CANONIZATION.

THE PROCESS BY WHICH SAINTS ARE DESIGNATED.—THE CRITICISM WHICH THEIR LIVES MUST SURMOUNT.

The methods which are pursued by the Church in investigating the claims of a candidate who is to be numbered among the saints are long, rigorous and expensive. Frequently the efforts end in failure after the person whose canonization is desired has been dead a hundred years or more.

The claim of a person for canonization can never be advanced during his life. After death, if it be shown that he had led a remarkably religious life and that anything miraculous was connected with it, the bishop or archbishop of the diocese in which he died appoints a committee to collect evidence.
