Now Venus, when she makes her transit, is only about one quarter of the distance to the sun, so that her distance can be easily determin-

sile makes her transit, is only about one quarter of the distance to the sun, so that her distance can be easily determined in miles by our astronomical observers, situated say 4000 miles apart, and who know just how far, thus, securing their base line, and ascertaining their angles by careful observation. The relative distance of Venus both from the earth and the sun being known, as it is, the absolute distance in miles is only an arithmetical calculation. The elements also of a second triangle whose apex is on the other side of Venus, with the diameter of the sun for its base, will be used to verify the exact position of Venus and the entire distance required. These opposite angles, of course, are made, or are supposed to be made, by the lines of vision of distantly separated observers crossing each other at the intervening planet. The whole difficulty of the problem is in securing the greatest possible degree of accuracy in the observations. If it is in human power to succeed in that, there ought to be no failure next Tuesday.


