NEWS OF THE WEEK. Three immigration officials at Winnipeg have been decapitated by order from Ottawa. They are Hugh Carstairs, interpreter, G. A. Cloutier, brother of Rev. Father Cloutier, and James Reid.

Ten thousand bushels of wheat stored in the farmers' elevator at Killarney, Manitoba, has disappeared and cannot be accounted for. N. J. Ryan, who was connected with the management of the elevator, has been arrested for the theft.

H. M. S. Canada has passed into the list of non-effective vessels. She is one of the most graceful of the ships, being a steam square-rigged corvette. The Canada has visited this port several times. The Toronto World, referring to this ship, says: Her name suggests what her destination ought to be. We want a training ship at Halifax and a recruiting station there for boys. The Canada could now be acquired, probably for nothing, and would form a most popular and useful institution if used for this purpose.

Chief Justice Tuck, of N. B., sat on Friday last to hear the application of Wm. Pugsley, counsel for Hon. A. G. Blair, who asked that the Queen and Sanbury election petition stand over for hearing till after the session. Mr. Pugsley presented affidavits from Blair and Laurier showing that the pressure of public business made it extremely inconvenient for the minister to leave Ottawa to defend his seat at this time.

LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS.

The court declined at present to make so great a delay and set down the case for hearing at Oromocto on March 15th, but the judge intimated that after the case was opened it might be adjourned if counsel on both sides agreed, to July.

R. G. Dun & Co's N. Y. weekly report of trade said on Friday last: The failures were 61 in Canada against 67 last year. No considerable change appears in Canadian trade. Orders for spring delivery in dry goods and hardware are fairly numerous in Toronto, and the outlook is considered better. At Winnipeg trade is quiet, collections only fair. Montreal quotes no important increase, and business is but moderate with collections slow.
