefit in building up the nation. Incidents in the history of Canada could be utilized for this purpose. The battle of Queenston Heights, for instance, could be reproduced on a big scale and with the greatest care, and scores of similar subjects will at once suggest themselves to one posted in our history. Anyone who has read the history of the Greeks knows what a part these spectacles played in their national history, and, with all the improvements that civilization has put at our disposal, there is no reason why such a national spectacle should not take place annually in the city of Toronto, and why such a national spectricle should not thice place animality in the city of 10 onto, and why it should not attract hundreds of thousands of people. These great annual shows or spectacles would be given in the fall of the year, as now, immediately after the harvest, and would be, as in the old days, something of a festival. Every-body would make it a point to attend the spectacle. The city which was selected. as Toronto would be selected, for the performance would derive an immense advantage therefrom. We have all the materials in Toronto out of which to make such a spectacle, and we have a spiendid foundation in the present industrial Exhi-bition to build upon. If we decide on national spectacles, we have regiments of local militia, we have university students by the thousand, and every other means for giving a performance which would outrival in magnificence and instruction and in amusement, anything that has ever taken place in the past. All it wants is careful consideration, wise management and an appeal to the people. In the meantime, let us not so much throw stones at the present Exhibition as to get to work to im-prove it and to develop it on lines something like the above. The thing is to start right, and it will grow, just as the Greek spectacles from little knots of peo-ple gathered together to sing the praises of the harvest and the gathering of the grapes grew into the spiendid presentations of tragedies and comedies that have glorified the fellow-countrymen of Sophocles and Aristophanes.
