PEOPLE NOW REALIZING DANGER OF RECIPROCITY

Leonard Palmer, English Journalist, After Extended Tour of Canada Believes Conservatives Will Carry the Country—Prairie Provinces Growing Suspicious of Pact—British Investors Watching the Outcome.

That the Conservative party will carry the country at the coming elections by substantial majority is the opinion of Leonard Palmer, representative of the London Financial News, who arrived in the city yesterday after an extended tour of Canada.

"When I came to Canada," said Mr. Palmer to a Standard reporter last evening, "I was inclined to think that reciprocity would be a good thing for Canada, and thought the people would naturally vote for the ratification of the Taff-Fielding agreement, though I did not think that it was a desirable thing from an imperial point of view."

The Prairie Provinces. "How did you find the sentiment in the three prairie provinces, Mr. Palmer?" "Before I went west I was told that I would find the people of the prairie provinces overwhelmingly in favor of reciprocity, but I did not find that to be the case."

People Beginning to Realize. "It is my opinion," added Mr. Palmer, "that if the people had a longer time to study the question they would turn it down by an overwhelming majority. Many people are only just beginning to realize how it will affect the question of promoting the unification of the Empire, and what it may mean to Canada's economic interests."

Internal Interests. "Looking at the question from the standpoint of Canada's internal interests I cannot see where the advantage to gain any considerable benefits from reciprocity with the United States. The people in some sections may gain some slight benefits, but the disadvantages will outweigh any possible gains."
