

A Good Case for Charity.

Editor World: On Nov. 27 last Tobias Levy, aged 14, was riding on the front of a Spadina and Bloor-street ear, and in getting off near Wilcox street jumped the wrong way and was thrown under the ear, the hind wheel of which passed over his right leg, crushing it terribly. He was taken to the Hospital and the leg was amputated at the knee. There is no doubt it was the boy's own fault. He has borne his sufferings bravely and has the courage to say it was his own fault and to exonerste the driver. The parents of the boy are poor hut respectable people, living at 55 Peter-street, and there is a family of six or seven rehildren, of whom this boy is the eldest. The father is a working tailor with large claims on him, and the boy, who is still in the Hospital, is needing good support.

The boy feels keenly the loss of his leg and is anxious to secure an artificial leg and foot. This will cost \$100 at least. This sum is quite beyond the father's means, and I have interested one or two gentlemen in the case, and it was thought that if the facts were known that some kind friends might feel disposed to assist in procuring the funds required to purchase the limb and to provide the necessary support during his recovery. I have investigated the circumstances and can assure the public that anything done in this direction will be most wortilly bestowed. I witnessed the accident and have seen the boy in the hospital since, and his courage under his extreme sufferings is wonderful. I shall be pleased to receive any contributions that may be sent me and will apply them in the purchase of the artificial limb and in providing him with nourishing support.
