POSSIBILITIES OF ASHBRIDGE AND BAYVIEW. Hundreds of acres of land in and about Ashbridge Bay and Bayview can be reclaimed at a very low cost. This land would be excellently adapted for manufacturing purposes if it had railway communication and wharfage accommodation. The city views nearly all the property that would be benefited by reclamation. A great deal of it is available for factory purposes just as it stands, very little or no filling in being required. The improvement necessary to create an active demand for the property involves the construction of a railway along the north shore of the marsh and bay, the filling in of the marsh and the dredging of the bay for suitable wharfage. As to the railway, the lines along Eastern-avenue may be reclaimed at a very low cost. This land would be excellently adapted for manufacturing purposes if it had railway communication and wharfage accommodation.

DISCRIMINATION AGAINST CANADIAN SHIPPERS. The Government owes it to the country to adopt some measures whereby the Canadian railways will be prevented from discriminating against Canadian shippers. The Railway and Transportation Committee of the Canadian Manufacturers' Association yesterday brought up its question, and instances of the unjust treatment to which Canadians were subjected were referred to. The Weekly Star reveals that the Government is considering a report on the subject and cites some startling cases of discrimination in grain rates. The rate on United States grain from Midland, the Great Trunk's lake terminal, to Montreal is 4 1/2 cents per bushel. Canadian grain shipped to Montreal from the same point is charged 8 1/2 cents per bushel, or practically twice as much. The rate from Beaverton and Coldwater and intervening stations is 7 1/2 cents per bushel. The Railway Committee has already exercised its prerogative to regulate freight rates in the case of the coal oil traffic. Why should it not do so in the case of grain and farm produce generally? We do not see that it is necessary to wait for the proposed formation of a Railway Commission, but that the Government should take such steps as to regulate the rates on such lines as the city should take the matter in hand at once and protect the farmers and manufacturers of the railway extension at the hands of the railway companies.

AN INJUSTICE TO CANADA. Continental Steamship Company Combines with the Canadian Pacific Against This Country. Ottawa, May 7.—From the evidence of W. T. R.
