





automatically, the expense of an operator is eliminated.

Two sets of signals are sent out at regular intervals by means of an automatic contact maker, which replaces the ordinary Morse key. These signals are radiated, one set every ten seconds, the other every half minute, and it is proposed that each station attached to a lighthouse shall have a distinctive code signal.

A number of vessels are now fitted with one or other of the forms of apparatus known as wireless compasses, with which it is possible to detect the direction from which signals are emanating within a few degrees. It is maintained that these vessels could pick their way along the channel or round the coast in foggy weather by taking their bearings from the lighthouses signals if a sufficient number of the lighthouses were fitted with the automatic radiators. Two more stations have been prepared for the entrance to Havre, and several more will, it is anticipated, be installed in due course. Each station has a limited range only, in order to avoid complications in reading the signals.

Professor McMillan, who became famous m connection with Peary's expedition to the North Pole, is expected to arrive in the city soon to complete arrangements for the Crockerland, expedition which is to leave here in July of this year.

As at first planned, this expedition to the far north was to have left Sydney on July 20, 1912, under joint command of Professor Borup and Professor McMillan, but owing to the former's tragic death by drowning it was necessary to postpone the trip for a year. Up to last fall, when Professor McMillan was in this city returning from an exploration trip to northern Labrador, he had been unable to find anyone to take the place of his deceased partner, bnut it is understood, a prominent explorer scientist will accompany him whose name is not yet learned.

While here last summer Professor McMillan, gave a very interesting interview to the Post on this expedition, explaining its purpose, etc. "The expedition," the said, "will leave Sydney in July of 1913, in the Diana," a sealer chartered from Job Bros, of St. John's, Nfid.

"Our party will include a geologist, a zoologist, and a hydrographer; about five scientists in all, and leaving here in 1913, will remain in the north till 1915 when we come back again to the south and civilization. A Cause of Much Loss in Cattle Raising
Unfortunately for Canadian cattle raisers many calves are lost each year through the accident of premature birth. While no doubt many of these losses are due to injuries, a much greater number are caused by contagious abortion. When this disease obtains a foot hold in a herd the consequences are apt to be serious as it is readily transferred from animal to animal, making it almost impossible under usual farm conditions to raise calves for perhaps a series of years.

For the information of cattle raisers the Veterinary Director General has issued a reprint of a leaflet of the British Board of Agriculture and Fisheries on this disease, which is being made the subject of very careful study and experiment in the Old Country.

This reprint which constitutes a brief pamphlet of less than four pages, deals with the subject under the following heads:—Animals affected, The Microbe, Virulent Material and Method of Infection, Symptoms and Prevention.

It is written in plain language and contains information of great value to all cattle raisers and persons who are studying the disease. It is printed for free distribution to those who apply for it, but it is not sent out to the regular mailing list of the Publications Branch of the Depart






