HIGH PRICED ICE. How the Advance will Affect Consumers in the West. PHILADELPHIA, April 4.—The advance price that the ice companies have decided upon for the season means a matter of several cents more for the consumer.

The advance price is the result of the recent meeting of the ice dealers, who came together to agree upon uniform rates, as has been their custom for thirty years. This arrangement the dealers declare is not a trick, but it simply what Wall Street financiers term an "advance agreement."

The advance over last year's figures range from 25 per cent. for the eight-pound daily delivery, which is increased from 55 to 60 cents per week, to 100 per cent. for the delivery of 100 pounds per week instead of 70 cents.

The average advance throughout the last year was about 50 per cent. The advance for Philadelphia is 100 per cent. The advance for New York is 100 per cent.
