II.—A partial Eclipse of the Sun June 7, 1899, visible at Greenwich.

III.—A total Eclipse of the Moon, June 22nd, 23rd, 1899, invisible at Greenwich.

IV.—An Annular Eclipse of the Sun December 2, 1899, invisible at Greenwich.

V.—A partial Eclipse of the Moon December 16, 1899, visible at Greenwich.

A Representative Assembly was first granted to this Colony in 1832, under the Governorship of Sir THOMAS COCHRANE. By the Constitution nine Districts were established, returning fifteen members, who were to hold their seats during Her Majesty's pleasure. In 1838 the members of the Assembly were elected for four years, and this term has been adhered to since that date. In 1854, upon the granting of Responsible Government, the number of members was increased, at the instance of the Imperial Government, to thirty. In 1874 the membership was further increased to thirty-one, by the addition of one member to the number of those representing the District of Twillingate and Fogo. In 1882 the number of members was increased to thirty-three, by the erection of St. George and St. Barbe into Districts, with one

The Box at Railway Station will also be cleared of late letters for despatch by rail ten minutes before starting of train.

3. Late letters may be posted on board the Coastal Steamers after 9 a. m. on morning of despatch up to time of starting.

4. There is a free delivery of letters and papers, by Carriers, throughout the city limits, twice a day, at 9.30 a. m. and 2.30 p. m. Carriers are authorized to collect insufficiently paid postage and *nothing further*.

5. The city limits for the delivery of letters and papers are as follows, viz. :—

From Railway Wharf, including Battery Road and Walshstown, Signal Hill Road round by Quidi Vidi Road to eastern gate of Hospital ; thence by Railway Track, west of Church of England Cemetery, to King's Bridge Way Office ; back to Circular Road to Belvidere Convent ; thence to Newtown Road to end of Le Marchant Road, and to junction of Poor Asylum Road with Hamilton Street ; Water Street West to Cross Roads, Riverhead.

**MONEY ORDER OFFICE.**

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit it by Money Order, if possible. If sent by letter, it should always be registered. No half-pence to be introduced into Orders. Money Orders issued and paid from 9 a. m. to 4 p. m.

**General Suggestions to the Public respecting Money Orders.**

This Office will not be liable for any Order after payment.

State correctly the Christian name and Surname of person to whom the Order is payable.

State correctly the Christian name and Surname of the person taking out an Order.

Should any alteration be made in the name of the person in whose favor an Order is drawn, a new Order will have to be issued and commission be paid thereon.

Unpaid Money Orders are legally void at the end of one year ; nevertheless, if any valid reason is adduced for delay in presentation, payment will be made upon application, subject to certain conditions.

**To Postmasters.**

Obtain from the presenter of a Money Order (whether he or she be the right owner or not) satisfactory information as to the christian name, surname and address of the person by whom drawn. In the case of a firm, the name of the firm and address will suffice. When an Order is presented through a bank, the Order being properly signed, must also be crossed with the banker's name.

**PARCEL POST.**

**Inland.**

Parcels not exceeding eleven pounds weight may be transmitted by post between places within the Colony (except to and from places with which postal communication is maintained by couriers carrying mails on foot), on payment of eight cents per pound weight, or two cents per quarter pound, and a further charge of two cents per quarter pound weight, or a fraction of a quarter pound above one pound. Such parcels shall not exceed three feet six inches as the greatest length, or six feet in length and girth combined, the girth being measured round the thickest part of the parcel. No parcel will be accepted which weighs more than eleven lbs., or that is not sufficiently paid ; the postage upon all parcels must in all cases be *paid in advance*, by means of ordinary adhesive postage stamps. Such parcels may be registered, the fee therefor being three cents.

### United Kingdom.

Parcels may be transmitted by Parcel Post to the United Kingdom (and through the United Kingdom with countries having a Parcel Post with the United Kingdom, of such weight, and at such special rates, as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Governor in Council), not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, nor three feet six inches in length, or six feet in length and girth measured together—the girth being measured around the thickest part of the parcel. The rate of postage on such parcels, which must in all cases be pre-paid, will be as follows: On parcels not exceeding one pound in weight, eighteen cents—this being the minimum charge; on parcels over one pound in weight, twelve cents per pound or fraction of a pound over and above the first pound—eleven pounds being the maximum weight. Parcels transmitted through the United Kingdom to countries with which the United Kingdom operates a parcel post system will be subject to the rates of postage chargeable by the United Kingdom on parcels to such countries, which postage shall be over and above the rates enumerated as aforesaid; such parcels as last referred to shall be subject to the rules respecting transit thereof, etc., of the United Kingdom.

**Compulsory Insurance.**

It will be compulsory for the senders of parcels containing coin, jewellery, or any other article of gold or silver, to insure the contents for at least part of their value.

Any uninsured parcel found in the United Kingdom to contain such articles will be compulsorily registered, the addressee being charged with a fee of 8d. stg. The same rule will be enforced in this Colony in regard to parcels from the United Kingdom.

None of the above regulations apply to parcels for the Dominion of Canada and the United States.

**Dominion of Canada.**

Parcels may be accepted at any Post Office in Newfoundland for the Dominion of Canada, subject to the conditions herein stated. The rate of postage being 15 cents per pound or fraction of a pound weight to all parts of Canada. No parcel can be forwarded if over seven pounds in weight, or if it measure more than two feet in length by one foot in width or depth.

**United States.**

Parcels are accepted for transmission to the United States, subject to the following rates :—

Not exceeding one pound ...	... 12 cents.
For each pound or fraction of a pound ...	... 12 cents.

No parcel may exceed eleven pounds in weight, three feet six inches in length, or six feet in length and girth combined.

No parcel may contain a letter, post card, or any writing (by hand or otherwise, of the nature of personal correspondence), publications which violate the copyright laws, poisons, explosives, inflammable substances, liquids, or articles which easily liquify, confections and pastes, live or dead animals (except dead insects or reptiles, when thoroughly dried), fruits, vegetables, lottery tickets, circulars or advertisements, all obscene or immoral articles, or any article that may in any way injure or destroy mail matter or injure the official handling the same.

**Registration.**

Parcels may be registered at the following rate of fees, that is to say : Inland or local rate, 3 cents ; to the United Kingdom, 4 cents ; to Canada and United States, 5 cents.

To all other countries the registration fee will be the same as the single rate of postage.

**General.**

No parcels shall be posted in a letter-box, but must in all cases be taken to the Post Office and presented at the wicket, where forms will be supplied and information given.

All foreign parcels received at the Post Offices in this Colony must be sent to the General Post Office, St. John's, to be made up in mails.

### GENERAL DIRECTIONS TO THE PUBLIC.

#### Letters.

Register all valuable letters.

Always communicate to the Postmaster the loss or delay of letters, &c.

Letters for Canada should be addressed to the Province as well as the Post Office.

Letters for the United States should be addressed to the State as well as the Post Office.

Address letters, &c., legibly, and be careful to discriminate between places of the same name.

A letter once posted becomes the property of the person to whom addressed, and must be forwarded according to its directions. On no application, however urgent, can it be delivered back to the writer or to any other person.

Letters containing gold or silver money, jewels, or anything liable to Customs' duties, cannot be forwarded by post beyond the Colony. In the Colony they *must* be registered. Always seal letters containing anything of value.

Letters addressed to mere initials will not be delivered unless addressed in care of a resident or to some box in the Post Office.

Letters bearing mutilated stamps, or stamps so soiled and defaced as to make it impossible for the sorting clerks to decide whether they have been used before or not, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office for adjudication.

Unpaid and insufficiently paid letters and mailable matter, both local and foreign, will be charged, on delivery, with double the amount of postage unpaid.

#### Re-directed Letters.

Letters re-directed to places in Newfoundland, Great Britain, Canada and the United States, without being taken out of the Post Office, are not liable to any additional postage.

#### Request Letters.

Letters addressed to persons in Newfoundland when sent in envelopes having written or printed thereon a request from the sender that the letter, if not delivered at the office addressed within a certain time specified in the request, may be returned to his address as requested, will be returned to the sender at the expiration of the time specified.

#### Newspapers.

Always fully pre-pay newspapers, or such will be taxed double the amount insufficiently paid. Unpaid newspapers will not be forwarded.

A newspaper must have no cover, or a cover open at both ends, which can easily be withdrawn. It must contain no enclosure. It must have no writing thereon but the name and address of the person to whom it is sent.

Newspapers over four ounces are charged at book rate.

**Books and Circulars.**

A book packet must be left open for inspection, it must not contain any enclosure, nor must it exceed twenty-four inches in length, nor twelve inches in breadth or depth. The limit of weight of a book packet addressed to any place within the Colony, Great Britain, Canada, or the United States, is three pounds. Postage—one cent per two ounces. Circulars—one cent each under two ounces.

**Patterns and Samples.**

Bona fide patterns and samples of merchandize, not exceeding twenty-four ounces in weight, when posted in Newfoundland for places within Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per two ounces weight, properly labelled, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection.

Packets of patterns and samples, addressed to any place in Newfoundland, can be registered on affixing thereto stamps of the value of three cents, in addition to postage stamps representing ordinary postage rate.

The limit of weight to Great Britain and British possessions is 5 lbs., the United States, 12 ounces, and all countries in Europe, 8 ounces—postage, two cents for the first four ounces, and one cent for every additional two ounces.

No article liable to Customs' duty can be sent as a sample or pattern to a Postal Union country.

**Registration.**

Every letter and packet intended for registration must be handed in at the wicket, and a receipt obtained therefor. On no account should it be dropped into the letter-box. The registration fee must be pre-paid on registered letters addressed to the Government Departments in St. John's, and also on registers sent by the Government offices to the Outports. The registration fee on letters and parcels to places in Newfoundland is three cents, including official registration; to Great Britain, four cents; to Canada and the United States, five cents.

Letters containing coin, &c., will be forwarded in the Colony only (charged with double registration fee if posted without being registered). Always obtain a receipt for registered letter or packet.

**Matter which cannot be forwarded by Post.**

Any explosive, dangerous or destructive substance, liquids, or anything likely to injure the mails or the person of any officer or servant of the Post Office. A glass bottle, or glass in any form (except eye-glasses, microscopic slides and spectacles, when properly put up), matches, leeches, or fruit.

Letters containing gold or silver money, jewels, or anything liable to Customs' duty, cannot be sent out of Newfoundland.

**EXAMINATION OF MASTERS AND MATES.**

Examinations will begin on Wednesday of each week, providing that the candidate produces the requisite certificates of character and time, and passes the color test.

Application must be made to the Examiner on Form Exn. 2, and all previous certificates and testimonials deposited at least two days previous to the examination. Testimonials of character and sobriety must be produced for twelve months immediately preceeding the application.

All services must be verified by a certificate of discharge.

An Only Mate must be not less than nineteen years of age, and must have served five years at sea.

A First Mate must be not less than nineteen years of age, and must have served five years at sea, of which one year must have been as Second or Only Mate. [From 1st January, 1896, the Officer's Service must have been performed with the requisite certificate].

A Master must be not less than twenty-one years of age, and he must have served six years at sea, of which one year must have been in the capacity not lower than Only Mate of a foreign-going vessel whilst holding a certificate not lower than an Only Mate's certificate for foreign-going vessels, and, unless this service as officer was performed whilst holding a First Mate's certificate for foreign-going vessels, he will also be required to prove the officer's service prescribed for that grade.

Steamers employed in the fisheries of the Colony shall be exempt, except when on foreign voyages.

Coastal Steamers shall also be exempt.

Subsidized Mail Steamers, in connection with the Colony, shall pay on the horse-power, at the rate of eight cents for each horse-power.

No Steamer shall pay more than forty dollars at one time.

All Coasting vessels which may take Pilots to pay one-half of the above rates of Pilotage in proportion to their tonnage.

The above scale of Pilotage shall be payable on the Register Tonnage of all such vessels, as ascertained before going out of the harbor.

In addition to the above rates one-third additional will be charged during Winter months, commencing on 10th December and ending on 10th April each year.

N. B.—Special rates will be charged during the ice season.

**Descriptions of Signals in use at the Block House, Signal Hill,  
St. John's, Newfoundland.**

Balls and Flags, hoisted in different positions on the Yard Arm, show the numbers of Sail that are signalled either North or South, viz. :—

One Sail in sight—Ball close up to yard.

Two Sail in sight—Ball midway between yard and parapet of Block House.

Three Sail in sight—Yellow Pennant close up to yard.

Four Sail in sight—Yellow Pennant midway between yard and parapet of Block House.

Five Sail in sight—Same as four, with addition of a Ball placed immediately above Pennant.

Six Sail in sight—Same as three, with addition of a Ball placed immediately beneath Pennant.

Seven Sail in sight—Same as four, with addition of a Ball placed immediately beneath Pennant.

Eight Sail in sight—Yellow Pennant at yard arm ; Ball midway between yard arm and parapet of Block House.

Nine Sail in sight—Ball at yard arm ; Yellow Pennant midway between yard and parapet of Block House.

Ten Sail in sight—Both Yellow Pennant and Ball close up to yard, the Ball above Pennant.

A Blue Pennant at the mast-head denotes a Barque.

A Blue-White-Red Pennant at the mast-head denotes a Barquentine.

A Red Pennant at the mast-head denotes a Brig.

A White-Red Pennant at the mast-head denotes a Brigantine.

A White-Blue Pennant at the mast-head denotes a Topsail Schooner.

A White Pennant at the mast-head denotes a Schooner.

A St. George's Cross at the mast-head of the middle Staff denotes a Steamer in sight from the Block House ; but, when it is hoisted on the South Staff, it denotes that the Steamer is South of Cape Spear.

When any National Flag is hoisted above the St. George's Cross, it denotes that a Man-of-War Steamer, belonging to the nation indicated by flag, is approaching the harbor.

A Blue Pennant and Blue Burgee, when hoisted together, show that a Sail has passed the Narrows, going either North or South.

When a Merchant's House-flag is hoisted on the South Staff it denotes that a vessel belonging to said merchant is South of Cape Spear ; and, when hoisted on the North Staff, it shows that said vessel is in sight of the Block House.

When a Square White Flag with a Red Ball in the centre is hoisted either on the North or South Centre Staff, it denotes that a Steam-tug is required.

The International Code of Signals is also in use at the Block House, and the recognized House Signals of the different merchants.

**St. Pierre Lights.**

*A Revolving Light*; giving first white flash, lasting 8 4-10 seconds, followed after an interval of 9 6-10 seconds by second white flash, lasting 8 7-10 seconds, then, after an interval of 12 6-10 seconds, by a red flash, lasting 8 7-10 seconds, another interval of 12 6-10 seconds, followed by the first white flash; 210 feet above the level of the sea, is situated on Gallantry Head. Distance visible, 18 miles. The light is hidden at the northward by the high land of St. Pierre. Latitude 46° 45' 43" N.; Longitude 56° 9' 52" W. Tower square, 36 feet high, painted white.

*The South Channel* entrance to St. Pierre harbor is marked by two small fixed lights. One is white, illuminating three-fourths of the horizon; it is placed on the battery. The other is red, and is placed on the plain at the north of the town. The White light is 36 feet above the sea level, and is visible six miles. The Red light is 65 feet above the sea level, and is visible three miles. The line connecting these two lights marks the middle channel. The Red light is so placed that as soon as it is seen on the left of Cape Aigle, vessels coming from Columbiar, in beating into the N. E. entrance, will be clear of the Cape Rodrigue Shoals.

*Pointe a Laconte Light*, situate on the southwest point of the Island of Dogs, 62 feet above the level of the sea, visible 7 miles. The light shows white between the bearings (from the tower) of S. E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S. and S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. This white sector of the light marks the South-east passage, so as to permit vessels which keep within this cove to avoid the Bataille shoal on the right and Cape Noir and Bertrand Rocks on the left. It shows red from S. W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W., westward, to N. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., and should be avoided by vessels entering by the S. E. passage. It will enable them when they have quit- ted the white cove to come to anchor in the Roadstead or in the Barachois, by following the line of white light from Pointe aux Canons and of the red light from the interior of the town.

*Pointe Plate (Langlade) Light*; 6th order dioptric, placed on the upper gallery of the Light tower; visible six miles. Latitude 46° 48' 54" N.; Longitude 56° 24' 10" W.

*Cape Blanc (Miquelon) Light*; revolving; showing 10 seconds in each minute; visible 16 miles. Shows white from North through W. to S. W., covering the Seal Rocks with a red sector of light. It also lights the entrance to Miquelon Roads, showing 230 yards north of the Chatte Shoals, which are thus left in darkness. The lighthouse is painted in alternate horizontal bands, black and white. Lat. 47° 05' 57" N.; long. 56° 24' 10" W.

NOTE.—Section 1, Chapter 54, Title 15, of the Consolidated Statutes, provides that Letters Patent can be issued by the Governor in Council for a term not exceeding fourteen years, with the proviso that they *may* be extended for a further term of seven years. Patents granted to non-residents which have not been brought into use in Newfoundland within two years from the date of the Patent are no longer valid.

Section 3 of the same Chapter provides that any person may obtain from the Colonial Secretary a copy of any such Letters Patent, or drawing relating to the same, also the Petition whereon the said Letters Patent were issued, on payment of the usual fees charged for copies of other documents.

For Caribou, 1st February to 15th July, both days inclusive, and from 7th October to 20th October, both days inclusive, in any year.

For Moose or Elk, for ten years from the 1st January, 1896.

For Otters, 1st April to 1st October, in any year.

SYNOPSIS OF LEGISLATION, 1898.

[PASSED 30TH MARCH, 1898].

CAP. 1.—*An Act relating to the Internal Economy of the Legislature.*—This Act provides that the officers of both branches of the Legislature shall be appointed by the Governor in Council by Commission under the Great Seal; that the Governor in Council shall also appoint a Commission of Internal Economy, consisting of the President and two members of the Legislative Council and the Speaker and three members of the House of Assembly; that the estimates of the necessary expenses of the Legislature, prepared by the clerks of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, shall be submitted to the Commission for approval, and that the money voted by the Legislature therefor shall be at the order of the Commissioners. All subordinate officers of the Legislature shall be appointed by the Commission, and they shall also arrange for its reporting and printing.

CAP. 2.—*An Act for the Encouragement of the Prosecution of the Seal Fishery by Sailing Vessels.*—Under this Act a bounty is provided to be paid (under rules to be made by the Governor in Council) to the outfitter of every registered sailing vessel fitted out in this colony which *bona fide* prosecutes the seal fishery, of \$4 per ton. No charge is to be made for berths in vessels outfitted under this Act.

CAP. 3.—*An Act respecting the Department of Marine and Fisheries.*—This Act provides for a Department of Marine and Fisheries and the appointment of a Minister of Marine and Fisheries, and also for a Superintendent of Fisheries, who shall be Deputy Minister. The following matters are under the control of this Department: (1) Pilots and pilotage, &c.; (2) Beacons, buoys, lights and light houses; (3) Signals and signal stations, steamers and vessels belonging to the Government; (4) Harbors, ports and harbor masters, piers, wharves and St. John's Dry Dock; (5) Classification of vessels, and examination and granting certificates of masters and mates and others in the merchant service; (6) Shipping masters and shipping officers, care of distressed seamen; (7) Ship building and inspection of steamers and vessels; (8) Wreck Commissioners and enquiries into causes of shipwreck, and generally such matters as refer to the marine and navigation of the colony and its dependencies. The Act also provides for a "Fisheries' Board," to consist of seven members, of whom three members and the Minister or Deputy Minister of Marine, who shall be chairman, shall be a quorum. Rules for the fisheries may be made by the Governor in Council, and shall be taken as part of the Act. Violations of the Act or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100 or imprisonment for two months, and confiscation of all implements used. Rivers and lakes may be set apart and leased for natural or artificial propagation of fish.

CAP. 4.—*An Act respecting the Prosecution of the Seal Fishery.*—This Act repeals previous laws on this subject and enacts that no steamer shall leave for the seal fishery till 8 o'clock a. m. of the 10th March, that no seals shall be killed till the 12th March or after the 1st May, under a penalty of \$4,000. No second trips are allowed except in case of accident

which compels a steamer to return to port, when she cannot leave later than the 25th March. Any master of a ship violating the law shall not be permitted to command a steamer at the seal fishery for two years after conviction. No more than three men for every seven tons gross register shall be allowed to any steamer. All penalties may be recovered in a summary manner before a magistrate, but no action shall be brought after six months from the time when the penalty shall have been incurred.

**CAP. 5.—An Act respecting the rights and privileges of the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Co. in Newfoundland.**—This Act is to remove doubts as to the effect of the Railway Act, 1898, upon the rights of the New York, Newfoundland and London Telegraph Co., and declares that the said Act shall not be held to abridge or alter or in any way affect any of the rights or privileges conferred by this charter on the said company.

**CAP. 6.—An Act to provide for the maintenance and operation of the Newfoundland Railway and for other purposes.**—By this Act, which consists of 103 sections, the whole Railway system of the colony is leased to Robt. G. Reid of Montreal, for fifty years; and at the end of that period, in consideration of \$1,000,000 paid within one year, to become his sole property. For operating the lines during the said fifty years the contractor is permitted to select from the Crown lands of the colony 2,500 acres of land for each one mile of main or branch railway operated. The contractor also agrees to take over and operate the Government Telegraph system, the Government paying therefor the sum of \$10,000 per annum 'til 1904, when the contractor will operate the lines free of subsidy. The contractor agrees to provide eight steamers for an improved mail service, one of them connecting Port au Basque with Sydney and another undertaking the Labrador service. The remaining six to ply on the various bays and along the other coasts of Newfoundland. The contractor purchases the Dry Dock from the Government for the sum of \$225,000, agrees to pave Water street, St. John's, for \$140,000, and to construct lines of Electric Railway through the city. Other sections in the Act provides for the construction of a branch line of railway into St. John's West, for re-railing part of the line, for taking over by the contractor of certain coal reservations, for the working of which due provision is made.

**CAP. 7.—An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain sums of Money for defraying certain expenses of the Public Service for the financial years ending respectively the 30th day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, the 30th day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and the 30th day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and for other purposes relating to the Public Service.**—In this Act are embodied the usual provisions of Supply, Road and Indemnity Acts. The form of appropriation is that adopted in Great Britain and Canada.

**CAP. 8.—An Act respecting Salaries.**—This Act specifies the salaries of the Governor and Heads of Departments, and provides that such salaries shall be paid monthly.

**CAP. 9.—An Act respecting certain Retiring Allowances.**—This Act includes all pensions payable by the colony, some of which had heretofore been provided for in the annual Supply Act.

CAP. 10.—*An Act to provide for the appropriation of certain sums of money and for other purposes.*—Under this Act the Receiver General, out of the \$1,000,000 paid by R. G. Reid under the Railway Act, may apply \$948,953 to the paying off certain debentures called in under Act 60 Vic., cap. 14, and place the \$325,000 paid for the Dock to Consolidated Revenue account. This Act also provides for a loan of \$349,857.32 to be applied to the erection of a Court-house in St. John's, the improvement of Lunatic Asylum and other public buildings and works.

CAP. 11.—*An Act to provide for certain payments on account of the s. s. "Greenland" Disaster.*—Under this Act \$5,500 is appropriated, \$4,800 to the use and benefit of the families of the men who lost their lives, and \$700 for funeral and other incidental expenses.

CAP. 12.—*An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain Duties on Goods, Wares and Merchandize imported into this Colony.*—This is the Revenue Act, but much more systematized than usual. It is impossible to abridge in any satisfactory way its lengthy provisions; but it may be said that as regards duties, whilst it lessens the tax on sugar and tea it increases it on luxuries and manufactured goods, and that it seems framed with the intention of aiding home industries.

CAP. 13.—*An Act respecting the Customs.*—This Act provides for the management of the Customs' business, for the entry and clearance of vessels, for the method of collecting revenue, and so forth—it is a long Act of 260 sections.

CAP. 14.—*An Act respecting the payment of certain Fees and Charges by Stamps.*—Under this Act the Governor in Council may direct the preparation of stamps of different denominations, and all instruments of Court and other public documents, upon which fees are payable to the colony, shall be stamped to the amount of the fee called for. The Act provides penalties for breaches.

CAP. 15.—*An Act respecting the Public Revenue, the raising of Loans authorized by the Legislature, and the Auditing of the Public Accounts.*—This Act, based upon that in force in Canada, provides for the audit of all public accounts by an Auditor appointed by the Governor, and the presentation of an annual report to the Legislature upon the expenditure, &c., of the year.

CAP. 16.—*An Act to amend Chapter XI. of the Consolidated Statutes of Newfoundland (Second Series), entitled "Of Loans upon the credit of the Colony issued in the United Kingdom."*—This Act provides that any loan authorized to be raised on the credit of the colony may be raised by the Receiver General in the United Kingdom of Great Britain.

CAP. 17.—*An Act respecting the Department of the Colonial Secretary.*—This Act constitutes the Department of the Colonial Secretary, provides for the appointment of the Minister and Deputy Minister, and defines those matters which shall be under the control of the Department, as follows:—(a) Education; (b) Elections and Registration of Voters; (c) Census and vital statistics; (d) Patents, copyrights and trades' marks; (e) Newspapers; (f) Public printing and stationery; (g) Weights

CAP. 18.—*An Act to constitute the Governor in Council the H. M. Attorney General.*—This Act gives the Governor in Council the power to appoint and remove the H. M. Attorney General, and to give him the duties which he may see fit to assign to him so far as the law may require.

**CAP. 18.—An Act respecting the Department of Justice.**—This Act constitutes the Department of Justice and provides for the appointment by the Governor in Council of a Minister of Justice, who shall be *ex officio* H. M. Attorney General for Newfoundland. The Minister of Justice shall have the following duties:— He shall be legal adviser of the Governor and a member of the Executive Council; he shall see that the administration of public affairs is in accordance with law; he shall have the superintendence of matters connected with the administration of justice; and, as Attorney General, shall be entrusted with the powers and charged with the duties which belong to the Attorney General of England by law or usage, so far as the same powers and duties are applicable to Newfoundland.

**CAP. 19.—An Act respecting the Departments of Finance and Customs.**—This Act constitutes the Department of Finance and Customs and provides for the appointment of a Minister and Deputy Minister of Finance and Customs. Under its provisions the Department of Finance deals with all matters relating to the public accounts, revenue and expenditure of the colony, and the Department of Customs has the control and management of the collection of duties of Customs and Excise and of the officers and servants employed in that service.

**CAP. 20.—An Act respecting the Department of Agriculture and Mines.**—This Act constitutes the Department of Agriculture and Mines and provides for the appointment of a Minister and Deputy Minister of Agriculture and Mines. Under this law the following subjects, as well as the officers and public bodies engaged in carrying out the laws relating thereto, are placed under the direction of the Minister of Agriculture and Mines: (a) Crown lands and ordnance and Admiralty lands; (b) Geology and natural history; (c) Mines and minerals; (d) Timber lands and lumber and pulp mills, and all manufactures; (e) Inspection and measurement of lumber; (f) Agriculture (including experimental farms, and laws relating to bounties for clearing and cultivating land and for settlement); (g) Game and sheep preservation, and diseases of animals and crops; (h) Immigration and emigration.

**CAP. 21.—An Act respecting the Public Works of Newfoundland.**—This Act constitutes the Department of Public Works and provides for the appointment of a Minister and Deputy Minister of Public Works, the latter being also the Chief Engineer of the Department. The Minister of Public Works shall have the management of harbor works, piers, roads and bridges, public buildings, vessels, dredges, scows, tools, implements and machinery for the improvement of navigation, and all other property belonging to the colony not specifically assigned to any other Department. This Act also provides for a Board of Works to confer with and advise upon all matters over which the Department has control.

**CAP. 22.—An Act respecting certain Contingent Charges of the Departments of the Public Service.**—This Act provides the method of obtaining and paying for the contingencies of the various Departments, such as

**CAP. 23.**—*An Act to amend the Law relating to Sheriffs.*—This law provides for the appointment of one Sheriff for Newfoundland and defines his duties.

**CAP. 24.**—*An Act respecting the Central District Court.*—This Act provides that one judge only shall constitute the Central District Court instead of two as heretofore.

**CAP. 25.**—*An Act to amend Chapter 120 of the Consolidated Statutes of Newfoundland (Second Series), entitled "Of Harbor Master and Harbor Regulations for the port of St. John's."*—Under the Act amended the Examiner of Masters and Mates was to be also Harbor Master. This Act permits an unreserved appointment.

**CAP. 26.**—*An Act to amend the Act 58th Vic., cap. 1, entitled "An Act respecting Union Bank Notes."*—This Act makes the limit of time for redemption by the Government of Union Bank notes the 30th June, 1898, instead of 31st December, 1897.

**CAP. 27.**—*An Act to amend the Act 58th Vic., cap. 2, entitled "An Act respecting Commercial Bank Notes."*—This Act makes the limit of time for redemption by the Government of Commercial Bank notes the 30th June, 1898, instead of 30th December, 1897.

**CAP. 28.**—*An Act respecting Bank Notes and Paper Currency.*—This Act provides that unless by special order of the Governor in Council, no Bank shall issue notes of a less denomination than \$5.00. By section four no person except a bank is permitted to issue notes or cheques intended to circulate as money. No bank in Newfoundland is permitted to charge discount or commission for cashing any official cheque of the Government.

**CAP. 29.**—*An Act respecting Pilots and Pilotage for the Port of Saint John's.*—This Act provides that there shall be twelve pilots for the port of St. John's, and if the number of licensed pilots be at any time less than twelve, the Commissioners may nominate applicants for examination before the Chief Examiner of Masters and Mates, and on his certificate as to qualification, the Commissioners shall license a sufficient number to keep up the required staff of pilots.

**CAP. 30.**—*An Act relating to Light Dues.*—This Act provides that Light dues shall be paid every twelve months by vessels trading with Newfoundland, and makes the proviso that Light dues on steamers repaired in St. John's may be remitted by the Receiver General.

**CAP. 31.**—*An Act respecting the Administration of Local Affairs.*—This Act provides for the control and management of local affairs by Divisional Boards to be elected for sections and under regulations to be prescribed by proclamation. Any householder (in the section) of one year is qualified to be a member, and Boards hold office for two years; each Board shall elect a chairman and deputy chairman, and the chairman shall annually make up the accounts of the Board and post them where they shall be open to the scrutiny of the electors. The powers of Divisional Boards shall extend to roads and bridges, cleansing and lighting of towns and set-

lements, removal of obstructions and abatement of nuisances, and the relief of the poor may be committed to them by Order in Council. They shall not be allowed to expend more than their actual receipts unless previously authorized by the Legislature. Boards may make rules for protecting their property, regulating drainage, and regulating conduct of officers, and imposing penalties, which on publication in *Royal Gazette* shall have the force of law. Payments for labor or relief of poor shall be made in cash.

**CAP. 32.—An Act respecting the Board of Agriculture.**—This Act repeals section 6 of Consolidated Statutes, chap. 14, which provides for an annual grant of \$4,000 to the Board of Agriculture.

**CAP. 33.—An Act for the Encouragement of Agriculture.**—This Act provides for the payment of a bonus of \$20 per acre, up to three acres, for land cleared and cultivated, and empowers the Government to clear and prepare for cultivation any Crown lands for the purpose of promoting settlement, to assist *bona fide* settlers, to establish model farms, and to import live stock and seeds and plants for distribution. Money for these purposes may be raised by loan to extent of \$100,000.

**CAP. 34.—An Act to amend the Law relating to Mining Leases.**—Under this Act the expenditure made in boring for oil on several leases of sufficient amount to entitle the lessee to a grant of one location, shall be held to entitle the lessee to a grant of any one or more of such locations.

**CAP. 35.—An Act respecting Coast and Inland Fisheries.**—This Act repeals caps. 124 and 125 of Consolidated Statutes (second series), and the Act 58 Vict., cap. 5, all relating to Coast and Inland Fisheries.

**CAP. 36.—An Act for the Encouragement of Cold Storage and other business.**—The Governor in Council, under this Act, may guarantee, up to five years, five per cent. on a paid up capital not exceeding £30,000 used in the business of cold storage in this colony. Plant, machinery, &c., required for the business shall be admitted free of duty.

**37.—An Act to amend the Judicature Act, 1889, and the law relating to Trial by Jury.**—This Act abolishes terms of Court and decrees that business may, subject to rules of Court, be transacted when and where requisite. There are other provisions in the Act relating to grand juries, fees in administration matters, empowering judges to make rules of Court, &c.

**38.—An Act respecting Trustees.**—This is a long Act relating to the duties and responsibilities of trustees which cannot satisfactorily be epitomized.

**39.—An Act to amend the law relating to Slander.**—This Act allows a suit for actionable words to be heard before a stipendiary Magistrate, who may adjudge damages not exceeding fifty dollars, or in default, two months' imprisonment.

**40.—An Act respecting Perjury.**—Under this Act any perjurer is guilty of misdemeanor and liable to fine and fourteen years imprisonment, and it declares that anyone who has taken a false oath as to facts required by any Act of the Legislature, or who knowingly affirms or subscribes to any

fact that is untrue, or knowingly omits any matter required by such law to be stated, is guilty of perjury and liable to be punished.

CAP. 41.—*An Act relating to Guarantee and Surety Companies.*

CAP. 42.—*An Act to amend the Election Act.*—Under this Act an elector may be sworn that he has not received anything for voting. No additions are allowed to polling stations after nomination day. The making of supplementary lists is abolished and any qualified voter may vote though his name is not on the register. No public work is allowed in a district ten days before election, except such as may be under contract pursuant to Act of Legislature, or work urgently necessary through flood or fire, or work performed under an elected board. Candidates are not allowed to travel on steamers employed by the Government in connection with elections, nor to control or advise returning officers. No public officer to hold office at an election, and candidates are not permitted to pay agents.

CAP. 43.—*An Act to amend the Education Act.*—This Act permits females to receive teachers' certificates, though they may not have passed any examination of the Council of Higher Education, and declares that a certificate of qualification for first grade shall not be granted to a teacher who has not been *bona fide* engaged in teaching for two years previous to his examination for such certificate. No graded teacher employed in a public school and holding the certificate of Associate of Arts from the Council of Higher Education, shall receive any of the grant to which he would be entitled under sections 6 and 11 of Education Act, 1895, unless he has first taught a school for at least three years.

CAP. 44.—*An Act to amend the Lunacy Act.*—This Act directs Justices as to their course in dealing with lunatics.

CAP. 45.—*An Act to amend "St. John's Municipal Act, 1892," and for other purposes.*—This Act provides that the Municipal Council shall consist of three members, one of whom shall be chairman, who shall be appointed by the Governor in Council. Power is given to the Council to levy further taxes than those already provided for. Section 12 makes St. John's responsible for \$1,210,000, expended by the Government upon municipal improvement, upon which the Council must pay the Receiver General four per cent., as well as the interest upon the cost of paving Water Street. Council may raise loan of \$1,350,000 at four per cent., and issue debentures for same, the proceeds to be paid to the Receiver General for discharge of such of the debentures of the colony as the Governor in Council may direct.

CAP. 46.—*An Act to continue for a further period "The Newfoundland French Treaties' Act."*—The French Treaties' Act is continued till 31st December, 1899.

CAP. 47.—*An Act relating to the Constitution of the Supreme Court.*—This Act provides that the Supreme Court shall be duly constituted notwithstanding a vacancy in the office of any judge. The judges shall be only removable by Her Majesty on address by both Houses of the Legislature. Chief Justice shall be paid salary of \$5,000 per annum, and the other judges \$4,000 each per annum.

## GAME LAWS (Abstract.)

**CARIBOU.**—Close season is, from 1st February to 15th July, and from 7th October to 10th November, inclusive ; that is to say, Caribou or Deer may be hunted upon and after 15th July till 7th day of October, and from 20th day of October till 1st February following. Penalty for violation of above, \$400.

No person, not usually resident in the Colony, shall kill or take caribou without having first procured therefor to himself a license, issued for the season, as herein-after provided, and shall pay for such license an annual fee of \$100, under a penalty of \$400. Provided, nevertheless, that no resident or officer of any British war-ship, stationed on the coast of this Island for fisheries protection shall be compelled to procure or pay for such annual license.

No one person shall, during any one season, kill or take more than three stag and two hind caribou under a penalty of \$400.

No venison allowed to be exported as an article of commerce ; and any person exporting, or carrying with him for private use, any venison, or the heads, antlers, or skins, must clear the same at the Custom House.

Dogs, pitfalls, snares and traps, are prohibited.

**GROUSE OR PARTRIDGE.**—Willow grouse, partridge or ptarmigan, cannot be shot between January 12th and September 15th ; nor shall any person be allowed to have in his possession, give away, barter or sell, or expose for sale, any willow grouse, partridge or ptarmigan, after the 22nd day of January, under a penalty of \$100.

**SNIPE, etc.**—Curlew, plover, snipe, or other wild or migratory birds (except wild geese), between January 12th and August 20th, under a penalty not exceeding \$200.

Wild rabbit or hare between March 1st and September 15th, under a penalty of twenty-five dollars.

Otter between April 1st and October 1st.

Beaver, close time to 1st October, 1900.

**GAME FISH.**—The following is the law for the preservation of game fish : No trout, char, white fish, land-locked salmon, or grilse, or any freshwater or migratory fish, can be caught, taken or killed in any lake, river or stream in this Colony, from 10th September to January 15th in each year, under a penalty of \$10 for each fish.

# SHEEP PRESERVATION!

**THE following Sections of the Acts 47th Vic., Cap. 7, and 50th Vic., Cap. 9, for the Preservation of Sheep, are published in consolidated form for the information of the Public:—**

1.—It shall be lawful for the duly qualified Electors resident within an area or District within this Colony to present to the Governor in Council a Petition or Requisition in the form prescribed in the schedule to this Act, or as near thereto as may be, setting forth the limits or boundaries within which such area or District is comprised, and the names of the towns harbors or settlements included therein, and praying for a Proclamation prohibiting the keeping of Dogs within such area or District.

2.—Such Petition or Requisition shall be sent to the nearest resident Stipendiary Magistrate, and shall be by him (after examination and certificate as hereinafter provided) furnished to the Governor in Council.

3.—Upon receipt of any such Petition or Requisition containing the signatures of not less than one-third of the Electors resident within any such area or District, certified as aforesaid, the Governor in Council shall issue a Proclamation or Public Notice prohibiting the keeping of Dogs within such area or District.

4.—From and after the day prescribed in and by such Proclamation or Notice, it shall not be lawful for any person resident within such area or District to keep, or to have in his possession, or under his control, any Dog within the area or District to which such Proclamation or Notice shall relate, under a penalty not exceeding Fifty Dollars, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding Three Months. This prohibition shall not apply to any person or persons travelling or passing through such area or Districts and having a licensed Dog or Dogs in his or their possession, charge or control, and not at large.

5.—It shall be the duty of all Police Constables to kill all Dogs found by them in any area or District in which the keeping of Dogs is prohibited under this Act, except Shepherd Dogs or Collies, and those excepted under the next preceding section, and all such Dogs not so excepted may be killed by any person whomsoever. And it shall be lawful for any person to destroy any Dog kept in contravention of the provisions of this Act.

\* \* All penalties under this Act may be sued for and recovered in a summary manner before a Stipendiary Magistrate or Justice of the Peace, and all fines shall be paid to the person who shall give information of the offence and prosecute the offender to conviction.

## SCHEDULE. FORM OF PETITION OR REQUISITION.

To HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

The Petition of the undersigned humbly sheweth,—

That your Petitioners are duly qualified Electors residing in an area or section of the Electoral District of \_\_\_\_\_, comprised and bounded as follows:

That the said area or section contains the following towns (or harbors or settlements, as the case may be).

That your Petitioners are desirous, and humbly pray Your Excellency in Council, that a Proclamation or Notice be issued under the provisions of an Act passed in the Forty-seventh year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, Cap. 7, entitled "An Act to provide for the better Preservation of Sheep, and for other purposes," prohibiting the keeping of Dogs within the above described area or section of the said District, and your Petitioners will ever pray.
