





STEEL STOCK **SALES AROUSE** SUSPICION

Sellers of U.S. Steel Dissatisfied Party.

CHICAGO & ALTON FALLS

Demand for Stocks Show Throughout the Day, While Progress of Railway Bills is Closely Watched.

New York, N. Y., June 10.—The lanquor of the demand for stocks which began already to be manifest yesterday, prompted a renewal of operations for the decline today on a moderate scale. The volume of the dealings expanded over those of yesterday, but only to a slight extent. The rumors of the identity of the sellers indicated the suspicion rife in the speculation that a purpose to depress prices for profit furnished the leading motive for the selling.

The depression was ascribed to dissatisfaction with the railread rate situation and to the condition in the copper trade. The selling of the coppers was attributed to a large extent, to Boston and foreign sources, and it had as explanation the accumulation of surplus stocks of the metal still going on a sharp-drop in the London price of the metal today and a feeling of discouragement over the sustained rate of production of the metal with no corresponding expansion in the demand. 




