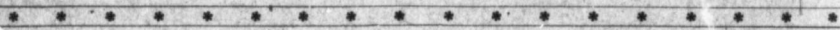

MINUTES OF THE ELEVENTH SESSION OF THE MONTREAL ANNUAL CONFERENCE.

HELD IN THE SYDENHAM STREET METHODIST CHURCH, KINGSTON,
ONTARIO, COMMENCING MAY 31ST, 1894.

The ELEVENTH SESSION of the MONTREAL ANNUAL CONFERENCE of the Methodist Church assembled, according to appointment, in the Sydenham Street Methodist Church, Kingston, Ont., Thursday, May 31st, 1894, at 9 o'clock a.m.

Rev. W. JACKSON, D.D., President of the Conference, occupied the chair.

After singing Hymn 531, the Secretary of Conference, Rev. S. D. CHOWN, read the 12th chapter of Romans, and Revs. J. T. PITCHER and DAVID WINTER offered prayer. The Conference prayer-meeting continued with great power from on high until 10 o'clock.

The President called for the names of the laymen elected as members of the Conference by the district meetings. (See page 110.)

The roll of ministerial and lay members was then called, and 134 ministers and 47 lay members responded to their names.

The Conference was then called upon to elect a President, when Rev. E. BRADSHAW RYCKMAN, D.D., was elected on the first ballot.

After the newly elected President had addressed the Conference in felicitous terms, he called upon the Conference to elect a Secretary.

Upon the third ballot, Rev. A. LEE HOLMES, M.A., was elected.

The Rev. A. LEE HOLMES, M.A., asked the Conference to relieve him from the responsibilities of Secretary in view of the fact of his being engaged in the financial interests of Stanstead College. The Conference, on motion, accepted his resignation.

The Conference was again asked to elect a Secretary, and upon the first ballot the Rev. WM. PHILP, B.A., B.D., was elected to that office.

On nomination by the Secretary, the following were appointed assistant secretaries: Rev. D. C. SANDERSON, Rev. F. G. LETT, and Mr. J. R. LAVELL, B.A.; and Rev. C. D. BALDWIN, Journal Secretary.

Rev. JAMES LAWSON was re-appointed reporter to *Christian Guardian*, and Rev. E. RICHARDSON KELLY was appointed to sign railway certificates.

QUESTION—What is the report of the Special Session of the Conference?

ANSWER.

The Special Session of the Conference was opened in the Sydenham Street Church, Kingston, Ont., May 29, 1894, at 9 a.m.

Rev. Dr. JACKSON announced Hymn 753. After singing, the Secretary read Isaiah lxiii., and the Revs. RICHARD WHITING and JOHN ARMSTRONG

led in prayer. The Conference spent a further season in prayer, when the General Superintendent, the Rev. ALBERT CARMAN, D.D., took the chair, and delivered an address abounding with inspiration to ministerial toil and gratitude to God for the marked success, past and present, of the Methodist Church in Canada, outlining also some of the demands of the future.

The roll being called, 108 ministers answered to their names.

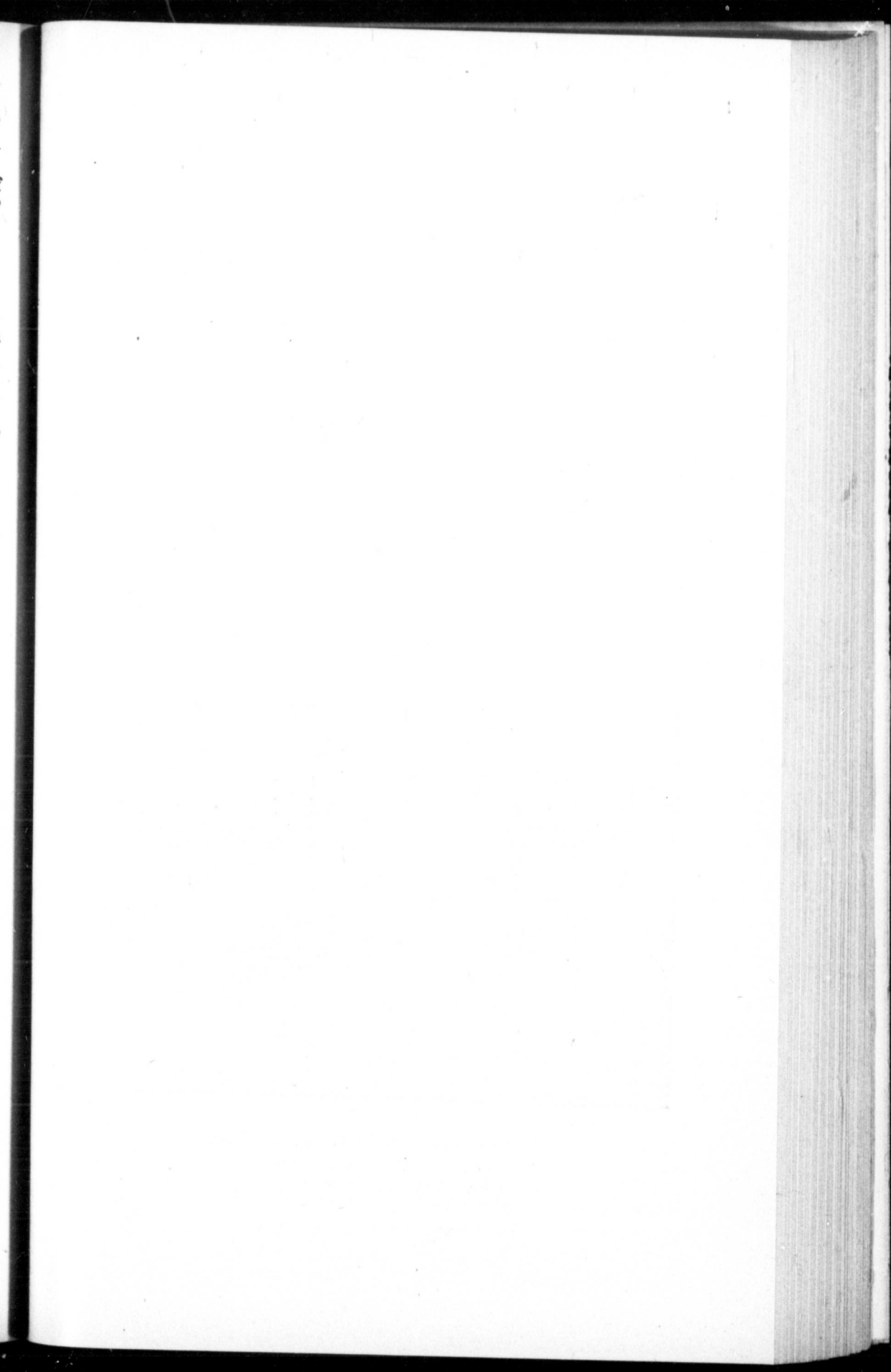

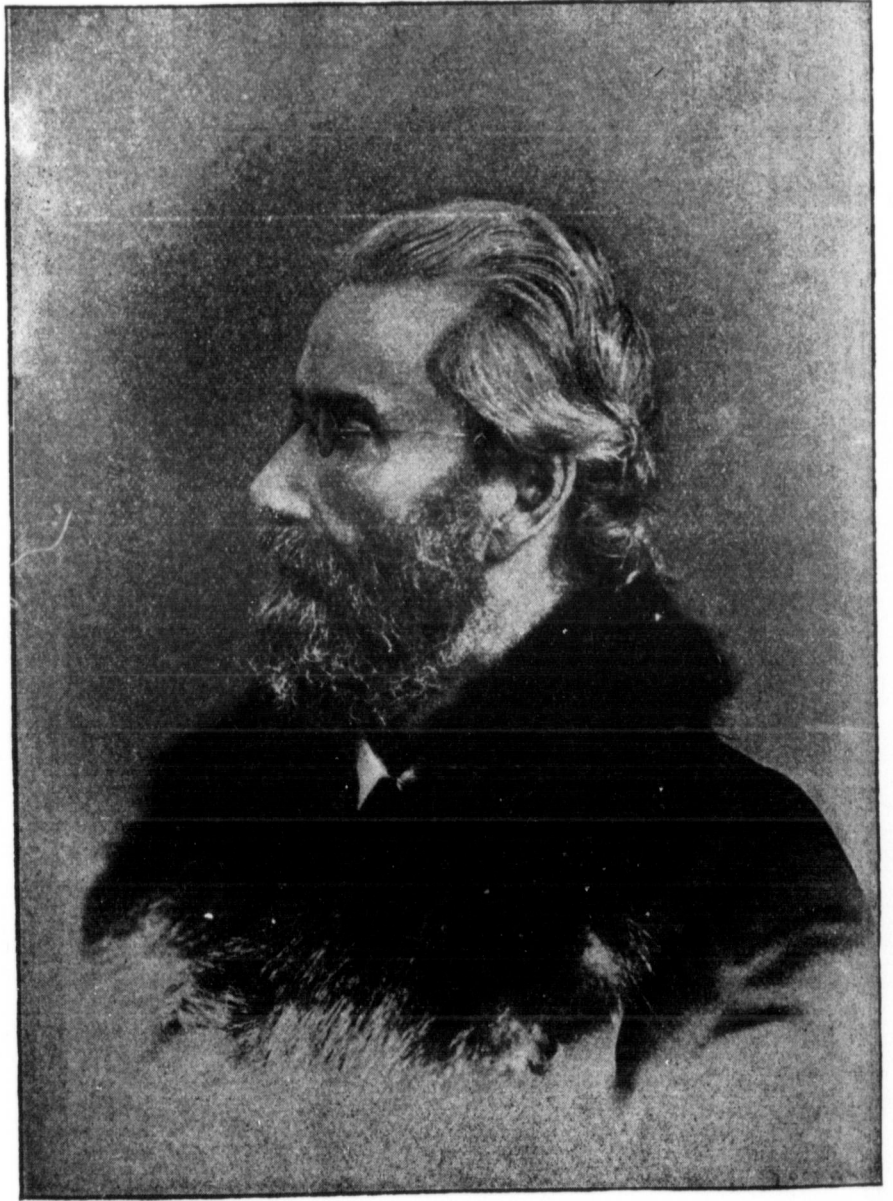

OBITUARIES.

GEORGE DOUGLAS, D.D., LL.D.,

Was born in Ashkirk, Roxboroughshire, Scotland, on the 14th of October, 1825. His father was descended from the old Douglas Clan of the Borders, and married Miss Mary Hood, of Hazeldean. He was engaged in the grain and milling business, but owing to various disasters concluded to seek his fortune in the new world, and came to Canada in 1831. In the following year he was rejoined by his family and settled in Montreal, where for some time he performed clerical work in the corporation, when he received an appointment in the Customs Department, which he retained till the date of his death in 1860. Soon after coming to Montreal, George, with his brothers, James and John, became members of the Methodist Sunday School, and subsequently the whole family, who up to this period had been consistent and devout Presbyterians, connected themselves, as adherents, with the St. James Street Methodist Church. George received his early education at the British and Canadian School, which he attended for several years, receiving at the same time private lessons from the head master in certain studies not embraced in the regular school course. On leaving this school he became a pupil of the Rev. Mr. Black, a Presbyterian minister at Laprairie, and acquired considerable proficiency in an extended range of studies. At this time his ambition was to become a marine engineer, and for this purpose, while attending evening classes in drawing and designing, he entered an iron-worker's establishment that he might become familiar with the practical and fundamental principles of engine building. It is doubtless this incident in his early life out of which has grown the widespread but entirely erroneous statement that he was apprenticed as a blacksmith. It soon became apparent that the profession chosen as his life-work was all too severe for his delicate physical organization, and a severe illness compelled him to desist from this laborious pursuit. The fact is, God had other work for him to do, and was about to prepare him for that work. In the early months of 1843, a gracious revival of religion took place in the old St. James Street Church under the superintendency of the late Rev. William Squire, and amongst the many who were born of God in that revival—some of whom remain unto this day—the retiring and diffident lad, George Douglas, was one. The facts connected with his conversion to God and the thorough and radical character of the work wrought in his soul, are given by his brother John in these words: "For a number of weeks after the opening of these services, except on Sunday, George could not be induced to attend the meetings, excusing himself by pleading the claims of an evening class in mechanical drawing, of which he was a member. At last, on one memor-

able night, after a sermon of great power and exhortation of surpassing earnestness and tenderness by Mr. Squire, to the glad amazement of all present who knew him, George Douglas staggered to the place for seekers, and threw himself on his knees in great mental agony. For weeks he continued in great distress, the subject of a fearful struggle with unbelief and the devil. For weeks he was almost unfitted for work, eating and sleeping little, unwilling to converse with anyone, yet driven, as it were, by the Spirit of God to the meetings. Finally, on one never-to-be-forgotten night, after weeks of agonized seeking, while a handful of brethren remaining after the public meeting were praying with him and for him, he yielded in the awful struggle, Christ conquered, and blessed peace and rest came to his spirit—a holy calm after a fierce and hellish storm."

From this point the current of his life was turned into a new channel. His marvellous gift of language, his wonderful power in prayer, and his unique and phenomenal voice, attracted the attention of the Church, and he was appointed a class leader when but eighteen years of age, and shortly afterwards was licensed as a local preacher. The conviction now came to his own mind, as to that of the officary of the Church, that the ministry was the sphere in which God would have him labor, and he entered upon a course of reading—especially the Holy Scriptures—calculated to fit him for his high calling. In 1848, he served as junior preacher on the Melbourne Circuit, under the direction of the Chairman of the District, but anxious to secure further educational advantages, he left Canada in December, 1849, with a view to prosecute his studies at Richmond Theological College, England, entirely at his own expense. Arrived in England, he was received into the home of Dr. Alder, and having presented himself at the Mission Rooms and passed the necessary examinations, was about to enter college when a call came from Bermuda for an additional missionary, and the missionary secretaries recommended his appointment to the field, believing him to be already qualified for the work. On the 1st of March, 1850, he was ordained in St. John's Square Chapel by the Rev. Thomas Jackson, assisted by Dr. Alder and Mr. Beecham, and on the following day, in company with Rev. John Wood, he sailed from Southampton to his appointed station in Bermuda, where, with all the zeal of his first love and all the energy of his young manhood, he threw himself into the work for God and souls. But within two years, tropical fever attacked him; hemorrhage from the lungs supervened, and he was carried to a steamer, and in the good providence of God reached his home in Montreal, although in a state of great weakness and debility. He was now in his twenty-eighth year, bowed and broken in health, carrying within him the seeds of an heritage of suffering, which, despite all human effort, followed him to the grave. The bracing atmosphere of our northern climate toned up his system, and he, determined to study medicine, matriculated at McGill University, and attended one course of lectures, when he found his health so much improved, that he returned to his loved employ, and after some months on a rural field, was appointed to Montreal, and labored with Rev. Wm. Squire, his spiritual father, and Rev. John Jenkins. Having completed his probation, he was received into full connection, and in 1854, he was appointed to Kingston, where he spent three years, and here he was married to Miss Pearson, daughter of

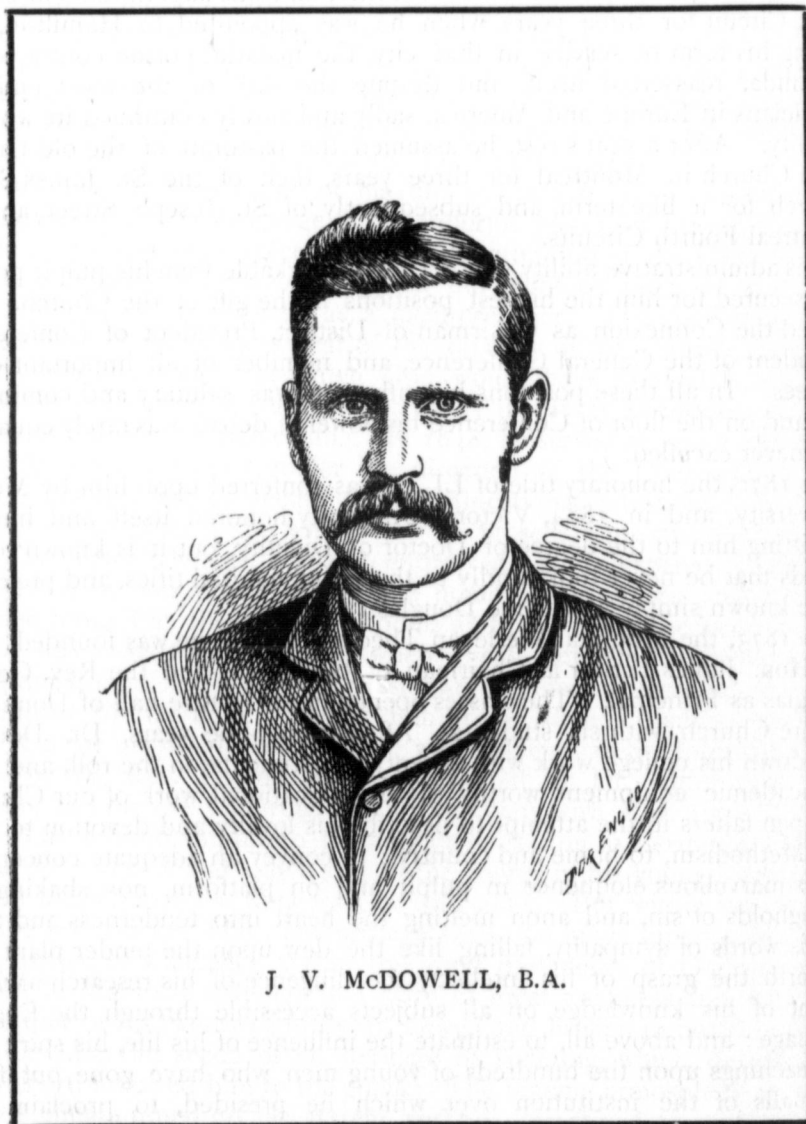
Robert Pearson, clerk in the Crown office, Toronto, who, with her three daughters, survives him. With what tenderness and affection this heroic wife became the prop upon which he leaned, and with what filial devotion these accomplished daughters became eyes to him in the long years of darkness, no pen can adequately describe. But for their assistance the work of George Douglas had practically ceased many years ago.

From Kingston he removed to Toronto, and was superintendent of the West Circuit for three years, when he was appointed to Hamilton, and during his term of service in that city, the malarial poison contracted in Bermuda, reasserted itself, and despite the skill of the most eminent physicians in Europe and America, sadly and slowly continued its work of debility. After a year's rest, he assumed the pastorate of the old Griffintown Church in Montreal for three years, then of the St. James Street Church for a like term, and subsequently of St. Joseph Street, and of Montreal Fourth Circuits.

His administrative ability was not less remarkable than his pulpit power, and secured for him the highest positions in the gift of the Church. He served the Connexion as Chairman of District, President of Conference, President of the General Conference, and member of all important committees. In all these positions his influence was salutary and commanding, and on the floor of Conference his power of debate was rarely equalled, and never excelled.

In 1870, the honorary title of LL.D. was conferred upon him by McGill University, and in 1884, Victoria University honored itself and him by admitting him to the degree of Doctor of Divinity, but it is known to his friends that he never took kindly to these well-merited titles, and preferred to be known simply as George Douglas.

In 1873, the Montreal Wesleyan Theological College was founded, with the Hon. James Ferrier as Chairman of the Board, and the Rev. George Douglas as Principal. The classes opened in the lecture hall of Dominion Square Church, with six students. After twenty-one years, Dr. Douglas laid down his college work with seventy-two students on the roll, and with an academic equipment worthy of the educational work of our Church. Our pen falters in the attempt to describe his loyalty and devotion to God and Methodism, to home and country; to convey an adequate conception of his marvellous eloquence in pulpit and on platform, now shaking the strongholds of sin, and anon melting the heart into tenderness and tears by his words of sympathy, falling like the dew upon the tender plant; to set forth the grasp of his intellect, the diligence of his research and the extent of his knowledge on all subjects accessible through the English language; and above all, to estimate the influence of his life, his spirit and his teachings upon the hundreds of young men who have gone out from the halls of the institution over which he presided, to proclaim the unsearchable riches of Christ. Amid loss of sensation, atrophy of nerves and muscles, and finally, almost total loss of vision, he was wondrously sustained of God, and served his generation as few men in the full possession of physical health are enabled to do. On the second day of December, 1893, he was taken ill, and after patient suffering, during which he expressed his abiding trust in Christ, he entered into rest on the 10th of February, 1894.

J. V. McDOWELL, B.A.,

Was born in the County of Huntingdon, in the Province of Quebec, on August 1st, 1852. He matriculated at Victoria University in 1877, and entered the ministry of the Wesleyan Church at that time. Before his ordination he labored on the following Circuits: Lachute and Dixville, in Quebec, and Iroquois, in Ontario. He was ordained in June, 1882. After his ordination he was stationed on the following Circuits in the order given: South Mountain, West Farnham, Ashton, Carp, Lachute and Lyn, at which latter place he died on April 4th, 1894.

Bro. McDowell was a man of unusual consecration. With his fine physique, rich, full voice, more than ordinary educational advantages and rare magnetic power, he became a preacher of great acceptability. His pulpit addresses showed a thorough mastery of his subject, a deep insight into spiritual things, and an over-mastering desire to win men to Christ. This was the one thought of his latter years. He was always ready for any self-denial or any service that would be likely to promote the interests of Methodism and the cause of the Master whom he so devotedly loved. It was almost a passion with him to see to it that the connexional interests were not only maintained but advanced on all his Circuits. To save men and lead them into the fulness of the blessings of the Gospel of peace was his constant aim. His comparatively early death was perhaps somewhat due to his ardency in his work. Self seemed lost in his love for God and souls, and privation and sacrifice appeared at times to be almost courted that he might thereby give full proof of his ministry. He was a noble man, a faithful friend, a patient, loving pastor, a fearless preacher and a devoted ambassador of the King, full of faith and of the Holy Ghost. His last illness was painful and often distressing, but the grace he had so earnestly offered to others was his stay and comfort in the hour of trial. He often said he had no desire to stay here only that he might win more souls for God and heaven. His end was peace; his death a triumph.

"The great fight is ended;
In deep-dinted harness the soldier has died,
And tears should be few in a sunset so splendid,
And grief hush her wail at the bidding of pride."

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

REPORT OF THE SUSTENTATION FUND COMMITTEE.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FUND.

1. The name of this Fund shall be, "The Sustentation Fund of the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church."

2. The one object of this Fund shall be to supply those fields in our Home Work which are now, and shall hereafter be, known as "Domestic Missions," or "Dependent Circuits or Stations," so that ministers and preachers duly appointed to those fields shall be regular claimants on the Fund, and shall be entitled to supplemental grants therefrom, whenever their "total income" from other sources shall actually fall below the following scale of minimum allowances, viz.:

For a single preacher on probation, \$300 per annum; for a single ordained minister, \$400 per annum; for a married minister, in full connection, \$500 per annum, with \$25 for each subsequent year, until his allowance reaches \$600 per annum.

N.B.—The term, "allowance" or "allowances," shall be understood as including only the items of ministerial support, viz., salary, board and fuel, exclusive of, and in addition to, any necessary charges for house rent, horse-keeping, travelling, removals and circuit incidentals.

Note.—That in regard to the distribution of the money contributed to this Fund, the Committee shall have discretionary power to make grants to ministers with families, even when the minimum allowance, \$600, is exceeded.

3. The income of this Fund shall consist of moneys raised within the bounds of our Conference, by collections and subscriptions on all the various Circuits and Missions, excepting the Indian and the French.

4. The general management of the Fund shall be entrusted to a Sustentation Fund Committee, composed of one minister and one layman, elected by each annual District meeting, and a ministerial secretary-treasurer elected by the Conference on the nomination of the Committee; and this Committee shall transact the necessary business thereof at each annual Conference, in accordance with the following regulations:

(a) With a view to raising the income needed, the Committee shall annually make a careful estimate of the prospective aggregate deficiencies on dependent fields, and suggest the amount desired from each District, in order to meet such deficiencies.

(b) In making grants from the Fund, the Committee shall have strict regard to the aforementioned "Scale of minimum allowances." No claim shall be entertained which has not been recommended by the annual District Meeting; and all Quarterly Boards presenting claims for recommendation, shall declare their inability to meet their "net deficiencies."

(c) Should the income of the Fund in any year prove insufficient to meet the claims thereon, then the grants shall be so distributed as to make up the allowances of claimants to the same percentage according to the aforementioned "scale," but should there be a surplus over the claims, as per said "scale," it shall be carried forward, and included in the income of the year next following.

(d) A report shall be presented by the Committee to the Conference annually, while in session, including a summary of business transacted, an audited statement of receipts and disbursements, and any suggestions deemed necessary to the interests of the Fund, said report, as adopted by the Conference, to be published in the Minutes.

5. That no application from any Circuit or Mission be entertained by the Committee, unless that Circuit or Mission has made the most earnest efforts to secure, at least, twenty cents per member.

In order to obtain greater support for this important Fund, the Financial District Meetings are requested to arrange for the holding of platform meetings, and the appointment of deputations to advocate the claims of the Fund on all the Circuits and Missions.

The Committee regrets that the income of the Fund has fallen off during the year so that we are able to grant only 20 per cent. of the constitutional claims; and in view of the pressing necessities we earnestly urge the ministers to put forth vigorous efforts to raise at least ten cents per member this year which will secure double the amount raised the past year.

That the Secretary-Treasurer be Rev. J. T. Pitcher, for the coming year.

MODE OF EXAMINATION FOR THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE.

Candidates for our Ministry and Probationers shall be examined by means of papers prepared by the respective Examiners.

There shall also be an oral examination if required.

In addition to the usual thorough Theological Examination of Candidates before the District Meeting, the Chairman shall examine each Candidate as to his studies and general reading for the year, with a view to giving advice as to his course and method of study. No Candidate shall be allowed the year of probation until the studies for that year are completed.

The examination of Candidates shall be held in each District, under the supervision of the Chairman, and the Examiners resident on the District, on the third Wednesday in April in each year, and at such place as the Chairman shall appoint. All papers shall be sent by the Examiners to the Chairman in sealed envelopes, not later than the first Wednesday in April in each year. The answers to the papers shall be sent by the Chairmen to the respective Examiners, who shall forward to the Secretary of the Board the valuation. The Secretary shall prepare the certificates, and forward them to the Chairman of the District, to be presented by him to the May District Meeting. The Secretary of the Board shall send the Chairman of each District the name of any Candidate or Probationer who may have taken part of the subjects in any given course, and the standing he has attained, but shall not issue the certificate in any year's course until the Candidate or Probationer has completed it; and further, the standard qualification for young men recommended to be received into our Conference as Probationers shall not be lower than fifty per cent. of the marks on the preliminary course of study in the aggregate, and thirty-three and one-third per cent. in each subject. Also a standing of thirty-three and one-third per cent. shall be required in order to pass in each subject of the subsequent course, and the Conference directs that existing regulations relating to the time and manner of examinations be imperatively observed, and more especially that it be deemed absolutely peremptory that the examinations be held on the same day throughout the whole Conference, and that all the young men in any District writing on any given subject write at the same hour. The maximum time for each paper shall be two hours. No supplementary examination shall be allowed between the regular time of examinations and the close of Conference. Each Examiner is expected to send at least one copy of each examination paper to the Chairmen of Districts.

The Probationers of this Conference shall have their standing given them year by year in our Minutes, jointly, according to their years travelled and studies passed.

It is further recommended that in future each paper sent to the Examiners shall be endorsed by the Chairman of the District or his deputy.

REPORT OF EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee finds cause for devout gratitude in the extension and development of the work of our Church among the youth of the Conference. Not only are we able to report an increase in the members enrolled in young people's organizations, but the experience gained in the study of the problems and settlement of the difficulties that beset the young people in their work is bearing its fruits in Christian character. The spirit of rivalry and the antagonism of interests that should be at one are gradually giving place to a more generous and united feeling. This great movement among the young people is yet in a formative state, and we desire to emphasize the necessity that all our ministers should continue to devote much time and energy to this department of the work, that their wisdom may guide, their zeal inspire, their loyalty animate, and their sympathy win and hold our young men and women for Christ and the Church. We rejoice to learn of good work being done in the building up of the regular services of the Church as well as in the establishing of additional services, and we trust that nothing may be permitted to weaken the loyal attachment of either young or old to the prayer service and the class-meeting.

There has come to us a letter from a Joint Committee, representing the young people of the principal Methodist bodies of North America, appealing for a closer affiliation, especially among young people of all the Methodisms of the world, as preparatory to a still wider unity in practical fellowship of all evangelical Christians. We gladly respond to the call, and record our cordial approval of and sympathy with every movement calculated to promote the unity of the faith and the answer to our Saviour's prayer, "that they all may be one."

We have also considered a proposal which comes from our own Young People looking towards the inauguration of a Quadrennial Dominion Convention of Methodist Young People. We heartily concur in this suggestion, and would name as representatives of this Conference on the Joint Committee already in part appointed, Rev. Geo. S. Clendinnen and Mr. G. F. Johnston, of Montreal. Inasmuch as it is desirable to conform our Young People's organizations to the constitution and usages of our Church, we believe that the associations and conventions should be organized as far as may be practicable along Conferential and District lines.

We would respectfully recommend the Conference to memorialize the General Conference, asking for the following legislative action :

1. That the official name for the organization of our young people shall be Epworth League of Christian Endeavor, it being understood that this action shall not affect the status of Epworth Leagues at present existing or the working of Methodist Christian Endeavor Societies that may adopt the denominational title.

2. That the young peoples' societies be granted direct representation upon the Epworth League Board.

We desire the Conference to bring before our young people the following advices, which we deem essential to the truest success of this movement :

The cause of Missions is only beginning to receive the attention from our people which its pre-eminent importance demands. The connexional character of our Church, and the pressing claims of every department of the work, imperatively demand not only an increase of generosity, but a concentration of effort. We earnestly deprecate the disposition to divert a considerable portion of the missionary offerings of our people to special purposes, thus interfering with the administration of the Fund by the properly constituted authorities. Let us seek in every way to strengthen the hands of the General and the Woman's Missionary Societies of our Church. And let our Epworth Leagues ever remember that there is much missionary work which cannot be done by proxy, and that the giving of money can never release us from the obligation to personal endeavor in the interest of the Gospel.

No part of our constitution is so essential to the life and well-being of every Epworth League as the active member's pledge. Let this pledge be carefully studied, solemnly accepted and regularly renewed, and let its spirit of utter consecration and earnest service rule the life of every member. We would direct attention to a helpful pamphlet recently issued by Rev. A. M. Phillips, B.D., on "The Epworth League and Christian Endeavor Pledge."

There should be a Junior Epworth League in every place where one can be formed. The grand possibilities of junior work in saving and training the boys and girls can not be over estimated. We regret that complete statistics of Junior Leagues in our conference are not now at hand, but the work has been begun, and we look for great things in the near future from this department of the work.

There are reported to us this year 110 local branches of the Epworth League, with a total membership for the Conference of 4,937. This is an increase over last year of thirteen leagues and 796 members. The overwhelming majority of these, we are glad to say, are affiliated with the Christian Endeavor movement under the title of Epworth League of Christian Endeavor.

We recommend that this report be read in all our young people's societies.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF STANSTEAD COLLEGE.

The trustees of Stanstead Wesleyan College, in presenting to the Conference this annual report, would render gratitude to Almighty God for the success and prosperity that have been granted to the College during the session now closing. For some years past there has been a steady increase in the attendance of pupils and financial resources. Dr. A. G. Bugbee and Mrs. Bugbee have donated a large building to the College, which they propose to move on to the College grounds, and furnish ready for occupancy during the next session. This will afford accommodation for the increasing attendance of pupils, as well as better facilities for class work.

We have to mourn the loss by death of four trustees, Rev. George Douglas, D.D.; A. P. Ball, Esq.; Stephen Foster, Esq., and D. A. Mansur, Esq. These were old and tried friends of the College, who were ever ready by wise counsel and generous contributions to assist the College. We tender to their families our sincere sympathy.

It is with great gratification we record the phenomenal success which has attended the efforts of the Rev. A. Lee Holmes, M.A., to liquidate the debt which so long has embarrassed the operation of the College. The amount of the debt, computed to the first of July next, is in the vicinity of \$18,000, and he reports that there is every prospect of the full amount being raised, and we trust and believe that the whole Church will cheerfully respond to the appeal and aid in this laudable undertaking.

The success attending the labors of the Rev. C. R. Flanders, B.A., the Principal of the College, during the year is a cause of much gratitude and an augury of still greater success in the immediate future.

We request that the Conference recommend to the General Conference that Discipline, Par. 153, Sec. 2, be amended by the addition of the words: "Also a certificate of passing in any subject in the preliminary course in any of our Conference institutions."

We present, first, Principal Flanders' report.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT.

To the Trustees of the Stanstead Wesleyan College:

DEAR BRETHREN,—During the past year we have had in attendance in the various departments maintained in the College, one hundred and sixty young people, representing a constituency extending from Ottawa to Gaspe, with several students from Newfoundland and the neighboring Republic. Among these we have had members of almost every religious denomination, including Roman Catholic and Jewish.

We have prepared and sent up for the examinations of McGill University, eleven students; seven in the first, and four in the second year of the Arts course. Of these, ten passed the examinations, several taking first-class rank in several subjects. This is the largest number of Arts students ever sent up, and the success achieved by them has been quite as great as that of the students in attendance upon McGill.

Our Academy and Model School departments afford the only opportunity in which the Methodist Church can co-operate actively and directly with the Protestant Committee of Education in the Province of Quebec.

At the Government Examinations, which begin this week, we are presenting forty-three candidates in the following classes:

Academy—Grade III., A.A., 10.

“ “ II., 11.

“ “ I., 9.

Model—Grade II., 12.

In addition to these, we have prepared in these departments several candidates who will write for teachers' diplomas in the June examinations.

In the Commercial Department the number in attendance has been thirty-six, of whom twenty will successfully complete the course this year and receive diplomas.

In music and Fine Art we have had upwards of forty pupils, and the work accomplished has been most satisfactory.

We must not fail to speak with gratitude of the freedom from any serious sickness which has prevailed among our students. This we recognize as due to the mercy of the author of life and health, to the extreme healthfulness of our location, and to the excellent sanitary condition of the college building.

We are making certain important changes in our staff, but in every instance are seeking to introduce teachers who are specialists in the departments in which they teach.

With these opportunities opening up before us so full of promise, suffer us to suggest to the Church, that vigorous measures be taken to make it possible for us to so increase our efficiency that Stanstead College may become in every respect truly representative of the culture and enterprise of the ministers and laymen within the bounds of the Montreal Conference.

WESLEYAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, MONTREAL.

To the Annual Conferences of the Methodist Church.

DEAR BRETHREN :

The Executive Officers of the Wesleyan Theological College, Montreal, affiliated to the McGill University, respectfully submit to you the following brief report of the work and general interests of the institution :

The past year has been painfully eventful in the death of the late honored Principal, the Rev. George Douglas, D.D., LL.D., whose name will be perennial in the history of the institution. By the unanimous

action of the Board of Governors, the Rev. Prof. Shaw, D.D., LL.D., has been called to the vacancy so created, and Rev. J. Cooper Antliff, M.A., (Edin.) D.D., has been added to the staff. The Rev. Prof. Patton, B.D., has been granted leave of absence to pursue in Germany a Post-graduate Course in Semitic Literature, and his place has been filled by the Rev. Prof. Richardson, B.A., B.D., Acting Registrar.

The institution enters upon its new phase of history with the firm determination of its authorities not only to maintain its efficiency, but also to enlarge its work for the Church, and to increase its financial strength.

The number of students registered the past year was seventy-two, including seventeen non-resident. All students in residence attend the McGill University either as undergraduates or partial students. Men whose age and circumstances prove the wisdom of such a course are induced to take the full Arts Curriculum, which requires a residence of four years. At the same time at least equal practical benefit is obtained from the Licentiates' Course, which requires three years of attendance at lectures, and which includes the most valuable part of the University Curriculum, besides a heavy course in Divinity. It has been generally recognized that the College, in carrying so large a number of men beyond the necessarily limited, if not meagre, "Course of study for Probationers," is doing a most valuable educational service for the Ministry of the Methodist Church. After the system of Yale and Drew, and several other leading colleges in America, licentiates completing their course are admitted to the further and higher three years' course for the Degree of B.D.

Financially the condition of the institution is steadily improving. Although a small draft of \$1,600 has been made on the capital, which is sure to be soon replaced, the College may be said to be really out of debt. The Endowment Fund, largely through the successful efforts of the Rev. W. Harris, has been raised to over \$70,000. The income on current accounts the past year was \$6,448.58, and expenditure \$6,487.33. The income and outlay of the Boarding Department are about \$4,000.

There is great need of increased accommodation in both class-rooms, dormitories and Convocation Hall, and the hope is entertained that this want may be supplied without such a delay as may permanently weaken the institution, and that the valuable land held vacant may soon thus be occupied. The real estate of the College is valued at \$70,000, and is out of debt.

ENDOWMENT FUND, WESLEYAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE, MONTREAL.

To the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church:

DEAR BRETHREN.—While rejoicing to report a comparatively successful year in the work with which you have entrusted me, there are two circumstances which have largely militated against the enterprise.

1. It is doubtless known to all of you that we have been passing through the greatest financial depression which has visited us since 1878. Collections have therefore been very difficult.

2. After having appointments made at five or six of the principal town and city churches of the Conference, we have either voluntarily withdrawn from them or been anticipated in them by that enthusiastic collector, Rev. A. Lee Holmes, M.A., in his able and successful effort to wipe out the long-standing debt of Stanstead Wesleyan College. This fact, and the almost universal tendency to give immediate relief to the Stanstead movement, in order to liquidate a debt which has so long burdened the Conference, have to a great degree nullified my efforts during the past four months. We are, however, grateful to be able to report as follows:

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FRENCH METHODIST INSTITUTE, COTE ST. ANTOINE, MONTREAL.

Some imagine that because the members reported on French Missions are only about 200 and the missionaries six that there is ground for discouragement. To a superficial observer this would seem to be the case. A careful consideration, however, reveals the fact that of those who have been more or less enlightened by the Gospel through the workers of the Methodist Church in Canada, some have been so boycotted that they have emigrated to the United States, and may be found from Rhode Island to Illinois. Some have joined English Churches in the Dominion, and others, though still nominally Roman Catholics, are but waiting for a general movement which shall be of sufficient momentum to enable them to profess the new faith and yet remain in the land of

their birth. The progress of disintegration among our French-Canadian fellow-countrymen is becoming more and more marked, and the day is not far distant when the open Bible that has been the lamp of English homes shall shed its saving beams in the home of every French-Canadian in the Province of Quebec.

But let us not dig up our seed to see if it be growing. Only once, and that not in the Province of Quebec, but in Cana of Galilee, were the processes of nature so expedited that in a moment the water was made wine.

One hundred and fourteen applications for admission reached the committees last fall. A careful discrimination on their part, and various other causes, reduced the number of actual students received to 79—males, 47; females, 32—5 less than the previous year, while the average attendance was considerably in advance of that term. These 79 were composed of 5 Indians, 5 Italians, 1 Swede, 19 English and 49 French. Of these, 25 came from Roman Catholic homes.

The presence of the Lord, the Spirit, was realized almost from the commencement; was felt more deeply during the two weeks' special services at the beginning of the New Year, culminated during the "Fay-Mills" meetings, and continued to the end.

Several extremely interesting cases of conversion have taken place. The class-meetings, prayer-meetings, Sunday School and preaching services have been really means of grace. Marked improvement in intelligence, studies and deportment has been shown by most of the students. The unselfish and unstinted labors of the teachers, both in and out of school hours, have not been in vain.

Miss Masten has continued her valuable and successful work as head lady teacher, and much more. Mr. Alfred E. Rivard, now of Ware, Mass., who rendered us excellent service in 1890 and 1891, has again scored a decided success as headmaster. Miss Felicie Borloz, one of the Actonvale students, has been a valued assistant. The musical department is still doing good work under Miss Hall, B.A., and Professor Marceau. Our honorary teachers and lecturers have been the Misses St. Denis and Irwin (drawing), Miss Walker (calisthenics), Dr. Shaw (hygiene). J. A. Hutchinson, Esq., M.D., still continues his valuable and gratuitous services. A class much prized by the girls has been that of cutting out and dressmaking, held weekly under the care of Miss Farber, and at the expense of the Woman's Missionary Society.

While the directors have given their careful consideration and best judgment to the work committed to them, special mention should be made of the more frequent tax upon the time and thought of the Committee on Household Management—Mrs. Torrance and Mrs. Finley.

The position of headmaster for the coming session has been given by the directors to Monsieur and Madame Dalpé, at present engaged in Mount Allison Academy at Sackville, New Brunswick, from whose experience and consecrated spirit we augur the best results.

A note of sorrow and of triumph must close this report. Our beloved Chairman, whose deep interest in the work of French evangelization is known to all who knew Dr. Douglas, has been removed to the Church triumphant. The Reverend Dr. Williams, well-versed in the past and

present of this work, is Dr. Douglas' successor in the chairmanship of our Board of Directors.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee beg leave to report that we believe our Church to be almost a solid phalanx in favor of the temperance reform. Our attitude must ever be one of uncompromising hostility to a trade which has blighted and perverted many of the best gifts and blessings of heaven, which has impeded the progress of the Gospel and to license which is a sin. The traffic in strong drink is a corrupt tree bringing forth evil fruit, and we are resolved to help to hew it down and to destroy it.

We rejoice that the highest tide of public sentiment in favor of Prohibition that has ever risen in our land is now prevailing, and we cherish the hope that it will soon sweep away all legal protection from the destructive trade in ardent spirits.

The plebiscites taken in several of our provinces have revealed to the astonishment of many that there is an almost irresistible temperance sentiment abroad in our land.

There can be no reasonable doubt on the part of legislators that the people of Canada are *now* ready for prohibition. In the Province of Ontario the way seems clear for a prohibitory law, if it be found that the local Government has jurisdiction in the case.

Should a plebiscite be taken in the Province of Quebec we pledge ourselves to do what we can to make the occasion tell for "God and home and country." We would be the more hopeful for a favorable result to a vote on Prohibition in Quebec, as there is such a wide-spread ardent temperance sentiment in the Roman Catholic Church.

The Quebec Government has done credit to itself and good to the country by expunging from the license laws an unscientific obnoxious clause which declared that beer containing only four per cent. of alcohol was non-intoxicating.

At this stage of the temperance movement we would beg leave to remind our legislators that the time has gone by when the people of this country, or temperance delegations, will listen with patience to the worn-out arguments against prohibition referring to loss of revenue. Nevertheless we should not blame our legislators for lethargy, trickery or open opposition toward our cause if we ourselves refuse, if need be, to break our party ties for the sake of the great boon we desire. In harmony with a resolution from the Perth District we would strongly urge our people to use their full influence in electing such candidates to Parliament as can be relied on to vote for prohibition irrespective of party.

As educative influences we would recommend the continuance of scientific temperance teaching in our public schools, special lessons in our Sunday Schools, the preaching of sermons on this subject, the distribution of literature and all other helpful means.

We desire to place on record our admiration of the action of Mayor Warring Kennedy, of Toronto, in refusing to receive in the name of the city a delegation of men representing the liquor interest. We consider this one of the most courageous acts ever done in the interests of temperance reform by any public man in our country. In harmony with the spirit of a resolution from the Huntingdon District we advise that the General Conference be requested to take such action on the tobacco question as it may deem advisable in the interests of thrift, health, influence, and cleanliness. We respectfully acknowledge a communication from the Dominion Alliance and recommend that our delegates to the coming Convention in Montreal be the following: Rev. E. B. Ryckman, D.D., *President of the Conference*; Rev. A. M. Phillips, B.D.; Mr. Asa Beach, of Iroquois; Mr. William Tees, of Montreal.

REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee are pleased to report that the past year has been fruitful of much good in the Sunday School work of this Conference, there being an increase in the number of schools, number of scholars, in the average attendance, and in that to which all our work tends, a very large increase in the number of conversions.

While your Committee see cause for thankfulness, yet we cannot but regret a slight decrease in attendance of adults in our schools, we would therefore urge upon the ministers of this Conference the importance of securing the attendance of the parents at the sessions of the Sunday Schools, so that young men and ladies of our church may not be taught to feel the school as only a place for children. Keep the adults, and the primary and intermediate classes will keep themselves.

We also regret that there has been a falling off in the moneys raised for missions, a most important portion of our school work. Teach the scholars the necessity for and the blessing which accompanies giving, and no longer will we have to report decrease in missionary funds.

We would also urge the necessity of holding weekly meetings for the study of the lessons, thereby kindling a deeper love among the workers and a more united method of imparting the central truths contained in the study.

Your Committee would urge undivided effort in this most important portion of Church work. Unite the church and school as a centre from which will irradiate a deeper love, causing a more intense, earnest study of God's Holy Word, which is able to build us up and make us wise unto salvation.

Your Committee would further recommend the adoption of children's day by the Conference once a year, as such would tend to infuse interest into the work, and thereby be of benefit to the schools.

STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee is gratified to notice a substantial increase in the membership. We suggest that increased attention be paid to the young people of our Methodist families, by encouraging the establishment of Epworth Leagues, or Epworth Leagues of Christian Endeavor, and for the children pleasant and instructive week-day classes, by which they will be gradually drafted into the Church. It is also very desirable that they should be encouraged to attend the regular preaching services.

Our Sabbath Schools continue to flourish, as evidenced by the returns from that department of the Church's work. We suggest that every effort be made on the part of the pastors and Sunday School superintendents, to permeate the minds of the children of the schools with Christian thoughts and ideas, by the circulation of our Sunday School papers and literature, in preference to all others.

It is a matter of gratitude to God that a spirit of evangelism pervades, more or less, the churches under the care of this Conference, and it is much to be desired that this spirit be intensified, believing that the Methodist Church was raised up by the great head of the Church for this purpose.

In order that greater prosperity may attend our work, spiritually and financially, this Committee respectfully urges upon the brethren the advisability of discouraging the raising of Church funds by any other than the Scriptural method of systematic and proportionate giving. Also, the desirability of preserving our places of public worship for distinctly religious purposes.

Your Committee deplore the growing tendency of some of our membership, in many places, to indulge in questionable amusements, such as dancing and card-playing, and would urge upon pastors the necessity of endeavoring to lead our people to discountenance such conduct.

We strongly recommend that every legitimate means be employed by all of our people to further the temperance cause at this crisis.

As some trouble and misunderstanding has arisen in the past in allowing the use of our churches by other denominations for indefinite periods, we call attention to the Discipline, page 294, sub-section 2, and recommend that Superintendents and Trustee Boards exercise greater caution in regard to this matter in the future.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Your Committee beg leave to report, That we find abundant proof of the desecration of the holy Sabbath within the bounds of the Montreal Conference, by railway and steamboat companies, street car companies, etc., as well as by private individuals, a state of things which we very much regret, as its tendency is to counteract and greatly hinder much of the good sought to be done by the Church for perishing humanity.

The running of trains, boats, street cars, public cabs, etc., prevent many of the people in the employment of those companies from attending

the public means of grace, as well as depriving them of the rest of that day, and thus is detrimental to both soul and body.

We would urge upon all our people to act firmly and earnestly in this matter, and to strive to teach, both by precept and example, that this day should be kept as a day (not of worldly pleasure or profit) but of holy pleasure and spiritual profit.

We would respectfully call attention to the request of the Lord's Day Alliance, and in compliance therewith, recommend that a committee be appointed in each and every district to wait on our representatives in Parliament, and through them, to urge upon the Government of our Dominion, to give us a law for the faithful and proper observance of that day.

We rejoice to notice that the Government this year has seen fit to prohibit the passage of boats through our canals, and hope and pray that very soon the railroad companies may also be required to observe that day as one of rest and not of traffic.

Also recommend that we earnestly strive to prevent the publication or distribution of Sunday newspapers.

We invite the co-operation of workingmen's societies in our effort to procure for all one day in seven as a day of rest.

Your Committee on Church Property beg leave to recommend as follows:

MONTREAL DISTRICT.

Calumet and Grenville.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Calumet and Grenville to sell the parsonage and apply the proceeds to the erection of a new parsonage be granted.

Mountain Street, Montreal.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Mountain Street Church to sell a parcel of land and apply the proceeds to liquidation of church debt be granted.

Douglas Church, Montreal.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Douglas Church to sell a parcel of vacant land and apply the proceeds to liquidation of church debt be granted.

Côte St. Antoine, Montreal.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Côte St. Antoine to sell their present church site, proceeds to be applied to the purchase of a new church site, be granted.

PERTH DISTRICT.

Glen Tay.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Glen Tay Church to sell the church and lot at Glen Tay and \$100 of proceeds to be applied to liquidation of debt on Lanark Church, balance to be applied as trustees may direct, be granted.

That the following resolution be forwarded to the General Conference :

RESOLUTION RESPECTING TRUSTEE BOARDS.

Moved by J. R. Lavell, seconded by Wm. Philp, that,

"Whereas, many of the trustees on the Trust Boards of our properties have been irregularly appointed, and complications have arisen, and are likely to arise, in connection with the titles of these properties; therefore,

Resolved,—That this meeting asks the Annual Conference to memorialize the General Conference to have some system of rules prepared by which a superintendent of a circuit could ascertain with readiness the condition of the Trust Boards, and provide some means for correcting, in an inexpensive manner, any merely technical difficulties."

OTTAWA DISTRICT.

North Gower.—That the request of the Trustee Board of North Gower Church to transfer a portion of the burying-ground to the Trustee Board of the Wellington Church for the purpose of erecting a church, in exchange for another piece of land to be used for a burying-ground, be granted.

Manotick.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Wellington Church, Manotick Circuit, to convey a certain portion of the burying-ground to the Trustee Board of North Gower for another portion of ground for a church site, be granted.

Metcalfe.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Russell Church to sell the old church and land on which it stands, 30 x 40 feet, proceeds to be applied to the erection of sheds, be granted.

STANSTEAD DISTRICT.

Mansonville.—That the request of the Trustee Board of Mansonville Church to sell a small portion of land in the rear of church, proceeds to be applied to the liquidation of the debt on church, be granted.

WATERLOO DISTRICT.

Granby.—That the request of the Trustees of Granby Church to exchange a piece of land at the corner of their lot for a much larger piece at the rear, be granted.

Re RESOLUTION RESPECTING SALE OF PEWS IN OUR CHURCHES.

We would say any sale of pews in churches, held under our model deed, is illegal. Other cases depend on the deed under which property is held and the Trustees of each individual church should seek legal advice themselves, each case resting on its own set of facts.

REPORT OF THE STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee, after careful and painstaking effort, beg leave to submit the following report, which we regret is not in every respect such as we would like to have been able to present :

We find a decrease of about \$1,300 in the Missionary Fund, which,

however, is largely counterbalanced by an increase of over \$1,000 in the Woman's Missionary Fund.

We have also to report a slight decrease in the Educational Fund, but we note with satisfaction the large amounts that have been subscribed to our educational institutions.

It is very gratifying to report a large increase in our membership. There are at present in full membership 35,519; on trial, 1,857; making a total 37,398—or a net increase of 1,343 for the year.

The rite of baptism has been administered to 2,546 children and 270 adults, a total of 2,816; marriages performed, 945; burials attended, 1,567. All of which is respectfully submitted.

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON THE SUPERANNUATION FUND.

The Special Committee appointed to consider the memorials *re* the Superannuation Fund, met and appointed Rev. R. Whiting, Chairman, and Rev. T. C. Brown, Secretary.

Your Committee recommend that the following memorial from the Montreal District, be endorsed and forwarded to General Conference.

Moved by Rev. J. Tallman Pitcher, seconded by S. Finley, Esq.,

That the District Meeting memorialize General Conference to restore the claims of those widows whose husbands had travelled fifteen years, and who had thereby a permanent claim. Carried.

Re the following memorial from Perth District :

Moved by Rev. S. Kines, seconded by Rev. W. A. Jamieson,

Whereas the case of Mrs. Rose, as permanent claimant on the Superannuation Fund, was declared in her favor by this district some years ago, and also decided in her favor by the Superannuation Board ; and

Whereas it has transpired that the Board has subsequently informed the claimant that they cannot continue her claim ; therefore,

Resolved,—That this District Meeting desires to re-affirm its judgment as to the justice of Mrs. Rose's claim, and requests the Montreal Conference to memorialize the General Conference to so amend the constitution (if necessary) of the fund as to make it legally possible to meet this morally just claim.

The Committee recommend that the prayer of the memorial be granted. Carried.

Re memorial from Kingston District concerning Rev. W. Pimlott's relation to the Fund

We recommend that the Memorial be referred to the favorable consideration of the Board.

Following is the memorial :

Whereas the Rev. W. Pimlott, at the time of the union of the Meth-

odist churches, gave his note for the amount required to give him a claim on the Superannuation Fund for the number of years he has travelled, and

Whereas, subsequently, he was transferred to the Manitoba Conference; and

Whereas, owing to the failure of the crops, producing extreme poverty among the people, thus rendering them unable to pay his salary, he was thereby hindered from paying the said note; and

Whereas a circular letter from the General Superintendent informed Bro. Pimlott that it must be paid within six months; and

Whereas Bro. Pimlott inferred that he would not be allowed to level up after that time, and therefore abandoned all hope of meeting the claim, and thereby allowed his rights in the matter to lapse for want of ability to pay;

Therefore this District Meeting recommends the annual Conference to take such steps as will bring the matter before the Superannuation Board at the General Conference, with a view of reviving said claim.

We would also recommend that the Memorial of the Kingston District following, be referred to the favorable consideration of the General Conference.

Whereas the Rev. Dr. Griffith travelled twenty three years as an active minister in connection with our Church; and

Whereas, after consultation with a number of prominent ministers of our Church, he took a letter of standing, which, however, was not deposited with any other Church, but was returned to the Toronto Conference within the period of one year, and was accepted by that Conference, which fully re-instated him in our active work; and

Whereas at the next annual meeting of the Toronto Conference, it was unanimously resolved that the Superannuation Board be recommended to restore him to his former standing as a claimant on the Superannuation Fund; and

Whereas the General Superintendent suggested the propriety of submitting the matter to the Superannuation Board at the General Conference;

Therefore the District Meeting recommends the annual Conference to take such action as shall, in its judgment, secure the recognition by the Superannuation Board of Dr. Griffith's claim for his full term of service.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EVANGELISTS.

(As per page 80 of the Minutes, 1893.)

Your Committee reports that Rev. Dr. T. G. Williams acted as Chairman, and Rev. S. D. Chown Secretary.

The Committee prepared a method of examining evangelists according to the direction of the Conference, and sent copies of the same to the chairmen of districts, as follows :

FORM OF EXAMINATION FOR EVANGELISTS WITHIN THE BOUNDS OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE, TO TAKE EFFECT JULY 1ST, 1893.

First—As to Character. A certificate shall be furnished to the chairman in whose district the evangelist wishes to labor, from the minister in charge of the circuit or church where the evangelist has church membership, covering the following particulars: (1) name; (2) age; (3) date of conversion; (4) official position, if any; (5) general opinion of qualification as to gifts, graces and fruit.

Second—As to Experience and Doctrine. The following questions shall be asked of the candidates by the District Committee, composed as per Conference Regulation. (See Discipline, 1890, paragraph 185.)

NOTE.—Written answers shall be secured by the District Committee in any cases where the position or knowledge or attainments of the candidates are in the least unsatisfactory.

Third—As to Methods of Work. What is the candidates opinion of the following practices in connection with evangelistic work or other meetings for Divine worship? Should they be encouraged or repressed, and for what reasons? (a) Prostration. (b) Permitting several persons

to pray or speak aloud at the same time. (c) Professedly uncontrollable laughter. (d) Disloyalty to the regular ministry and services and financial interests of the Church.

NOTE.—Same provision concerning written answers as above.

GENERAL NOTE.—Well-recognized evangelists, or ordained ministers working as evangelists connected with other religious bodies, may be employed after securing the sanction of the Central Committee.

These persons are legitimately available for work, and we trust that your loyalty to the duly constituted authorities of the Church will prevent the employment of any evangelist not so authorized.

It being further understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this authorization shall be revocable at the pleasure of the aforesaid Committee upon sufficient cause being shown.

COMMITTEE *RE* WORKINGMEN'S MEMORIAL.

The Committee organized with the Rev. W. J. Hunter, D.D., as Chairman, and the Rev. A. C. Courtice, as Secretary.

The Committee advises the following reply :

TO ALFRED TERRY, A. HOPPINS, *et al.*, Members of the Workingmen's Meeting of the City of Kingston. To your Memorial Presented to our Conference, We Reply as follows :

1. We are in sympathy with the view that every laborer, whether skilled or unskilled, should have a living wage or, in other words, such a remuneration as would enable a man with an average family to live in reasonable comfort, and have some measure of leisure for self-improvement.

2. We are in sympathy with the fundamental principles implied in your address that the earth is the Lord's and the fulness thereof, that the land belongs to God and should be viewed as a heritage of all the people, and that the true system of land tenure is that which will bring about the maximum of production for the people's good.

3. We are opposed to the holding of land for purely speculative purposes. If there be any legitimate speculation it is not in dealing with the necessaries of life, such as food, fuel and clothing, and the basis of all such supplies in the natural wealth of the earth.

We would agree with you that the community would be justified in placing such taxes on unused and unimproved land as would destroy the profit of speculation, but we are not convinced that a tax on land values as the only tax levied in the community, would fall with any greater equity than the present system. We think that such wealth as exists in the community and is not invested in land values, should contribute to the public need in taxes.

4. You refer with approval in your memorial to "the principles of land tenure revealed to us by God through Moses." We would remind you that injustice and avarice found methods, even under the Mosaic legislation, of accomplishing inequality and aggregation of property, so that the prophet had to rebuke the people in these words : "Woe unto them that join house to house, that lay field to field, till there be no place that they may be placed alone in the midst of the earth. In mine ears said the Lord of Hosts, of a truth many houses shall be desolate, even great and fair, without inhabitant." Individual faithlessness works disastrous results under the best system. We feel that we do the most important work when we promote the regeneration and elevation of the individual, though we are by no means insensible to the social structure and functions.

5. The Church which we represent, while acknowledging the benefits accruing to the working classes and the community generally, from a right and benevolent use of capital, is opposing the interests of selfish capitalists in vigorously pushing the prohibition movement and the proper observance of the Sabbath. Selfish capital panders to the appetite for strong drink, and to the claims of pleasure-seekers who would make a holiday of our sacred day of rest. We believe that a manifest improvement in the temporal condition of the people is a most marked result of Prohibition in Maine.

We have undertaken a great work against the interests of selfish capitalists in these particulars, and wish to secure success in these before undertaking other great tasks that may await us, and in these we bespeak your help.

6. We finally assure you that you may depend on the hearty support of the Church we represent in every wise and honest effort to correct the wrongs that exist in our civilization, which necessarily fall most heavily on the poorer classes, and to promote an order of society that shall mean a Kingdom of God among men through the Kingship of Christ.

EDUCATIONAL MEETING.

The Educational Meeting was held in Queen Street Methodist Church on Wednesday, May 30th, beginning at 8 p.m.

The Rev. W. H. Graham, ex-President presided. The devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. S. P. Rose, D.D. After a few remarks by the Chairman, Rev. P. L. Richardson, B.A., B.D., in the absence of the Treasurer, Rev. Dr. Shaw, read the financial report for the year.

The Rev. Wm. Harris, M.A., reported having raised toward the Endowment Fund of the Wesleyan Theological College, \$27,000 of the \$50,000 desired.

The Revs. J. Elliott, B.A., and J. Potts, D.D., followed with excellent educational addresses.

TEMPERANCE.

The Temperance Anniversary was held in Sydenham Street Church, on the evening of Tuesday, June 5th, beginning at 8 o'clock, Rev. R. Whiting presiding. The 910th Hymn was sung, and Rev. Melvin Taylor led in prayer. Rev. E. R. Kelly addressed the meeting, giving a sketch of the history of the Temperance movement. Rev. G. S. Reynolds next addressed the Conference, urging the use of the ballot as a means to secure Prohibition. Rev. F. A. Read spoke of the influence of the pulpit in educating the conscience of the country on the Temperance question. An open discussion then took place in which Rev. A. C. Courtice, Rev. A. M. Phillips, Rev. G. G. Huxtable and Rev. W. J. Hunter took part. The meeting was enlivened with appropriate music and closed by singing "God Save the Queen."

MISSIONARY.

The Conference Missionary Anniversary was held in the Sydenham Street Methodist Church, Kingston, on Thursday, May 31st, beginning at 8 p.m. Rev. Wm. Jackson, ex-President, occupied the chair. The 729th Hymn was sung, and the Rev. T. J. Mansell offered prayer. The Rev.

Mr. Kines, Treasurer of Montreal Conference gave a brief financial report. Hymn 728 was then sung. J. R. Lavell, Esq., B.A., followed with an address on Domestic Missions. A vigorous address was then given on the work in Japan, by Rev. Dr. Eby, returned missionary. After two stanzas of the old missionary hymn, "From Greenland's Icy Mountains," etc., the Rev. The question was then asked, "What ministers or probationers for the ministry have died during the year? The various districts being called, it was announced that Rev. J. McDowell, B.A., and Rev. Obituary notices were read and approved, and testimony was borne by many of the brethren to the Christian character and marked usefulness of the departed. Rev. Prof. Dyer gave report of Albert College, Belleville.

Rev. S. G. Bland, B.A., read the report of the Montreal Conference Branch of the Woman's Missionary Society.

Revs. Dr. Sutherland, Dr. Briggs, Dr. Dewart and Dr. Potts spoke in behalf of the interests they represented.

Rev. A. M. Phillips presented claims of *Methodist Review*.

Other reports and communications not found in Minutes have been filed with Conference papers.

REPORT OF MEMORIALS COMMITTEE.

Your Committee reports as follows :

That the matters referred to in the memorial from the Quebec District, with reference to reduction of marriage license fee, methods of registration, etc., in the Province of Quebec, be referred to the Methodist Ministerial Association of Montreal.

Re memorial touching our educational work,

Moved by Rev. James Elliott, B.A., seconded by B. M. Britton, Esq., Q.C., asking that the General Conference have a veto power in all appointments to the staff of any of our connexional institutions of learning, and that the greatest care be exercised in the election of our professors.

Also, that in justice to probationers for our ministry in the various Conferences, the portion of money appropriated for loans to the students should be held by the General Treasurer and disbursed *per capita* to each class. Recommended.

Re memorial requesting the Annual Conference to insert in the Pastoral Address a paragraph condemning Sunday funerals, except when absolutely necessary. Recommended.

Re memorial from the Ottawa District, touching the necessity of a revision of the Rules of Order of the General Conference. Recommended.

Re memorials from Montreal District, petitioning General Conference to inaugurate a policy with a view to the rapid reduction of church debts, and abolishing pew rents in our churches.

Also asking for a change in the term "Schedule" to that of "Statistical Report."

Also asking for a change in Sunday School Statistical Report, substituting "How many have joined the Church?" for "How many conversions?" Recommended.

Re communication from the Secretary of the Prisoners' Aid Association,

asking for the appointment of a committee to co-operate with said Association in the cause of prison reform.

Recommended that a committee of three be appointed.

Touching the memorial on the question of Tobacco,

Your Committee would recommend that the law concerning minors using or purchasing tobacco in any form be most urgently adhered to, and that all legitimate means be used for the abatement of its use among our people.

Re religious organizations,

Your Committee would recommend that this Conference directs that no religious organizations, of which ministers of our Church and licensed evangelists are members, shall hold meetings on any circuit of any district within the bounds of the Conference, without the consent of the Chairman of the District, and the Superintendent of the Circuit on which it is proposed to hold such meeting or meetings.

Re Laymen's memorial,

"Moved by J. B. Elliott, seconded by J. Delahay, and

Resolved,—That we, the lay members of the Montreal Conference assembled in separate session, do hereby express to the Annual Conference, consisting of ministers and laymen, our conviction that the time has arrived when our Church must be protected, as far as it is possible for this Conference so to do, from a wave of fanaticism which threatens to result in divisions and dissensions on many of our circuits, and on some has resulted in extravagances which bring a reproach on the religion of our Lord Jesus Christ.

"We therefore request the Montreal Conference to take such action in the matter as in its godly judgment it may deem most helpful in the interests of an enlightened Christianity among us."

Your Committee would recommend that it be forwarded by this Conference to the General Conference for suitable legislation.

MINISTERS CHANGING CIRCUITS.

It was *Resolved*,—That the following resolution, passed at a former Conference session, be retained in the printed Minutes as a standing resolution: "That the Librarian of the Wesleyan Theological College be requested to take the custody of completed District Journals and other Church documents of valuable historical interest, to be deposited in the Library of said institution, and to be accessible at all times to members of this Conference.

It was on motion *Resolved*,—That ministers changing circuits be responsible for the supply of circuits they are leaving for two Sundays after the rising of Conference.

STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

It was moved, seconded and

Resolved,—That the District Secretaries of the ensuing year shall constitute the Statistical Committee.

Re DEGREES.

In relation to the recognition of Academic Titles, the Board of Examiners recommends:

1. That all Degrees from Canadian Universities and Theological Colleges be recognized in the Conference records.
2. That continued recognition be given to all Degrees recognized in the Minutes of 1891.
3. That in the case of foreign Degrees, on the same being reported to the Board of Examiners, recognition shall be given by not less than a two-thirds vote of the Examiners present at the Annual Meeting. Action may be delayed by the Board calling for further information, or for production of the Calendars of the Colleges concerned, or of the Diplomas.
4. Diplomas shall in no case be recognized from so-called "Correspondence Colleges," which have no provision for lectures and for instruction of resident students.

TIME OF DISTRICT MEETINGS.

On motion, it was recommended that no District Meeting be held in the week when the Stationing Committee meets.

AID TO PROBATIONERS ATTENDING COLLEGE.

Whereas the Discipline requires all probationers to attend College, and whereas in consequence the number of students is now unprecedentedly large; therefore,

Resolved,—That we recommend the Educational Committee hereafter to limit aid given to probationers to two years in succession, except in very special circumstances.

CLOSING OF CONFERENCE.

The Minutes were read and confirmed, and at about 10.30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 6th, 1894, Hymn 437 was sung, Rev. G. Rogers offered prayer, the Rev. E. B. Ryckman, D.D., pronounced the benediction, and the Montreal Conference of 1894 was closed.

ADDRESS
OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE TO THE CHURCHES
UNDER ITS CARE.

Assembled again in our Annual Conference, we send forth our cordial and fervent greetings, and devoutly acknowledge the goodness and grace of God for His blessing so graciously vouchsafed in the past, and so faithfully promised for the future. We recognize our entire dependence on the Great Head of the Church for any good that has been done, or that we may hope to do. "The good that is done in the earth, the Lord doeth it. Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, saith the Lord. For we are laborers together with God." The Word of Life has not been preached in vain; and the Gospel of Christ has given forth no uncertain sound; it still is, as it ever has been, the power of God unto salvation. We have esteemed it a privilege and a duty to proclaim a free and full salvation, a present, complete and glorious salvation for all who truly repent of their sins and believe the Gospel. And we purpose to continue so to do, God being our helper. The great and well tried doctrines of the Gospel, and of early Methodism; of sin and salvation; of the atonement of our Lord Jesus Christ; of the divinity and personality of the Holy Spirit; of future and eternal rewards and punishments, must still, and ever, be set forth with apostolic and Wesleyan fidelity. "For other foundation can no man lay, than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ," the same yesterday, to-day, and forever.

Notwithstanding the marked success God has been pleased to encourage and bless us with in the past, we find ample room for humility and deep searchings of heart, that, with our increased and growing Church accommodation, our increased ministerial and educational advantages, our class-meetings, Sabbath Schools, Epworth Leagues and Christian Endeavor organizations, our success in winning souls and saving the lost has not been more marked and rapid. We may have depended too much on exciting and sensational measures at certain periods of the year; and too little on the power of the preached Gospel, accompanied by the promised influence of the Holy Spirit in the ordinary means of grace. If it were strictly true that our people were all at it, and always at it, what might we expect, or rather what might we not expect? Oh, that this coming Conference year might witness a revival in every circuit, and salvation in every home! Is it not within our reach if we wait for power from on high?

As it is God's order to work by means, we may ask if there is as much attention as there should be given to the increase and usefulness of local preachers, a class of men greatly owned and honored of God in the past? When other Churches are calling out and using lay talent more than formerly, can we afford to be remiss? It is thought, and said, that class

meetings are declining. Can Methodism afford to have it so? Is there a tendency on the part of our people to slight or turn away from this precious, comforting and Scriptural means of grace; or are they only waiting to be kindled into fresh life and usefulness by the fidelity of intelligent, wise, consecrated leaders, who shall prove it to be a duty and a privilege to teach the young and the old the way of the Lord more perfectly? An intelligent revival of the class-meeting means a revival of Scriptural holiness. The Sabbath Schools of the Church are to be so conducted as to be the nurseries of the Church, and offer a fruitful field for largest talent, wisdom and faithfulness for the instruction and conversion of the young, who in a few years are to be the strength of the churches. The Epworth League and Christian Endeavor organizations, if wisely led and faithfully taught and utilized, may become sources of increase and helpfulness in bringing this world nearer to God. "Blessed are they that sow beside all waters." God commands that we should remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy. In these days of wide-spread Sabbath desecration, may we and our families so honor God and His holy day that we may know in keeping His commandments there is great reward. Allow us to urge and encourage you in the use of strict temperance principles and the disuse of tobacco, by your influence and example—not to use other arguments, time and money can be put to a better use. Wisdom and knowledge shall be the stability of the times. It is well-known the Rev. John Wesley, the honored founder of Methodism, did not neglect or overlook the circulation of good and useful literature among the early Methodists. Our Book Rooms in Toronto and Montreal provide a *constant* and suitable supply of valuable reading. The *Christian Guardian*, *Methodist Magazine*, and Sabbath School publications from our own publishing establishments invite your attention and offer you a supply. The hand of death has touched and thinned our ranks during the year. One of our younger ministry, in comparative youth and abundant in labours, has been called from labor to reward; and the gifted, eloquent, widely-known and greatly beloved Dr. Douglas has, after many years of deep affliction, faithful service, and eminent usefulness gone to his reward. Our Conferences shall no more hear his voice, be stirred by his eloquence, or see his face. George Douglas has exchanged the cross for the crown.

Faithful and earnest efforts have been made to carry forward the educational interests of the Church to a successful issue; and in doing so we have witnessed, in the midst of much business depression, the enlarged liberality of our people.

By the Divine blessing on the labours of God's servants we are enabled to report an increase of members for the year of 1,343. And now, brethren, let us look forward and upward. The vineyard of the Lord before His laborers lies. Shall we cultivate it for God? Shall we thrust in the sickle? Shall we catch our inspiration from above? Shall we wait at the throne of grace for holy anointing? Shall we believingly tarry for fresh power from on high? Shall we labor for Christ, for souls, for eternity?
