Ques. VI. *Who have died since last Conference?*

1. REV. JAMES SPENCER, A M.

James Spencer, was born in Stamford, C. W., the 7th February, 1812. While in his fifth year he lost his father by death, and thus from that early period was deprived of counsels and example so necessary to the formation of the youthful character. Notwithstanding his youth, he was remarkable for a quiet and orderly demeanour and conduct. To the important claims of religion he did not yield until he had reached his nineteenth year, when, under the ministry of Dr. E. Evans, at Lundy's Lane, he was brought to submit; and seeking the Lord with much earnestness of spirit, he obtained a knowledge of salvation by the remission of his sins. Then, or shortly afterwards, he became sensible of a call from the Head of the Church to preach the Gospel and to give himself up entirely to that work. But from a sense of unfitness for so great an undertaking he refused to comply. For several years he persisted in his refusal; not that he was unwilling to engage in other departments of service which our Church opens to its members, but, in this particular, so deep and strong was his sense of incompetency, that no remonstrance could induce him to overcome it. A course of providential chastisement now overtook him, and for several years he felt the hand of the Lord upon him in correction. It was at this time that the Rev. John Carroll affectionately counselled him to his duty, and so satisfied had Mr. Spencer become, that he must now yield or prepare himself for yet severer visitations, that he submitted and offered himself to the Church for the work the Lord had for him to do. He entered the ministry at the Conference of 1838, from which year to that of 1851, he laboured in various circuits with acceptance and effect. He was then appointed to the office of Editor of our Connexional paper, which, for nine years he filled with much credit to himself and advantage to our Church. At the Conference of 1860 he returned to the duties of the circuit work, first in Brampton and then in Paris, from which latter place, after a brief sojourn of four months, he was called to his rest in heaven.

As a preacher, bro. Spencer lacked some of those attractions of manner which tend, when judiciously employed, to give additional impressiveness to the word preached;

nevertheless, his matter was always appropriate and richly evangelical, while from a well stored mind he failed not largely to draw. The fruit of his ministry was seen in the conversion of sinners and the edification of believers; some of whom have preceded him to heaven, while others of them survive him, and gladly testify to the effectiveness of his ministry. In discharging his duties in his circuit or at the Conference he was ever kind and obliging, yet fearless and faithful, and being well versed in the disciplinary laws and usages of our Connexion, he was at all times ready to take a prominent part in enforcing or defending them. In the Conference or its Committees, (of many of which he was generally a member) his zeal, his ability, and faithfulness were always conspicuous; while few, even of those who felt it their duty at such times to oppose him, but will accord to him the praise of unvarying consistency of conduct and of high integrity of purpose.

As a writer, bro. Spencer was terse and clear. Having a mind of more than ordinary power, and much improved by culture, he was able to wield a ready and powerful pen upon any of the subjects of the day which came within the range of his office as Editor of the organ of our body; while in conducting a controversy, and that was often necessary, he wrote with a vigor of style and a force of argument which left little to be desired by the most ardent friend of the measures he advocated, or the cause he defended. The unprecedented period in our Conference of nine years, in which he was continued as our Editor by the annually expressed suffrages of his brethren, the fact that he was twice elected to the office of Secretary of the Conference, and once as our Representative to the British Conference, are striking testimonies to the high estimate his brethren placed upon his character and services.

Our brother's last illness was short but intensely severe. Yet he was enabled therein to give a rich exemplification of the power of the christianity he had professed and preached, and especially so as his end approached. The last two days of his life were to him a season of exultant and triumphant joy. He talked much of the triumphs of Christ and of the joys of the redeemed. "This" he said, "is the doctrine I have preached through my life, and now in death I'll cry, behold, behold the Lamb!" At one time he seemed to be sinking fast, and Mrs. Spencer said to him, "You will soon pass the dark valley," when with considerable animation he replied, "O, there is no dark valley

here; it is the valley of triumph; all bright and glorious." Again, when told there was no hope of his recovery, he said, "It seemed as though I ought to preach Christ a little longer." He expressed much feeling at leaving his family, when a friend asked him, "but, can you not trust them in the hands of the Lord?" he, after some moments in silent prayer, said, "I can, yes, I can trust them in His hands." To a brother in the ministry standing at his bedside he said, "Brother, I have known and loved you long, but never as I do now, I now love you in the Lord." Another of his ministerial brethren said to him, "You are now upon the Rock," when he promptly replied, "Yes, and I mean to keep there." In the forenoon of the day of his death he received the Sacrament, after which he shouted aloud in holy joy. Feeling his end drawing nigh, he had his children brought around his bed, and then, in a most impressive manner pronounced upon them his blessing. Thus he continued, witnessing for God, and cheering and comforting those around him until about five o'clock in the afternoon, when he departed this life for that which has fullness of joy and pleasures for evermore. In his case were the sentiments of the poet beautifully illustrated:—

"The chamber where the good man meets his fate,
Is privileged, beyond the common walks of virtuous life,
Quite on the verge of heaven."

2. REV. ROBERT BROWN,

Was a native of Ireland, but brought to Canada by his parents in infancy. While quite a youth he was converted to Christ, under the ministry of the Rev. John Black, on the St. Andrew's Circuit, where also he commenced his evangelistic toils as a local preacher. Removing subsequently to the United States, he was soon called to the ministry of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and laboured very successfully and acceptably for seven years in connection with the Vermont Conference. Influenced by commendable motives, he returned to Canada, and was received into our Conference in June 1856. The Huntingdon, the St. Andrew's, and the Eaton Circuits have since then been the scenes of his faithful and affectionate ministrations, which were greatly-blessed to the conversion of souls, and to the unity and spiritual progress of the churches confided to his pastoral care. But he was tested in the furnace of domestic affliction with unusual severity, which, in con-

nection with increasing devotion to exhaustive ministerial labours, at length induced complete physical prostration; and after suffering for several weeks from nervous and typhoid fever, which he endured with his wonted resignation to the Divine will, he passed away with serenity and christian triumph to "the Paradise of God," on the 4th of November last, leaving behind his afflicted widow and two daughters to mourn their incalculable loss. His memory will be tenderly cherished by multitudes who enjoyed his ministry; for his preaching generally was richly expository, and rendered attractive by great fluency and evident spiritual fervor. Possessed of eminent wisdom as a Superintendent, indefatigable as a Pastor, full of generous sympathies, and remarkably meek and affable, he was deservedly esteemed and loved, especially by those who could appreciate such a living exemplification of the "mind which was in Christ."

3. REV. KENNETH MCKENZIE,

Received his earliest religious impressions in the Episcopalian Church. While preparing for the ministry in that branch of the Church, he was induced to attend special services conducted by the Wesleyans on the Whitby Circuit. Here he decided fully to give his heart to God, and, in answer to believing prayer, he soon received a sense of the Divine favour.

He at once united with the Methodist Church, and feeling a deep conviction that God had called him to be more extensively 'useful, he immediately began to preach to others that Gospel which he had received, and which was the source of his joy and hope.

After labouring a short time as a Local Preacher on the Whitby Circuit, he was sent to the Newburgh Circuit, where he preached with acceptability and success.

At the Conference of 1863, he was received on trial, and appointed to the Chatham Circuit. He had scarcely entered upon his new field of labour when his health began to fail, and he had to retire from the work in which his whole heart was engaged. His health continued to decline; but while his physical strength yielded to the influence of disease, his faith in the Redeemer grew stronger, and his prospects of heaven became brighter. He died in great peace on the 25th December, 1863.

REPORT OF THE CHILDREN'S FUND COMMITTEE.

Toronto, June, 1864

The Committee beg to report a balance of \$768 70 in the hands of the Treasurer. This amount includes sundry notes and investments, with a surplus of \$180 on the transactions of the year after meeting the claims of 663 children.

Though 22 children have gone off the fund by age, death, and other causes, there is an increase of 51 over last year, making in all 714 children for whom support is to be provided. In view of this it will be seen that the rate per member must be greatly increased, or a percentage deducted from the amount payable to each claimant. The sum required for paying the disciplinary allowance of \$30 to each child is \$21,420, towards which the rate of 35 cents per member will yield \$19,262, leaving a deficiency of \$2,157, while the rate of 39 cents would be adequate for the purpose.

The Committee have made their estimate in accordance with the rate of 35 cents per member, already decided by the Conference, and find that no more than \$27 can be paid for each child.

The general accuracy and regularity in the working of the Fund secured by the present arrangements is matter of continued satisfaction, but it is earnestly requested that all the Financial Secretaries present their Schedules on the day previous to Conference.

Your Committee recommend the re-appointment of Rev. I. B. Howard as General Treasurer, and Rev. J. C. Slater as General Secretary.

REPORT OF THE SABBATH SCHOOL
COMMITTEE.

Your Committee in presenting their Report, rejoice in the increased prosperity which attends this important department of our work.

The returns for the past year show an increase of 87 Schools, 410 Officers and Teachers, 1395 Scholars, 350 Meeting in Class, and of volumes of Libraries 20,721. Among those who have been received into the church are a number of Indian children on one of the Missions in the Huron and Superior District. Your Committee would direct especial attention to the fact, that in one of our circuits 25 children were hopefully converted to God through the instrumentality of a Prayer-meeting established by a pious female teacher. This fact is sufficient to indicate the importance of regular Prayer-meetings for the benefit of our Sabbath School children, as well as the importance of endeavouring to secure as Teachers, those who are experimentally acquainted with the salvation they proclaim.

Your Committee have been pleased to observe an

increased interest in the introduction of the larger children into Bible and Catechumen classes, and would earnestly recommend continued effort in the same direction. We have been glad, also, to find a gradual decline of "Union Schools" so called, and a growing disposition on the part of our people to have all the Schools with which they are connected, established on a broad denominational basis.

It is much to be regretted that Superintendents of Circuits are so generally forgetful of the rule which requires them to present to the May District Meeting, a written report of the state of the Schools under their charge. We would respectfully urge the importance of increased attention to this matter, as the only means by which correct information can be obtained as to the state of our Schools.

Your Committee are of opinion, that for the more efficient working of our Sabbath School system a general effort should be made to carry out the provisions for a Sabbath School Union, as contained in the Discipline. They have been confirmed in this opinion by observing certain evils in connection with our Sabbath School operations, which demand a prompt and vigorous effort for their removal. Among these we may mention the difficulty experienced by most of our Ministers, owing to the pressure of other engagements, in giving that attention to the Sabbath Schools on their respective Circuits which is desirable; the efforts made in certain quarters to supplant our Sabbath School Literature by publications, the doctrinal tenets of which we cannot approve, and the existence in some of our own Libraries, of not a few volumes whose moral influence is very questionable, and many others whose Republican tendencies and teachings are opposed to the views and feelings of our people. With the view, therefore, of removing the evils complained of, and of giving increased efficiency to our Sabbath School enterprise, your

Committee respectfully submit for the adoption of the Conference, the following resolutions :—

Resolved 1st,—That the Chairman of Districts be requested to take immediate steps for carrying out the plan of a Connexional Sabbath School Union, as recommended in the Discipline.

Resolved 2nd,—That the Book Committee be recommended to take into its most serious consideration the propriety of appointing a suitable person as General Agent, who shall devote his time to the work of organizing Sabbath Schools, and collecting funds for the General Union, circulating our publications, and in every possible way promoting the interests of Sabbath Schools in connection with our Church, and report to the Conference of 1865.

Resolved 3rd,—That the Book Committee be recommended to take immediate steps for a careful revision of our Sabbath School Book List, and that they exclude from that list all publications of an objectionable or doubtful character.

The duties of the Wesleyan Female College have, during the year just closing, been prosecuted with earnestness by those who have been employed in advancing its interests.

The Principal, aided by a staff of excellent teachers, has maintained the efficiency of the Institution in its literary department.

The conduct of the students has been very satisfactory; their attention to study commendable.

The usual religious services have been characterized by Divine influence and have been blessed, in several instances, to those who have attended them. And a considerable number have begun to meet in class.

The number of boarders has not fluctuated much during the year, extending from 43 to 52, the average 45, a number not sufficient to sustain the Institution in efficiency. The day patronage averages is about 50 students.

The Institution is earnestly commended to the friends of Christian Education in this Conference.

 and Stanstead Districts, and the following laymen: Hon.
 James Ferrier, Thomas M. Bryson, R. Campbell, James

 special attention to our French Missions; that they may, in
 conjunction with the General Superintendent of Missions,

 the more vigorous prosecution of the work in this impor-
 tant field of evangelistic labour.

RELATING TO THE NUMBER OF MARRIED MEN ENTERING CONFERENCE.

Whereas the number of men yearly entering our Min-
 istry, made necessary by the great increase of the work

of God within the bounds of this Conference, tends greatly to embarrass the Stationing Committee; *Resolved*—That the subject of the work generally, as affected by the increase of labourers requiring Married Preacher's stations, be referred to the Conference Special Committee.

PRIZE ESSAYS ON ITINERANCY, &C.

THE COLORED POPULATION.

Resolved,—That the following brethren be a Committee to consider what can be done to promote the work of God amongst the colored population of this country, and report to the Missionary Committee:—General Superintendent of Missions, Dr. Jeffers, L. Warner, George H. Davis, E. B. Harper, M.A., I. B. Howard, and W. Pollard.

REGISTRATION LAWS OF CANADA EAST.

That the Co-Delegate, the Chairmen of Montreal, Quebec, and Stanstead Districts, the Revs. John Gemley, Dr. Selly, John S. Evans, and George Douglas, be a Committee to secure the passing of a bill in reference to the Registration Laws of Lower Canada, at the next session of the Provincial Legislature, a draft of which has been prepared by the Committee appointed by the last Conference for that purpose.

Resolved—That the thanks of this Conference be presented to our members and friends in this City, for the distinguished kindness so cordially shown the Ministers sojourning with them.

THANKS TO THE RESIDENT MINISTERS OF THE EAST AND WEST CIRCUITS.

Resolved—That the thanks of the Conference be presented to the resident Ministers, of both the Toronto Circuits, for the numerous acts of kindness shown to the members of this Body, during the sessions of this Conference.

FAST DAY.

That in view of the decrease in our membership this year, and of the need of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us, we recommend to all our Circuits and congregations, that Friday, the 5th day of August next, be observed as a day of fasting and prayer, that the work of God may be revived among us, and that many sinners may be converted to God.

Therefore,

Resolved—That the "CHURCH HARMONIST" be made a Text Book throughout this Connexion, in all our churches, choirs, and schools, and the members of this Body, are, earnestly and respectfully requested to promote the circulation of this publication on all our Circuits and Missions.

DUTY OF DISTRICT MEETINGS IN RELATION TO OUR PERIODICALS.

Resolved—That it be a regular question in all our District Meetings: Have proper exertions been made, on the several Circuits, to promote the circulation of our periodicals, and other publications?

VICTORIA COLLEGE SUSTENTATION FUND.

Resolved I.—That an assessment of $1\frac{1}{4}$ per cent. be laid upon the salary or annual income of every Minister and Preacher in the Connexion, except the Supernumerary Ministers; such income to include the following items, viz., salary, board, fuel, housekeeping and children's salaries, and that the sum of \$2,500, raised by this assessment, be applied to meet the annual deficit arising from the excess of the College expenditure over the income.

Resolved II.—That each married Minister be required to pay \$4.00, and each single Minister or Preacher, \$2.00, to the Financial Secretary, at the Financial District Meeting, in part payment of the above assessment, and the balance at the May District Meeting.

RESOLUTION OF 1859.

Resolved—That the Financial District Meeting shall examine into the circumstances and probable income of the Domestic Missions, in the same way as in respect to circuits, and suggest the amount that should be appropriated for the support or assistance of such Missions.

THE ANNUAL ADDRESS
OF THE
CONFERENCE

TO THE
MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH UNDER ITS CARE.

BELOVED BRETHREN,

We again take the opportunity of addressing you from the assembly of our Annual Conference as "brethren beloved of God." Met, as we now are, in the largest City of Western Canada, and where the Church, both of your choice and ours, has a strong hold on the affections of a large proportion of the inhabitants, it will not be a matter of surprise, when we tell you that our session has been one of more than ordinary interest, from the fact that a much larger number of the members of our Conference have been present than have ever met before, and also from the fraternal intercourse we have enjoyed in the hospitable homes, and public worship of God's sanctuary, with the zealous and loving people of this prosperous city. While here we have recounted the toils and difficulties of the past, and shall go forth to our several spheres of labour with renewed energy, thanking God and taking courage.

We have also been greatly cheered by the able and earnest ministrations and christian counsels of our respected and beloved President, the Rev. W. L. Thornton, M.A. We cannot but express our thankfulness for his appointment to the position

occupied among us, adorned by his graces and talents, and to Almighty God for permitting him to visit our country, and our regret that it must so soon come to a termination. We are further grateful, because we feel that by his visit, the bonds of union between ourselves and the parent connexion are thereby more firmly cemented; and we are confident that you will join with us in prayer, that the Providence that guided him here, will also watch over and direct him safely, amid the perils of the deep, again to his native land.

During our Session we have also been favoured with the presence of the Rev. Robinson Scott, of Dublin, the savour of whose fervent prayers and zealous ministry, will remain with us for many days to come.

We have been again reminded of our mortality, and, at the same time, of the necessity of unremitting labour for God and His church, by the death of one of our principal officers, the Rev. James Spencer, last year the Secretary of our Conference. We receive the admonition as from Him who doeth all things well, and trust that our profiting will be seen in our more earnest and zealous efforts for the good of our common humanity.

In reviewing our statistical returns, we have cause for deep humiliation before God. While from some of our Districts there is reported an encouraging increase of members, from others it is the reverse, so that the aggregate presents an actual loss. We may account for this loss, perhaps, chiefly from the fact, that many of the artisans and mechanics connected with our church, have been induced in common with others, to emigrate to the neighbouring States in hope of obtaining a larger remuneration for their labour. Nevertheless, we would urge upon you, beloved brethren, and take the counsel also to ourselves, the necessity of considering wherein and how we as a church have failed during the year past in bringing souls to

Christ, that thus the dimunition might be covered, and we should have been spared the painful duty of reporting a decrease in our numbers. Let this fact stimulate to increased effort for the future, to more earnest, persevering and faithful prayer, that God may send down to accompany His word the seven-fold energy of his blessed Spirit.

There are other considerations of a more cheering character. The institutions of the church are in active operation. Our Missionary Society is no less efficient than in former years. Our Sabbath Schools present encouraging signs of vitality and growth; and we trust, that in no instance will they be allowed to languish for lack of countenance on the part of parents, or effort, self-sacrificing if need be, on the part of teachers.

We would again commend to your liberality our various connexional funds. Our Church Relief Fund, while it is instrumental from year to year in affording assistance to many Trustees in remote parts of our work, requires a more generous support. Our Contingent Fund also demands at your hands more liberal contributions. Our Superannuated Ministers have always had a large share in your sympathies; and yet often have they of necessity been curtailed of a portion of their already too limited allowance. Our Educational Fund for the purpose of affording opportunities for additional training to the probationers for our ministry, has had, as it deserves, your liberal support.

We have been pleased to observe that in some of our larger places, plans are being devised and generous contributions offered, for the purpose of securing additional church accommodation, that thus the church may more effectively answer the end of its being, in "spreading Scriptural holiness in the land." We trust that others will emulate the example thus set before them.

The Educational Institutions of our church, we are thankful to know, fail not to commend themselves to your continued patronage. The attendance at the University of Victoria College presents an increase over the preceding year. The total number of graduates at the recent convocation, in the several departments of arts, law and medicine, was sixty. We rejoice also to believe from the interest manifested, that it is taking an increasingly strong hold of the minds and hearts of our people throughout the country. During the past year an effort has been made to secure subscriptions in order to free the College from debt; and while much has been already done, still there remains yet much to be accomplished. The Conférence has specially felt its indebtedness to the energy, activity and faithfulness of the Agent, the Rev. Dr. Aylesworth; and as he must still continue to prosecute his labours, we beg to commend him again, and his Co-Agent, the Rev. Charles Fish, to your kind attention, and trust that ere long by your liberality, the College will be placed in circumstances of ease, and thereby become more efficient than even heretofore, in affording a liberal education to the youth of our country.

The Female College in the City of Hamilton still maintains its exalted position in presenting opportunities to obtain for your daughters all the higher branches of education, ornamental as well as useful, not disassociated from that moral and religious culture which must ever be to the christian parent of primary importance.

As in contrast with other parts of the world, it is a matter of heartfelt gratitude to Him who holdeth the hearts of all men in His hands, that we still enjoy the blessings of peace. Our sympathies, with yours, have gone out on behalf of the neighbouring nation; and we trust that the time is not far distant when the unnatural conflict, of brother lifting his

hand against brother, will come to an end. Let your prayers be united with ours, that whatever in the order of a mysterious Providence may be permitted to occur, the present conflict may be made to subserve His own gracious purposes, and specially that the restoration of peace may be accompanied by the total abrogation of that great national evil, which our venerable founder designated "The sum of all villanies."

We would now refer directly to that for which we are first and chiefly concerned, viz: your advancement in personal piety. Many there are among you who are our children in the Gospel, and whose names are written upon our hearts. Not more earnestly do earthly parents desire the prosperity of their children, than we desire that you may "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." The church, consisting as it does of individual christians collected into one body, can only be powerful and maintain its aggressive spirit, as its members are personally devoted to Christ, and allow no compromise between themselves and the common enemy. The tendency of the age is to break down the barriers which distinguish the world and the church. On this subject the word of God is very explicit, "Be not conformed to this world." "Therefore come out from among them, and be ye separate." Various are the means resorted to in order to remove this Scriptural distinction. Let us remind you however, that it is not usually by any temptation to commit any flagrant crime, but rather by an undue attention to what may be regarded as the common and lawful occupations and enjoyments of life. Avoid yielding to the prevailing disposition of the world, which will dry up all your spiritual energies. Avoid all doubtful associations and transactions. Give no countenance to any *games of chance* in your social gatherings. Put away from you those *books*, and that class of *music*

which allure the heart away from Christ, and unfit you for the holy services of the sanctuary. We commend to you the publications of our own Book Room, and next to the Bible, we specially commend the original publications of Wesley, Fletcher, and the Biographies and Experience of the early Methodists. No human productions will be more effectual in strengthening the mind and establishing the heart in righteousness, than the sermons of John Wesley, diligently and prayerfully studied. In order to maintain this distinction between the church and the world, let us earnestly seek for "times of refreshing from the presence of the Lord." Seek always to be in a state prepared to engage in the work of revival. This is the legitimate and proper condition of every true follower of the Lord Jesus. To this end see that your own hearts are right. Are there any reigning idols there? Are unhallowed passions indulged? Do you love God with all your heart and each other with a pure heart fervently? If in the indulgence of unhallowed feeling you have injured a brother, have you made such an acknowledgement as our blessed Redeemer requires? Is not the real difficulty an *unwillingness* to humble ourselves before God and in the presence of each other? Be intreated; do not "regard iniquity in your heart." See to it that your heart is right. Look not at any lack of service, or inconsistency on the part of others, but at your own accountability. Cast out every idol. Remove every hindrance. Cultivate holy activity. Activity is an established law of God's universe, especially in relation to mind. The powers of the soul are designed for ceaseless activity. No spiritual health or mental vigour will be enjoyed without it. The duties of your christian life, the prosperity of the church, the extension of Christ's kingdom, and your advancement in personal piety, all demand your activity. Would you be holy, would you see sinners saved?

"Be instant in season and out of season," *be active*. Heaven itself is a place of holy activity. Hell is a place of malignant activity. You are now in a world of varied and incessant activity. Shall the church be apathetic? Shall christians be at ease in Zion? "Awake thou that sleepest." Souls are perishing around you. Snatch these as brands from the burning. Lead them to Jesus, and you "shall hide a multitude of sins." If the salvation of souls is desirable, if the commands of God are binding, then "work while it is called day."

We urge upon you also the cultivation of fervid zeal. If the concerns of personal religion are so great and lofty, then our most intense devotedness to God, and most fervid zeal are required. You are to be "*fervent* in spirit." Look at the interests of Christ's cause. Can they be effectually promoted without this zeal? Do you fear the cry of "fanatic," or "enthusiast?" Look at the history of nations. All that is great and glowing and good has been produced as the result of enthusiastic attachment to a cause espoused. Zeal has sustained in spheres of suffering and trial. Zeal has inspired the hearts of Martyrs, Confessors, Reformers, and Missionaries. Zeal inspired the Son of God in doing His Father's will. Beloved brethren! shrink not if need be from the accusation of enthusiasm; inasmuch as the Book of God tells you "it is good to be zealously effectuated *always* in a good thing."

And above all let this activity be on behalf of your own households. None of us are prepared to allow it to be said that our children and domestics are lost to God and to Methodism through our indifference or neglect. Let them all be collected at the family altar morning and evening. Never allow this to be demolished in your family circle. Teach your offspring there the value of God's Word, and the importance of praise and prayer. Incur not any liability to

suffer the penalty pronounced against the families who neglect to acknowledge God. Seek by diligent attention to all the means of grace to realize daily communion with your Maker. Neglect not the devotional reading of the Bible, and private prayer. Not only be found in your place on the Sabbath, but also at the week-evening prayer meeting, and the still more special and peculiar means, your weekly class. Neglect of these will indicate a low state of spiritual life. Let it never be your excuse that you are not there because you have nothing good to say of yourself. You are to seek there, in communion with others, as you can not do it elsewhere, a "renewal of your spiritual strength." Remember also our "Feasts of Love." Never turn your back upon the table of the Lord. The loving heart of the Christian always delights to commune these with the blessed Saviour.

To you *beloved friends, members of our congregations and pew-holders*, permit us to say, you need not perish. How glorious the truth, *you* may be saved. You, above every other, who are accustomed to meet with us every Sabbath, who believe (in theory) the Gospel as you hear it in the Methodist Churches, we anxiously desire to benefit. Shall our efforts be in vain? God forbid! "Come with us and we will do you good." "We beseech you in Christ's stead be ye reconciled to God." Again we say, you need not perish! We claim you for Christ! O! may you be willing and obedient in the day of his power.

To one and all we commend the institutions and agencies of the church. Methodism, itself the result of revival and Missionary effort, will become more and more alive as it extends its vitalizing influences to "the regions beyond." Seek these by earnest prayer more copious effusions of the Holy Ghost. Remember the invitations and promises of your covenant keeping God, "The same yesterday, to-day, and forever." Commit all your ways to Him. Seize by faith the blessings He is

waiting to bestow, and He who "is not slack concerning His promises," will not fail "to make Jerusalem a praise in the earth."

"Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen."

THE ANSWER
OF THE
BRITISH CONFERENCE
TO THE
ADDRESS OF THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CONFERENCE
IN CANADA.

VERY DEAR FRIENDS,

We have received your Annual Address with sincere affection and much thankfulness.

We trust that, in the benefits resulting from the first meeting of your Conference in the City of Quebec, your highest hopes will have been abundantly realized. The Methodism which we have received from our fathers is peculiarly fitted to meet the wants of such a population. Opposing as it does, to Romish and other superstitions the doctrine of justification by faith, to infidelity the Holy Spirit witness, and to all practical iniquity the doctrine of Christian holiness, it no less provides by its connexional organization for a world wide unity, of which others have often vainly boasted. Great is the responsibility laid upon us in that we have received this ministry.

We are again reminded how many have toiled and fallen in this glorious work. We have heard with deep sympathy the record of your losses, and cherish grateful memoirs of the grace bestowed upon your departed fellow-labourers. We doubt not that you will be encouraged by their example to persevere, patiently continuing in well doing.

Nor have you been left without successes. We rejoice with you in the addition to your Societies, and in the prosperity of your Educational Agencies. Amongst ourselves, notwithstanding much temporary discouragement, arising from changes in the educational policy of our Government, this subject is obtaining an increasing share of the interests and sympathy of our people. Our Sabbath and day schools are steadily advancing. How they may be brought under yet more efficient pastoral supervision is a subject which has engaged our serious attention. Our institutions at Kingswood and Woodhouse Grove are in a satisfactory state; and the pupils have successfully competed in important public examinations. Our Collegiate institutions at Sheffield and Taunton were never more prosperous. Instruction and religion must ever be united; for, though illiterate devotion may be Christianity in its weakness, undevout learning is irreligion in its might. By the earnest promotion of a truly religious education, you are effectually discharging responsibilities which are inseparable from Christian citizenship, and laying the one abiding foundation of national greatness.

Whilst thankful for any measure of success, we are more deeply conscious than ever how little has been accomplished in comparison with the agencies employed. We join with you in the devout recognition of our entire dependence upon the Holy Spirit. We are no less reminded that it hath pleased God "by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe." For this reason, we have an increasing desire to secure and to maintain an efficient ministry. Knowing that whilst we look to heaven for spiritual gifts we must use for ourselves all human appliances, we covet for all our candidates a thorough training, and, with a view to this, contemplate an enlargement of our Theological Institutions. Nor have we been forgetful, whilst assembled in Sheffield, how faithfully our fathers have guarded in the years past the purity, as well as the in-

tegrity, of the pastorate. We believe that you will agree with us in the opinion, that personal and entire consecration to God, on the part of both pastors and people, is the present and pressing need of the universal church. We turn to the future with prayerful expectation.

The coming year will be one of much interest. Fifty years have passed since the first Missionary meeting was held in Leeds. We have therefore resolved to celebrate the Society's Jubilee, and to hold a series of services, beginning with the Leeds Anniversary in October next. It is proposed to raise a special fund to be devoted to Missionary purposes. We are assured that such a proposal will secure the sympathy and efforts of all our brethren throughout the world.

Above all have we desired and asked of God that the year on which we are now entering may be one of remarkable and unequalled spiritual prosperity. Without Him we can do nothing. Our organizations may direct and husband effort; but however adapted and admirable they may be, they cannot create power. With this we must be endued from on high. We have been greatly encouraged to hope by the deep and hallowed feeling of unity and concord which has prevailed amongst us, and by the manifestations of the Divine presence and favour.

We have cordially recognised our beloved brother, the Rev. John H. James, as your chosen representative; and in compliance with your request that your next President might be sent from England, have appointed to that office our beloved brother, the Rev. William L. Thornton, M.A. He has long had our entire confidence, and will, we doubt not, prove a blessing to your Church. The Rev. Samuel D. Rice is appointed Co-Delegate.

And now, brethren, we commend you to God, and to the word of His grace. Be assured that, whatever

events may transpire in the political world, we shall not fail to remember you with true affection at the throne of grace. The Lord of Hosts is with you, the God of Jacob is your refuge. May His presence ever give you rest!

ADDRESS OF THE CONFERENCE
OF THE
WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA,
IN CONNEXION WITH THE BRITISH CONFERENCE,
TO THE
CONFERENCE IN ENGLAND.

REVEREND FATHERS AND BRETHREN:—

We gratefully acknowledge your parental and instructive address, and are reminded by it of the pleasure and benefits arising from the relations of co-operation and unity established between the British and Canadian connexions. When those relations were established in 1847, we had *six* Districts; we now have *twenty five*. Then we had *ninety-eight* Circuits and Missions; we now have *three hundred and thirty*. Then we had 21,749 Church Members; we now have 55,562. Then we numbered 180 Ministers and Preachers; we now number 550. The Missionary contributions of our congregations then amounted to \$10,700; they now amount to \$48,000. Our Sunday School and Educational Agencies have made corresponding progress.

In this success we recognize the Divine blessing upon the means employed in dependance on that blessing for the spread of truth and holiness. We trace and acknowledge the power of the Holy Ghost wherever revivals have taken place on the Circuits, or conversions, on the Missions to the New Settlements and Indian Tribes, or

a spirit of prayer and liberality has been manifested for the extension of the work at home and abroad. It is true, the field of Missionary labour has enlarged more rapidly than have the means increased to cultivate it. By the pious liberality of our people, we are enabled not only to maintain and extend the work on the regular Circuits, but also to support, and more than support, the missions to the poor and new settlements throughout united Canada; but the missions which, in connexion with you, and at your recommendation, we have undertaken to establish in Hudson's Bay Territory and British Columbia, can only be sustained by your continued co-operation.

The numerical increase in our Societies has been less the last year than during any previous year, though the various institutions and agencies of our Church have been supported with unabated liberality. Several reasons may be assigned for this absence of numerical increase, but we feel it to be the occasion of anxious heart-searchings, deep humiliation, and of renewed consecration of heart, strength, blood, soul, and life to the service of Him who gave himself for us, and who has commanded us to be instant in season and out of season in preaching His Gospel to every creature, and in feeding the Church which he has purchased with his own blood.

We have been the more deeply impressed with our obligations and responsibilities of entire devotion to the work committed to us, and of our need and privilege of a Pentecostal baptism of the Holy Ghost for its successful prosecution, by the successive discourses and addresses of your honoured Representative, the Reverend William L. Thornton, A.M., in whom we glorify the abounding grace and gifts of God our Saviour. We thank you with all our hearts for sending us, as your Representative, a man so pre-eminently qualified to conciliate, to edify, and impress; who has come among us in the fullness of the blessing of the Gospel of Christ; whose

ministrations in the pulpit, and addresses and intercourse in our religious and social meetings, have been characterized by a special unction from the Holy One, and by the rarest in intellectual powers and endowments; who has presided over our confederal deliberations with a courtesy and kindness, a wisdom and firmness, which claim our admiration and gratitude. We need not say how gladly we would be to receive him again as your Representative President over us, while we earnestly pray that he may be safely restored to you and to his family—carrying, as he does, the cordial esteem and affection of all who have listened to his counsels, or enjoyed the privilege of his society. We have requested Mr. Thornton to act as our Representative to you; and to him we refer you for the fullest information respecting our affairs.

We desire also to express the pleasure and profit we have derived from the presence of the President's companion, the Rev. Robinson Scott, of Dublin, by whose ministrations, counsels, and intercourse, we have been greatly edified and delighted.

Deeply impressed with the advantage arising from the presence and counsels of a Representative from the Parent Connexion, we desire that you will appoint a President from your Body the ensuing year; but in case of its not being convenient for you to appoint a President from among yourselves, we nominate for your favourable consideration the Rev. Richard Jones, as our President, and the Rev. Asahel Hurlburt, as Co-Delegate, the ensuing year.

Over the extensive and still extending Missionary Department of our work, our beloved and venerated brother, the Rev. Dr. Wood, presides with his wonted faithfulness and efficiency; and we earnestly hope for his continuance in the important office which he has so long filled with great acceptance and usefulness to the whole Church.

The last session of our Conference was held before you had matured or considered the arrangements for celebrating the Jubilee of the Parent Missionary Society. We unite with you in thanksgiving and praise to the God of all grace for the affecting expression of devotional feeling and princely liberality which has marked the Missionary Jubilee celebration throughout the Parent Connexion; and it will be our aim to imitate and emulate so noble an example in the same gospel work.

The present session of our Conference has been one of the most delightful in our ministerial experience. Our sittings have been means of grace, uninterrupted by a single painful discussion; and we go forth to our appointed fields of labour with one mind and one heart, seeking a double baptism of the Holy Ghost, purposing to commend ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God, and resolving not to count our ease, or even our lives dear unto us that we may labour as did our pioneer Fathers in the work, that may we possess the mind and imitate the example of our Divine Master, that we may spread Scriptural holiness throughout the land, and bring many sons to glory.

REPLY
OF THE
CANADIAN CONFERENCE
TO THE
ADDRESS FROM THE IRISH EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE.

The Committee to whom were referred the matters brought before the Conference in the Address of the Irish Wesleyan Education Committee, and that of their agent, the Reverend Robinson Scott, beg leave to report the following resolutions for its adoption:—

Resolved I. That this Conference has listened with profound attention and unfeigned pleasure to the statements contained in the address from the Irish Educational Committee, and to the exposition of their views and plans by their agent, the Rev. Robinson Scott, and that we deeply sympathize with the Irish Wesleyan Connexion in its peculiar circumstances, and greatly admire the strenuous efforts now being put forth by our brethren in that country to place their regular circuit work, their domestic missions, and their educational operations (the highest as well as the lowest) on a more efficient basis.

Resolved II. That we hold ourselves under obligations to the labours of our Irish brethren for many of the most valuable men in our church and ministry in this country, from its earliest history to the present time; and we desire, so soon as we dispose of the special pecuniary effort, made necessary by the present exigencies of Victoria College, to manifest our sympathy and sense of obligation in a material form.

Resolved III. In order that this object may be kept in view, and that the Canadian Connexion may be prepared to act with intelligence and vigor, when the proper time arrives, that therefore a committee of ten ministers

and as many laymen be now appointed, (with power to sub-divide themselves into minor committees for local purposes) whose duty it shall be to receive and reply to any communications which the Irish Educational Committee may make, and to co-operate with any deputation whom they may seem proper to send out to this country in furtherance of their objects; and that the following ministers and laymen do constitute the said committee:—The President and Secretary of Conference, and the Superintendent of Missions, for the time being; and the Reverends Messrs. Elliott, Harper, Creighton, Dewart, Sanderson, and Drs. Cooney and Jeffers, with Messrs. W. McBride, London; Hugh Moore, Dundas; W. D. Wilson, Toronto; John Might, Port Hope; James Brown, M.D., Peterboro'; John Shaw, Kingston; George Heck, Prescott; Thomas Smith, Edwardsburgh; James A. Mathewson, Montreal; and James Dinning, Quebec.

REPLY TO THE MEMORIAL FROM THE SABBATH REFORMATION SOCIETY.—That the Wesleyan Conference heartily sympathizes with the Sabbath Reformation Society in its very important objects, and earnestly recommends all our congregations to co-operate with the friends of Sabbath observance, in signing and circulating petitions to Parliament, for the suppression of labour and traffic on the Provincial canals during the Lord's Day.

CATECHUMEN CLASSES—The Conference earnestly recommends the Superintendents of Circuits to form Catechumen Classes in each Congregation, and to appoint Leaders who shall be members of the Church. The Conference also considers it highly desirable that the Catechumen Classes sustain as intimate relation as possible to the Sabbath School connected with such Congregations.

RELATING TO THE BOOK ROOM—Resolved—That the following brethren be a Committee to examine into the indebtedness of Ministers to the Book Room, and recommend some means by which those large debts can be made available, with as little delay as possible, viz.: Revs. S. Hurlburt, I. B. Howard, Dr. Aylesworth, S. Rose, W. Philp, W. Willoughby, and James Elliott.
