

UNDER A SERIOUS CHARGE

Prominent Sporting Man Arrested in Windsor, for Theft, Early Sunday Morning.

POLICE TELL A STRANGE STORY

Claim That He Has Two Wives, One in England and Another in Hamilton.

Windsor, Oct. 27.—Thomas Clement, a well-known man about town, prominent in the ranks of Windsor society, and a certain acquaintance among cricketers and sporting men generally, was arrested at 1 o'clock this morning and locked up nominally on a charge of theft. Clement was caught just as he was about to enter a hardware store on Sandwich street. To the clever detective work of Officer Reid, who has been watching the man for months, is due the credit of the capture.

Under a serious charge, the police promise, will confront Clement when the theft case has been settled. Although maintaining as an unmarried man, the police say to have at least two wives living. One resides at No. 9 Alworth-road, W. Crofton, England, while the other is a Hamilton woman whose name is Miss Jeanie Trout. The Englishman is married some 15 years ago. He has two daughters by this marriage, both of whom will live with their mother and are 15 and 16 years old respectively. By his Hamilton wife he had a son, now nearly 11 years of age. This is the story told by the police.

Letters found on him show that he also enjoyed a close friendship with a Toronto woman, who resides on Parliament street. These letters are all couched in terms of endearment and are addressed simply "Mac" and are full of affectionate expressions towards Clement. One letter from "Mac" asks for money to buy clothes and another a few days later shows that Clement sent her \$25.

The Hamilton woman's letter are addressed to Clement in Detroit, Michigan, showing that he was keeping her in ignorance of his address, and that he was being closely watched. The affair has created a sensation here.

NO HOPE FOR HIS RECOVERY

AD. WHITNEY AND HAVELOCK

Addressed a Large Gathering in the Town Hall in the Interests of Dr. Ford.

Speeches by J. W. St. John, Dr. Ford, Mr. Birdsell and Mr. Sexsmith.

Havelock, Oct. 27.—A political meeting, in the interest of Dr. Ford, Conservative candidate in the East Riding of Peterborough for the Legislature, was held on Saturday night, in the Town Hall. The hall, which was profusely decorated with flags, and the most brilliant of lanterns, was the greatest enthusiasm prevailed. Mr. Birdsell, president of the riding Conservative Association, occupied the chair, and on the platform with him were a number of prominent Conservatives of the district.

Short addresses were given by the chairman, Mr. Sexsmith, who was the candidate for the House of Commons in 1900; Dr. Ford and J. W. St. John of Toronto. Mr. St. John vigorously denounced the acts of the present administration, and showed the impropriety of the government's parading, hand-in-glove, with the government at Ottawa, in view of the doctrine laid down by Sir Oliver Mowat, and discussed the necessity of some improvement in the mining laws of the province.
