John Reid, of Charlottetown, P. E. I., sued the corporation for damages for injuries sustained by him on the railway on Saturday afternoon, destroyed the Alma hotel and Trinity church, said to be the handsomest ecclesiastical edifice of its kind in the Dominion.

Nathan Leonard, farmer, of Yarmouth, N. S., was found on Saturday lying face down in a ditch near Yarmouth, N. S. It is supposed he was overcome by the heat or fell in a ditch.

At the Hamilton, Ont., asylum on Saturday, a lunatic named Joseph Burns struck another named David Moore, of Woodstock, Ont., over the head with a spike. Moore died a few hours later.
