

They have to return sincere thanks to the friends who have kindly assisted them during the same period. One of those friends, the late Mr. James Michie showed his appreciation of their work by leaving them a very liberal bequest, \$4000.

The Consumers' Gas Company merit especial notice for their annual gift of 1000 bushels of coke.

With a view to avert or diminish the risk of loss of life by fire, many lamentable warnings having been given in other cities, the Managers have placed at each end of the main building, fire escapes, easy of access; and have taken such other precautions as were within their power, and conducive to the same end.

The ruinous and unsanitary condition of the out-buildings has caused the expenditure of a large sum of money in rebuilding and repairing them; the increased accommodation thus secured, may ultimately be made available as working rooms for the inmates. Details of the work done will be found in the Report of the Building Committee.

Two vacancies have occurred in the Board of Management. Mr. S. Rogers, who became a member in 1866, and who was an active and efficient visitor, has passed to his rest. The Rev. J. C. Antliff, elected in 1882, has been called to labour in another city.

Mr. and Mrs. North, Superintendent and Matron, have discharged their duties satisfactorily; as a mark of approval, the Managers have added \$100 to Mr. North's salary.

The Reports of the Treasurer, Solicitor, Building Committee, and Superintendent, will be found to contain whatever further information may be required.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT.

In view of the fact that the House of Industry has obtained possession of certain property on the north-west corner of Edward and Elizabeth streets, under lease since 1870, it has been deemed advisable to report on this and on the real estate of this Institution generally.

The four houses adjoining the corner shop or store and the store itself on the south-east angle of this block were held by one James Joliffe as lessee, at a yearly rental of \$87.50. The lease expired in January last; and some months thereafter Mr. Joliffe offered to give up the premises on the terms of the lease. Joliffe was entitled to a renewal of the lease for twenty-one years. It was decided to accept his offer of giving up possession; and an arbitration was had as provided for in the lease, and the value of the building and improvements determined in a regular way. After all proper deductions were made from the amount, possession of the premises was given up, and Mr. Joliffe paid off. Only one tenant was accepted by this House, and this one is in under a monthly holding on the same terms as heretofore.

The other houses referred to in this lease are unoccupied at present, and await the action of the Building Committee or of this Board.

The remaining houses on this block let to tenants are, I understand, on the terms of a monthly holding, so that all the property belonging to the Board can be taken into its possession by a proper month's notice to that effect.

Subject to these leases the House of Industry is the absolute owner of the block between Elm and Edward streets, and Elizabeth and Chestnut streets, and it is the only real estate now owned by this House.
