BILL.

An Act for the granting of certain Lots in the Town of Bytown to *The Bytown and Prescott Railway Company*.

WHEREAS Lots numbers four, five and six on the west side of Dalhousie street, ten, eleven, twelve, and thirteen on the north side of Bolton street, and ten, eleven, twelve and thirteen, on the south side of Boteler street on Lot Letter O, in the Town of Bytown were reserved by Order of Council for the purpose of a Market site: And whereas the said Lots are unsuitable for that purpose, and the Municipal authorities of the Town of Bytown have made other provision for markets, and have expressed their concurrence in the said Lots being granted to *The Bytown and Prescott Railway Company*; And whereas the said Railway Company require the said Lots for ground for the Depôt at Bytown, and have petitioned for a grant thereof; Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

That it shall and may be lawful for Her Majesty, Her Heirs or Successors, to grant to *The Bytown and Prescott Railway Company* all and singular the said several Lots or parcels of land and premises, with the appurtenances, to hold to the said *The Bytown and Prescott Railway Company*, in fee simple for the uses of the said Company.

Preamble.

The Lots mentioned in the Preamble may be granted to The Bytown and Prescott Railway Company.
