Another Steamship Wrecked.

LOSS OF THE CITY OF WASHINGTON. ALL THE PASSENGERS SAVED.

New York, July 7—The steamship City of Washington, of the Inman line, went ashore in a dense fog, at 2 o'clock on Saturday afternoon, on Gull Rock bar, seventy miles east of Sambro. All the passengers, crew, baggage and spare stores were safely landed. The ves-sel is tight avent in the engine room. sel is tight, except in the engine room where water runs in and out at high tide.

water in her hold, and is likely to become a total wreck. Her purser was expected here to-night but has not yet arrived, and it is impossible to get further intelligence from the wreck to-night, as she lies 20 miles from any telegraph office.
