CHICAGO GOSSIP.

Henry A. King & Co., 12 King-street east, received the following despatch to-day from Chicago:

There was a thin crowd in the pits to-day and after the opening the market became dull and inactive. St. Louis bought moderately around the lottom prices. The Northwest also sent some large buying orders. Among the local buyers were found Ream, Brosseau, Cudahy, Roche, Norton, Worthington and O'Brien. The weather in the Northwest is reported in Oalifornia. There has been a great number of weak holders wiped out the past few days, and the market is again in a healthy condition.
