





THEY WANT TRUANT SCHOOLS

PEITION FROM THE BRANTFORD SCHOOL BOARD. On somewhat similar lines to a Resolution—And of Cost—The Insurance Bill—At Last a New Fence for the Normal School.

When the House opened yesterday afternoon Mr. Hardy presented a petition from the Brantford Public School Board, which was signed by E. Sweet, chairman, and E. D. Passmore, secretary. The petitioners complained by recording their appreciation of the legislation recently passed by the Legislative Assembly in regard to compulsory school attendance and the punishment of truancy. There were, however, they contended, serious difficulties in the way of enforcing the legislation referred to. It was almost impossible under existing circumstances to realize the full benefit which would naturally accrue from the law, inasmuch as in a large number of instances where children were charged with truancy the parents were unable through poverty to comply with the law and on the other hand, truant boys were of a general character should not be admitted to the public schools.

The difficulties referred to, so the petitioners averred, would be readily obviated by the establishment of a separate class of sufficient industrial schools—similar in character to the Victoria at Montreal, which, in the opinion, was an excellent institution—to meet the requirements of the provision. The basis upon which these schools might be established was indicated briefly and succinctly by the petitioners. They were desirous of the provisions of the Act respecting industrial schools, and maintained that owing to the large expense entailed in inaugurating and maintaining such institutions these schools could not be made available in towns and cities similar to Brantford. In view of the fact that such schools were semi-penal in their nature, as well as largely expensive, the petitioners desired to submit that they should be suitably supported by the province. It, however, respecting industrial schools, and upon municipalities it should only be borne by these corporations in proportion to the number of pupils in attendance. In the event of its being deemed inadvisable to insure such schools, the petitioners desired that the expense of the proposed industrial schools should be borne by the province. They suggested that districts should be formed composed of a sufficient number of municipalities to each other and a school established in each. The expense ensuing could be met by levying equitable proportions on the municipalities composing such districts.
