#### ANNUAL REPORT.

The President and Directors of the Halifax Protestant Industrial School submit herewith, for the information of subscribers and the general public, their Annual Report for 1900, together with the Financial Statement of the Treasurer, and a list of . cash subscriptions and other donations received during the year.

The number of boys on the register at beginning of the year was thirty-six, sent to us as follows:—Seven by sentence of County Court Judges from different sections of the Province, seven for truancy (short terms,) eleven placed in the Home by parents or interested friends, and eleven by sentence of the City Magistrate.

Thirty-one boys were admitted during the year and nineteen left, their time having expired.

The conduct of the boys during the year was good and the health of all was excellent. Not once during the year were the services of a physician required.

*Physical Training.*—Twice a week exercises in physical drill have been conducted by Sergt. Major Long, with most beneficial results in improved discipline, and in the well set up appearance of the boys physically. During the visit of the Educational Association which held its meetings in the city, the boys gave an exhibition of free gymnastics and marching in the Public Gardens, which gave great pleasure to the large gathering present and evolved much favorable comment. They were also invited to give a display at the Provincial Exhibition in September, and received the thanks of the Commissioners for the interesting programme which they presented

*Property.*—During the year the main building was painted, all outside work requiring repairs being duly attended to.

The building formerly used as a shoe factory was repaired and strengthened, and turned into a gymnasium, a much needed adjunct to the institution and one much appreciated by the boys, affording a playroom for the winter evenings and during inclement weather.

The Sunday School is held regularly every Sunday, conducted by the Superintendent, assisted by Mr. Frank Theakston and Mr. Wm. A. Hart.

The day School is conducted by Mr. Gardiner who manifests great interest in his work. As many of the inmates came to the school under sentence of truancy, the Board of School Commissioners decided to have the school hours of the institution the same as in the city schools.

The Kindling Wood department is still carried on, most of the boys being employed, but the older and stronger boys work on the farm and do other light work as well. A Manual Training Room is being fitted up where each boy will have to spend an hour or more each day, and which is expected to prove a valuable department of instruction for the boys. Thanks are tendered to many friends for gifts at Christmas and at other times to regular subscribers and to the Wesleyan Book Room and the Presbyterian Witness for papers supplied each week.

Mr. and Mrs. Norman continue to discharge their onerous and responsible duties in a manner entirely satisfactory to the Board.
