FIRST EDITION. THE INQUEST ENDED.

THE TESTIMONY TODAY AS TO THE RESISTANCE OF THE SAFETY VALVE.

All the Evidence Taken—The Coroner's Address—He Reviews the Testimony and Gives His Verdict.

SOUTH BAY, Dec. 10.—The South Bay inquest was resumed at 10 o'clock this morning. Mr. Barnhill is still watching the case for the crown. Mr. J. J. Fenwick made a statement that he took the arm of the safety valve to McEvilly's for the purpose of ascertaining what pressure would lift it. It was tested and it was found that 48 pounds would lift it with an extra weight and 18 pounds with an extra weight.

Mr. Barnhill: The frequent use of an extra weight would have no injurious effect on the boiler. If it had been used at the time of the explosion it would not render the boiler unsafe. If the statements of the engineer are correct regarding the safety valve lifting at 42 pounds with the ordinary weight and 48 with an extra weight, I would not think that the steam gauge was in error or something wrong with the safety valve. I have known cases where the gauge indicated incorrectly with the safety valve working properly there could be no danger arising from too much steam. I think the fire would account for the blowing of the safety valve in the standard with the ordinary weight present and that the water in the boiler I don't think a weak valve would cause such damage to be done.

After Mr. Fleming finished, all the evidence being in, Coroner Robinson addressed the jury. "The railway's path is full duty to perform holding this inquest," he said. "The destruction and loss of life occasioned by the explosion was the most disastrous known in this case there were several Gentlemen of the jury, you are all intelligent and trustworthy men. You have the evidence of practical men to take your verdict from. You have seen the tremendous force with which the boiler was thrown, 80 or 90 feet in the air and the other up on the bank. E. L. Jewett, the first witness, showed, gave evidence about the time the boiler was put in. They were in good order then and since then showed no signs of decay. Engineer Allen testified that he left everything in good order when he left the mill and about a wheel breaking being repaired. During the time this work was being done something evidently was wrong with the boiler, that I am not in a position to say. All the experts with the exception of George Waring, the witness who only account for the explosion by hot plates. Wm. Waring said that the boiler had been over-pressed on steam on by the explosion. Mr. Allen said 45 lbs would do it. George Waring said 50 lbs would do it. Mr. Logan was employed at the mill. Mr. Logan saw the boiler go up 80 or 90 feet in the air. Wm. Baird said during the time was with the watchman he saw the steam go up 58 lbs before blowing off and then increase to 88, still blowing off. Robert Curry saw some of the glasses with only 4 inches of water in them. Now, gentlemen, you have heard the testimony and you can judge from it. I will explain the law when you get testimony which agrees with common sense, and that which does not, you have to judge between them, (here the coroner read the law about inquests.) It now remains with the people to see whether or not I have done my duty. I have tried to do so to the best of my ability; you can choose between two verdicts, manslaughter or accident. Coroner Robinson made a few more remarks and in concluding thanked Mr. Barnhill for his able assistance in conducting the inquest. He also spoke of the press representatives having acted in a gentlemanly manner and attending to their duties faithfully and giving a correct account of the inquest. The jury adjourned for dinner at the coroner's address.
