AN ADVENTURER'S DEATH.

DEATH OF A MAN WHO SUICIDED. AT AN OBSCURE AGE.

New York, Dec. 27.—The World gazette under the false name of "A. Allen," there died at a hotel in South Norwalk, Conn., last November a man who had taken out insurance policies to the amount of \$231,000. He died from an overdose of morphine. The policies had all been written within fourteen months of the man's death, most of them within the eight months immediately preceding it. They were divided between forty-two companies, as far as known, but further investigation may show that the amount of insurance and the number of companies is to be largely increased. Of the \$231,000 insurance on his life, only \$71,000 was for the benefit of his relatives. The remainder is in the names of apparently only casual friends and business acquaintances. The story of the man's later life is dramatized to a degree seldom found in fiction. To one, at least, of the beneficiaries of his insurance policies, his intention to commit suicide was known several months prior to his death. He was an excellent and wealthy Bostonian, and apparently the favorite, though disapproved, son of an industrialist. He had lived a life of adventure in many countries, and had spent a fortune in riotous living in reckless speculation. When found dead in the little hotel room he had left a few dollars in his pocket, with five hundred dollars dependent upon his death. The man's true name was John Tyler. He has a young and pretty wife and a younger sister living in this city, and a mother and three brothers in Boston. They profess to know little or nothing of the man's adventures. One of the beneficiaries of his insurance is a young girl of Montreal. A man who helped her, the Lord helps every man who helps himself, but the Lord helps the man caught helping himself here. His one money back until he could pay what he owed to the Petroleum Exchange, the wife of a business acquaintance, a young girl of Montreal, a lawyer in Liberty-street, a hotel-keeper in Boston and a young man in New Rochelle. Of the insurance companies involved there are but comparatively few of the old-line stock companies. The larger amount of the insurance was in co-operative associations. The question of the payment of the policies, therefore, interests directly a very great number of persons. It is, as seems certain, the payment of the policies is contested in the courts. The ground of conspiracy and fraud, the litigation will, from the dramatic features of the man's life and death, be one of the most interesting ever brought before the courts of this country.

DISAFFECTION IN THE KNIGHTS.

The Mechanist Assembles Threatened to Withdraw From the Order.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 27.—Unless word is received from the General Executive Board of the Knights of Labor to-day, granting the demands of the assembly of machine constructors for a local trades' charter, nearly 4000 Knights in this city, and thousands in other parts of the country, will withdraw from the order. Twenty-one assemblies throughout the country have notified the General Executive Board that unless the trades' charter is granted they will leave the order, and most of those in this city have given notice that unless the demand is acceded to to-day they will withdraw. The machineists claim as a right under the constitution of the order that they will be allowed to direct the business pertaining to their own interests. Three members of the General Executive Board are in favor of granting these demands, but Mr. C. B. Bly, a majority of the Board is opposed to the scheme, and it is very likely that any word will be received by the dissatisfied assemblies that they will withdraw.

Some of the machineists' assemblies have decided to wait until the first of the New Year, and then withdraw, but a large number of them will follow the lead of the Philadelphia assembly, and withdraw this morning. They will sever their relations with the order.

An Interview with Barry.

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., Dec. 27.—Thomas E. Barry, member of the Executive Board of the Knights of Labor, was interviewed yesterday regarding the report that charges have been preferred against Powderly and the movement to depose him. Barry said the press of this country has been endeavoring for some time to make it appear that there is dissension in the ranks of the order, and that the knights are seeking to make it appear that a collision exists between the general officers of the Knights of Labor, and have the public believe there is likely to be an open rupture. While we may differ in regard to the methods of the Knights of Labor, and the necessity of their organization, we progress to divide us. Between Powderly and myself there has always been the kindest feeling.

In reference to the statement published that Barry was agent for Powderly's position, and that he was speaking to depose the Master Workman, he said there was no foundation for it.
