



FISH AND GAME.

The Province is indeed justly termed *The Sportsman's Paradise* for the excellent reason that within its limits are found in abundance, the most desirable species of Fur, Fin and Feather, and large game as well.

The king of game fish, viz.: the Atlantic selmon is found in a majority of the rivers in Gaspé, Bonaventure, and on the North Shore, there are a number of these which can be acquired on lease from the Department; the wary Brook-Trout exists in profusion throughout the Province, in some localities attaining great size and weight, inland waters, (lakes and rivers) are obtainable yet at reasona' le figures which abound with this magnificent fish, and in many of these lakes excellent fishing in the way of the great lake trout (touladi) is to be had. Towards the west in the Ottawa valley we find that fierce fighter, the black bass in large numbers, some very choice lakes in this section are still disposable. Feathered games such as ruffed grouse (partridge) ducks, geese, shore birds, the snipes, plover, &c., are scattered all over; in some localities being exceedingly plentiful

Hunting territories, may now be acquired under the new Law, and no doubt many applications will be received for blocks of land in the Gaspé, Bonaventure and Ottawa, Labrador and Temiscouata region, where the Moose, Caribou and Red Deer abound, but Caribou are to be found all through the Province as well, notably in the Laurentides National Park. As regards Fur, the Northern Canadian skins have always held first place in the markets of the World and Quebec Plovince supplies a large percentage of the amount of production. EXEMPTIONS FROM SEIZURE.

The following is a list of household effects, etc., a tenant can legally hold as being exempt from seizure:

- 1. The bed, bedding and bedsteads in use by debtor and his family.
- 2. The ordinary and necessary wearing apparel of himself and his family.
- 3. The stoves and their pipes, one pothook and its accessories, one pair tongs and one fire shovel.
- 4 All the cooking utensils, knives, forks and spoons and crockery in use by the family, two tables, two cupboards or dressers, one lamp, one mirror, one washing stand with its toilet accessories, two trunks or valises, the carpets or mattings covering the floors, one clock, one sofa, twelve chairs provided that the total value of such effects does not exceed the sum of fifty dollars; the debtor having in case of seizure the right to choose the things that he retains to the amount of the said sum.
- 5. All spinning wheels and weaving looms in domestic use, one axe, one saw, one gun, six traps, such fishing nets, lines and sell es as are in common use, one tub, one washing machine, one wringer, two rails, three flat irens, one blacking brush, one scrubbing brush, one broom and fifty volumes of books, all the family portraits and all drawings

One span of plough horses, or a yoke of oxen, one horse, one summer vehicle, and one winter vehicle, and the harness used by a carter or driver for earning his livelihood, one cow, two pics, four sheep, and wool from such sheep, the cloth manufactured from such wool, and the hay and other fodder intended for feeding the same animals; further, the following agricultural tools and implements; one plough, one harrow, one working sleigh, one tumbril, one hay cart with its wheels and all harness necessary, and intended for farming purposes.
- 9. Tools and implements or other chattels ordinarily used in his trade to the value of thirty dollars.

Nevertheless, the things and effects mentioned in paragraphs four, five, six, are not exempt from seizure and safe when the suit is to recover the price of their purchase or they have been given in pawn. Books of account, titles of debt, or other papers in the possession of the debtor consecrated vessels and things used for religious worship; Elimentary allowance granted by a court:—Sums of money or objects given or bequeathed upon the condition of their being exempt from seizure.

Wages and salaries, not yet due, except the salaries of public officers or employees of this Province, whether permanent or not, and those of city or town clerks in incorporated cities or towns, which are liable to seizure in the propositions mentioned in article 628 of the code of procedure.

We have given above the full list of exemptions, as the question is frequently asked. There are other and larger exemptions applicable to settlers in the country.

All vessels, boats and other fishing craft, tackle, nets, seines, lines, and other fishing apparatus and provisions belonginging to any fisherman, and necessary for his subsistence and that of his family, or for his fishing operations. Such effects, may, however, be seized and sold for their purchase price, but not between the first day of May and the first day of November. Alimentary allowances and things given as aliment may, however, be seized and sold for alimentary debts.




