Monday, October 1st.

Met at Leach Field Church at 7 o'clock. Preaching by Rev. F. R. Langford, from 1st Kings xviii. 37; followed by Rev. H. Francis and Bishop Smithers, and many of the Brethren; truly the Lord was in our midst. Adjourned.

Met at 7 o'clock, p. m. Brother Philip Hamton. Preached from John vii. 40; followed by F. R. Langford, H. Francis, Bishop Smithers, and many of the Brethren. The Lord was in our midst. Adjourned.

Tuesday Morning, September 30th.

Met at half-past eight o'clock. The Moderator called the Council to order and read Psalm xi. Prayer by Brother Joseph Sims.

Voted, That Bishop Smithers superintend the Minutes, and Rev. G. Neale write the Circular Letter.

Voted, That the letters be read from the various churches.

Voted, That Brother Isaac Clemmens be appointed Deacon and receive a letter of license.

Voted, That Brother George Edward Langford be Clerk for Weymouth Falls Church.

Voted, That all the Collectors be their own Treasurers.

There was a request from Weymouth Falls Church for the Association to be held with them next year; also from Dartmouth.

It was voted that the Association be held in Dartmouth next year, 1880. Adjourned.

Tuesday Afternoon.

Met at half-past 2 o'clock. Moderator called the Council to order and read the 101st Psalm. Prayer by Brother F. Ford.

Voted, That Rev. Edward Dixon preach the introductory sermon, and Rev. George R. Neal be his alternate.

Resolved, That a vote of thanks be tendered the friends of Granville Ferry Church and friends at large for their hospitality and kindness to the delegates and strangers. Adjourned.

Circular Letter.

OF THE WESTERN AFRICAN BAPTIST ASSOCIATION-OF NOVA SCOTIA 12TH SESSION, SEPTEMBER 27TH, 1879.

Dearly Beloved Brethren, -
