### THE GRAND TRUNK CASE

From The Victoria, B.C., Times: Sir Thomas Shaughnessy has expressed himself as strongly opposed to the government granting assistance to the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway in any "shape, manner or form." The announcement is made in a letter to the Canadian Pacific Railway which has received from the Dominion of Canada at various times twenty million acres of land, part of which is now being sold, at from five cents a pound, free from taxation of any kind. There is a dispute as to the interpretation of the act of parliament under which the grant was made. The company's view is that its land should be free from taxation until it passes into the hands of people who are not entitled to it. That is really what its contention amounts to. Some of the more radical members of the party have insisted upon the bill of amendment through parliament in the indefinite government of the day. The House were disposed to insist that the company should be compelled to accept the bill as it stands. It is, in fact, that parliament should interpret its own act. ### AT THE CANADIAN CLUB

Mr. Ames Would Treat Municipal Ownership as He Would Business.

A. E. Ames, at the Canadian Club luncheon yesterday, read a paper on "Conduct of Business," the main point of which, like that of the average lady's letter, was in the postscript. Mr. Ames cleared the way for a careful discussion on this vital topic by generalizing his remarks on business methods. He said he was aware of the dangerous ground he was treading on when he spoke of municipal ownership, and spoke with great caution. "This is too momentous a question to be decided in a stampede," said he. "For there is great danger of going to extremes. There is no attempt on my part to disparage the movement for public control. At the same time, there are certain facts which should not be overlooked. Companies in Canada who have taken the risk may, in some cases, have received a great remuneration, but it is quite open to question whether this is by any means general. Certain safeguards of the public interest may not have proved efficient, but that is no reason why the whole scheme should be changed." Mr. Ames' advice was to close up the loopholes through which corporations had been able to escape the proper fulfillment of their duties. Government ownership was wanted, perhaps, but what was still more wanted was an intense, intelligent and unanimous interest in municipal and governmental affairs. "Business men," he said, "under government and, as the biggest of all businesses, should command the attention of all business men. Municipal ownership would do good, the providing of further checks on corporations would do good, but neither one should be carried to excess. The same motto could be applied to municipal ownership as to general business—"Be sure you are right, then go ahead."

### FARMERS WILL CO-OPERATE

Have Formed Harvesting Machine Company for Mutual Profit and Safety From Combine.

A new agricultural machinery company has just been formed, with a capital stock of \$1,000,000. It is known as the Farmers' Cooperative Harvesting Machine Company, Limited. A large tract of land has been purchased where plants are being covering some acres will be erected as soon as the weather permits of building the company is for the purpose of manufacturing, handling, buying and dealing in all ways in farming machinery of every description, including binders, mowers, rakes, seeders and cultivators, machines, pumps, windmills, wagons, carriages and tread power. Power is also granted them to purchase land and timber on the part of building and manufacturing. The movement is for the benefit of the agricultural community, whose support for its maintenance alone is a cooperative line, will be its strongest feature. By the cooperative principle the farmers who are shareholders will have a distinct advantage over those who are not by the fact of an allowance in the purchase price of the machines, and where they unite in purchasing a half dozen or more machines, an even larger discount will be granted. It is thus claimed that a farmer who shares in the purchase of the new concern will advantage himself to the extent that in supplying himself with all his implements for the year, he really saves the amount laid out for stock in the discount he gets on his purchases. There, again, he has dividends coming in on the stock held by him.

The motorman ran down Wyman-avenue and the crowd followed him, throwing stones and hatches.

Trapagan led his enemies until he fell and a hatchet grazed his shoulder.

As he rose he received a blow on the head from a club and a man had an axe raised to strike him, when Conductor Pattison rescued him.

He was taken to Davitt's morgue, while Mrs. Vaccara was carried to her home.

Trapagan and Pattison were arraigned by Coroner Wettenberger before City Judge Phelps, who held them in \$3000.
