#### BATTLESHIPS COLLIDE.

OVER FOUR HUNDRED OFFICERS AND MEN DROWNED.

LONDON, June 25.—A despatch from Tripoli, the British states that the British battleship, "Victoria," flagship of the Mediterranean squadron, collided with the British warship "Camperdown" while manoeuvring off Tripoli today. The "Victoria" had an enormous hole made in her side, through which the water poured in torrents. The hull quickly began to settle, and before those on board could cast loose their small boats the big ship went to the bottom, carrying down with her not less than 400 of her officers and crew. Among those lost is vice-admiral Taylor, commander of the "Victoria."

The results of the second ballots in 75 constituencies were known at midnight. With these additions to the list of candidates elected on June 15th, the strength of the parties so far as known is: Liberals 73, Social Democrats 41, Conservatives and Agrarians 33, National Liberals 33, Radical Unionists 11, Poles 13, Free Conservatives 14, Government Clericals 11, South German Democrats 6, Albanians 1, Bessarabians 12, anti-Semites 3, Guelphs 1, Danes 1, Bavarian Peasants League 1, Bavarian Farmers 1. Of these figures 148 are counted with the Opposition and 129 with the Government.
