For the information of Travellers between Windsor and Parrsborough, &c.

THE Parrsborough packet sails regularly between Windsor and Parrsborough twice in every week, and occasionally three times; but always from Parrsborough every Monday in the Summer season, wind and weather permitting, so as to be at Windsor on Tuesday, and will sail from thence the first high water that happens, at or after 8 o'clock in the forenoon of that day.—The passage money for each person is five shillings, and the freight for hories and neat cattle, is seven shilling and six pence per head. The vessel is 42 tons burthen, and has good accommodations for passengers; and likewise for taking over horses, neat cattle, sheep, &c.

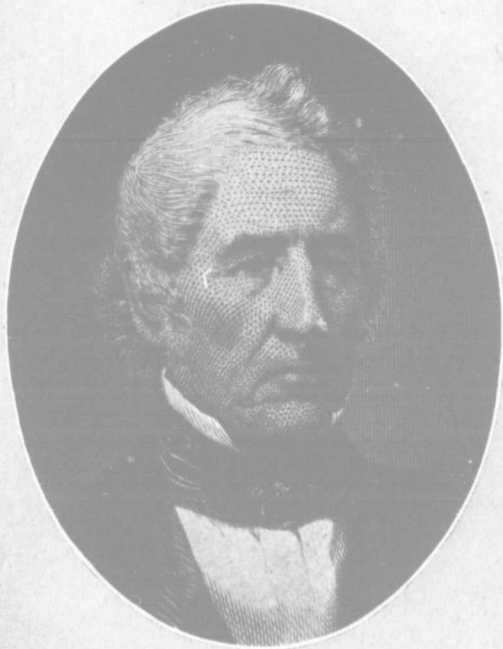
