WHITE'S COVE, Queens Co., Aug. 30.—The grass on the highland and in the valleys is above an average this season. The potato crop will scarcely be an average yield owing to the continued drought which caused the grain to blight. Buckwheat promises a good crop. The potato crop in this section is a complete failure. Many farmers who planted a large quantity will have to buy for their own use. The apple crop is also a failure. Bears have of late been causing farmers a great deal of trouble. Nearly every day some one mourns the loss of a flock of sheep or some young cattle. BOAT RACE. The boat race on the harbor between the Bays and the McLeod Sullivan race which took place at Westfield upon the occasion of the Orange picnic held there a short time ago. After going less than two hundred yards the whites had secured a lead of about a length, which they gradually increased until when rounding the turning point they had put a good three lengths between their own boat and that of the black sweaters. Very soon after they start the strokes slowed down from 44 and 48 to 38 and 40 and on the home stretch both boats were pulling an almost even 22. The boys were turned by Belyea in 11:30, and from there they continued to increase the lead, finishing easily in 23:30, with at least ten lengths.

WESTBROOK, Me., Sept. 2.—Joseph Champagne will appear in court tomorrow morning in answer to the charge of assault with intent to kill upon Archie Archambeau. The alleged assault occurred late Sunday evening on a Main street through the French settlement when Champagne approached Archambeau, saying, "I'll teach you to say that I have five wives" and discharging his revolver full in the face of the other man. Archambeau dodged when he saw the gleam of the revolver, and escaped with a flesh wound on the cheek. Then he ran, followed by Joseph, who is said to have fired four shots at him. One shot passed through Archambeau's trousers, just at that point Officer Dresser overpowered Champagne and placed him under arrest. Champagne is about 45 years of age, while Archambeau is somewhat younger. Both are French Canadians employed in the mills here.

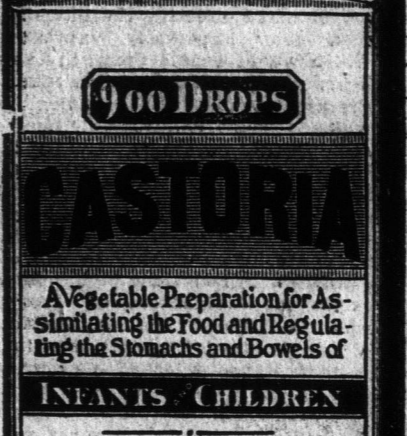
