
Maple sugar and maple syrup production come as the first attack in the greater production campaign for 1915. The call for tood of all kinds comes to Canasa and all Canada, cast and west, to save the situation must produce this year as never before.

The first crop of the year, in Eastern Canada at least, and is parts of Masitoba and British Columbia as well, is secured by tapping the sugar maples. 
