Explanations, and Principal Articles of the Calendar for 1870.

EXPLANATIONS.

All the calculations are reduced to local mean time for Charlottetown, lat. $46^{\circ} 13' 55''$ N., long. $63^{\circ} 7' 23''$ W., with the exception of equation of time and Sun's right ascension and declination, which are given for apparent noon. The Sun's apparent semi-diameter is also inserted on the respective days for each complete second of arc.

At the head of each month, beside the changes of the Moon, are given the Moon's bearing at the time of change, the Perigee or Moon's nearest approach to the earth, and the days when the Moon crosses the Equator, and reaches her greatest north or south declination; on which point Saxby's system of Lunar Equinoxials is founded; the principle being that on these days the Moon's influence on the atmospheric tides is most marked; and when these times fall close upon the time of Moon's change or Perigee, this disturbing influence is proportionally increased. These cases are marked ** or *** according as two or three of these influences combine. When *** occur, a gale or other strong atmospheric disturbance may be expected with considerable certainty.

In addition to the general local disturbance on these days, the effects of a storm generated within the tropics is sometimes propagated so as to arrive in about two or three days—it having been found that the average rate at which these travel is about 16 miles per hour.

ECLIPSES.

There will be six Eclipses this year, two of the Moon and four of the Sun, one of which will be partially visible at Charlottetown.

I. A total eclipse of the Moon, January 17th. Greenwich mean time of opposition, 2h. 47m. 27s.

II. A partial eclipse of the Sun, January 31. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 2h. 59m. 11s. Only visible at the South Pole and the Antarctic Ocean.

III. A partial eclipse of the Sun, June 28. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 11h. 40m. 21s. Visible at Melbourne, Sidney, Van Diemen's Land, New Zealand and part of the South Pacific Ocean.

IV. A total eclipse of the Moon, July 12. Greenwich mean time of opposition, 10h. 33m. 36.8s. The Moon will rise at Charlottetown, partially but not conspicuously obscured in the Penumbra.

V. A partial eclipse of the Sun, July 27. Greenwich mean

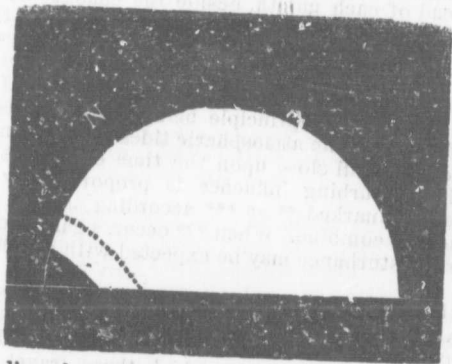

time of conjunction, 22h. 37m. 8.3s. Half-past 10 in the morning of the 28th, only visible at the extreme northern parts of Asia. The shadow of the Moon will pass over the earth from east to west.

VI. A total eclipse of the Sun, December 22. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 0h. 18m. 55.1s. The line of totality or centre of the Moon's shadow will pass near Cadiz, Algiers, Tunis, Malta, the centre of Greece, Constantinople and the Crimea. The eclipse will be partially visible at Charlottetown, ending a little after sunrise. More of the Phase will be seen to the eastward, as here represented.

PLANETS AND OCCULTATIONS.

MERCURY. The apparent motion is alternately direct or eastward and retrograde or westward between the following dates, when he will be stationary either to the east or west of the Sun : January 24th, E. ; February 14th, W. ; May 24th, E., June 16th, W. ; September 21st, E., and October 12th, W. Occultation by the Moon, February 27th, June 26th.

VENUS. The apparent motion is direct till January 31st, retrograde till March 14th, then direct till the end of the year. She will be an evening star till February 23rd. the time of her inferior conjunction, after which she will reappear as a morning star, till December 7th. Occultation by the Moon, July 25th, August 24th.

MARS. Apparent motion direct throughout the year. He will be in conjunction with the Sun on the 12th of March, after which he will reappear as an evening star till the end of the year. Occultation by the Moon. August 23rd, September 20th.

JUPITER. Motion direct from January 5th till October 15th, then retrograde to the end of the year. A morning star till his conjunction with the Sun, an evening star till December 13th, when he will be opposite the Sun, and at his greatest apparent magnitude, coming to the meridian at midnight. Occultations by the Moon, October 14th, November 11th, and December 8th.

SATURN. Apparent motion direct till April 7th, retrograde till August 26th, then direct to the end of the year. An evening star till the time of opposition to the Sun, June 16th, then a morning star till his conjunction, December 22nd. The ring of Saturn will be very favorably placed for observation throughout the year. Occultations by the Moon, March 23rd, April 19th, May 16th, June 13th, July 10th, (visible at Ch'town) August 6th, September 2nd and 30th, October 27th and November 24th.

URANUS. Retrograde till March 25th, direct till November 1st, and retrograde to the end of the year. In opposition to the Sun on the 9th of January, in conjunction on the 14th of June. Occultations by the Moon, April 8th, May 5th, June 2nd, June 29th, July 27th, August 23rd, September 20th, October 17th, November 13th, December 10th. Uranus may be readily found with a common telescope, if its position is known, taking the two bright stars of the Twins, Castor and Pollux as guides, the planet will be found in the relative positions shown in the cut: (1) January 9, (2) March 25, (3) November 1, (4) December 31.

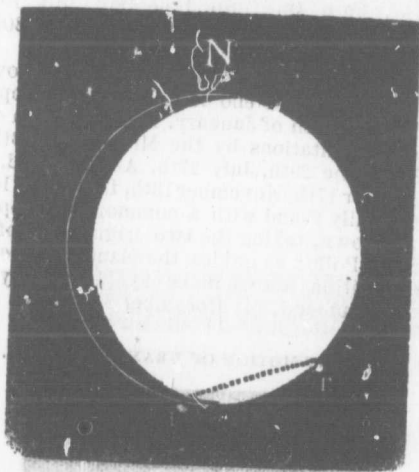

NEPTUNE. Motion direct till 24th July, retrograde to the end of the year. In conjunction with the Sun, April 8, in opposition, October 13.

An unusual number of occultations of the planets by the Moon occur during this year. Of these but one of Saturn, on the 10th of July will be favorable for observation at Charlottetown, the rest occurring either in the day time or when the Moon is below the horizon. On this occasion the planet will be seen to disappear at the eastern and darkened edge of the Moon at 8h. 2m. 57 sec., p. m., and reappear to the westward at the illumined edge at 8h. 31m. 26sec., after having been behind the Moon nearly half an hour.



The time of High Water is given for once in the 24 hours; the intervening tide being readily found by taking half the nominal interval between the two tides. The tides for the following places will be found by subtracting from Charlottetown time as follows :

Tea Cakes.—Two pounds of flour, two spoonfuls of yeast, made into a dough with warm milk. When ready (as for bread) to make into cakes, mix well two ounces of butter, two ounces of sifted sugar; let the cake stand to rise, brush over with milk, and bake in a quick oven.

Raisin Pudding.—Soak two ounces of raisins in enough brandy to cover them. Take half a pound of flour, half a pound of chopped suet, a dessert-spoonful of ground ginger, two eggs, four ounces of white sugar, and enough milk to make it a pretty light paste; add the raisins and brandy, and put it into a cloth or basin, boil it for two hours and serve with what pudding sauce you please.

Chocolate Blanc Mange.—A quarter of a pound of sweet German Chocolate, half a box of gelatine, one quart of milk, one coffee-cupful of sugar. Put it all in a dish set in a kettle of water, and let it boil an hour. When nearly cold turn into the mould.

Brighton Pudding.—Take three eggs, a quarter of a pound of sugar, quarter of a pound of flour, quarter of a pound of butter, and the peel of a lemon, finely minced. Beat the sugar and eggs for twenty minutes. Oil the butter, and mix it and the flour in at the last. Steam the pudding for one hour. Serve without sauce, only with preserve.

To extract Mildew from Linen.—Rub strong soap and salt on the mildewed spots; keep them moist and exposed to the sun; repeat several times. Use soap made with the lye from wood ashes.

To wash a Hoop Skirt.—Tie the skirt up in as small a package as possible; put it into a common muslin bag; then boil in strong soapsuds with a little soda. The day must be very pleasant, with a good air, as you have to hang the skirt out to dry. Your skirt will look as good as new.

Cream Tapioca Pudding.—Soak three tablespoonfuls of tapioca in water three hours, put the same in a quart of boiling milk; boil fifteen minutes. Beat the yolks of four eggs in one cup of sugar, stir them into the pudding five minutes before it is done; flavor with lemon or vanilla. Beat the whites of four eggs to a stiff froth with three tablespoonfuls of sugar, put this over the pudding and bake five minutes. A spoonful or two of prepared cocoanut in with the yolks and sugar is very good, the cocoanut can also be sprinkled over the top, on the whites before putting in to brown.

Rhubarb Wine.—Take the juice from the stalks of the garden rhubarb, one gallon, to it add one gallon of water in which seven pounds of sugar have been dissolved; put the mixture into a cask with the bung-hole open, and let it ferment; keep the cask full by adding sweetened water, so that it may purge itself. When it is sufficiently fermented, put in the bung. To give it a slight "bouquet flavor," three ounces of orris root, well pounded, is added to each barrel. Fine with isinglass before bottling. Four ounces of isinglass dissolved in a pint or more of wine, is sufficient for a barrel of wine.

Corn Cake.—A pint of buttermilk or sour milk; a pint of corn-meal; one egg; a teaspoonful of soda, one of salt, two of sugar or molasses. Dissolve the soda in a little warm water and add it the last thing. Bake half an hour in a quick oven.

Castle Puddings.—Beat a quarter of a pound of sugar and a quarter of a pound of butter ten minutes together; two eggs well-beaten; then add them to the butter and sugar. Beat the whole twenty minutes. Then add, by degrees, a quarter of a pound of dried flour. After the flour, beat the whole half white of the eggs, soda, and cream of tartar; two drops oil of bitter almonds.

Jelly Cake.—Half a cup of butter, two cups of sugar, three of flour, three eggs, one cup of milk or cream, one teaspoonful of cream of tartar, half a teaspoonful of soda.

Lemon Flummary.—Squeeze four lemons into a basin, throwing in the rinds, but not the seeds; add half a pint of water, half a pound of loaf sugar, and cover close for an hour; take out the lemon-rinds, and again cover, and let it stand all night. Then strain through a cloth, and add one ounce of isinglass, and put it in a saucepan with six eggs well beaten; set over the fire, and keep stirring one way till it is as thick as cream. When milk-warm, put into moulds previously dipped in cold water.

Chocolate Cake.—Two cups of sugar, one cup of butter, three cups of flour, three-quarters of a cup of milk, half a teaspoonful of soda, one teaspoonful of cream of tartar. *Paste.* Chocolate two ounces, one cup of sugar, three-quarters of a cup of sweet milk; boil half down. This makes one cake of four layers with paste between.

Sweet Biscuits.—Rub four ounces of butter well into eight ounces of flour; add six ounces of loaf-sugar, the yolks of two eggs, the white of one, and a tablespoonful of brandy. Roll the paste thin, and cut it with a wine-glass or cutter; egg over the tops of each with the remaining white, and sift on white sugar. Bake in a warm oven.

Forced Tomatoes.—Prepare the following forcemeat: two ounces of mushrooms, minced small, a small quantity of parsley, a slice of lean ham, chopped fine, a few savory herbs, and a little cayenne and salt. Put all these ingredients into a saucepan with a lump of butter, and stew all together until quite tender, taking care that they do not burn. Put it by to cool, and then mix with them some bread-crumbs and the well-beaten yolks of two eggs. Choose large tomatoes, as nearly of the same size as possible; cut a slice off stalk end of each, and take out carefully the seeds and juice; fill them with the mixture which has already been prepared, strew them over with bread and some melted butter, and bake them in a quick oven until they assume a rich color. They are a good accompaniment to veal or calf's head.

Graham Biscuit.—Two pints of buttermilk, half a pound of butter or lard, one teaspoonful of finely-pulverized soda in the flour.

Parsnip Fritters.—Boil the parsnips in salted water, so as to flavor them through; make a light batter, cut them round, and dip them in the batter. Have ready hot lard; take them up with a tablespoon, and drop them in while the lard is boiling. When they rise to the surface turn them; when browned on both sides take them out; let them drain, set them in the oven to keep hot. Serve with broiled, fried or roast meats or fowls.

Chicken Soup.—Cut up a nicely-dressed chicken; put in the pot with water to cover it, which must be measured, and half as much more added to it before the soup is dished. Keep it covered tight, boiling slowly, and take off the fat as fast as it rises. When the chicken is tender, take it from the pot, and mince it very fine; season it to the taste, and brown it with butter in a dripping-pan. When brown, put it back in the pot. Brown together butter and flour, and make rich gravy by adding a pint of the soup; stir this in the soup, and season with a little pepper, salt and butter. Scotch Shortbread.—One pound of flour, half a pound of fresh butter, three ounces of powdered lump-sugar. Thoroughly mix the flour and sugar. Place your butter in the middle of the pasteboard, and pile round it the mixed flour and sugar, which you must gradually and thoroughly work into the butter. When you have worked it smooth, roll it out. Cut in the form you wish, pinch round the edges, and put some caraway comfits or citron on the top. Bake in a very slow oven.

Sponge Cake.—Fourteen eggs, the weight of the eggs in sugar, the weight of eight eggs in flour, the juice and rind of one lemon, one teaspoonful of yeast powder. Bake quick.

Fowl Cutlets.—One fowl, one egg, pinch of pepper and salt, a tablespoonful of gravy. Cut up a fowl and bone it, form the legs, wings, breast, and merrythought into six cutlets, flattening and giving them a good shape; take the meat from the remainder of the fowl, and the liver, pound it in a mortar with pepper, salt and a spoonful of gravy; brush the cutlet over with an egg, spread the forcemeat over them, egg again, and cover with fried bread-crumbs, and fry them a light brown color; serve with lemon rind and gravy in a separate dish.

Sugar Cakes.—Three cups of sugar, one cup of butter, one cup of sour cream, four eggs, one teaspoonful of soda; mix the dough *very soft* and roll out.

A GOOD MUTTON SOUP.—A neck of mutton about five or six pounds, three carrots, three turnips, two onions, a large bunch of sweet herbs, including parsley; salt and pepper to taste; three quarts of water. Lay the ingredients in a covered pan before the fire, and let them remain there the whole day, stirring occasionally. The next day put the whole into a stewpan, and place it on a brisk fire. When it commences to boil, take the pan off the fire, and put it on one side to simmer until the meat is done. When ready for use, take out the meat, dish it up with carrots and turnips, and send it to table; strain the soup, let it cool, skim off the fat, season and thicken it with a tablespoonful, or rather more, of arrowroot; simmer for five minutes, and serve.

SWEETBREADS.—Scald them in salt and water, and take out the stringy parts. Then put them in cold water for a few moments. Dry them in a towel, dip in egg and crumbs, and fry brown in butter. When they are done, take them on a dish, pour into the frying-pan a large cup of sweet cream, a little pepper and salt, and a little green parsley chopped fine. Dust in a very little flour, and when it boils up pour it over the breads, and send to the table hot.

TONGUE, after it has been boiled, cut into thick slices, and stewed in a rich brown gravy, makes a very nice corner dish.

BOILED PARSNIPS.—To each half gallon of water allow one heaped table-spoonful of salt. Wash the parsnips, scrape them thoroughly, and, with the point of a knife, remove any black specks about them, and, should they be very large, cut the thick part into quarters. Put them into a saucepan of boiling water, and boil them rapidly until tender, which may be ascertained by thrusting a fork in them; take them up, drain them, and serve in a vegetable dish. This vegetable is usually served with salt fish, boiled pork, or boiled beef; when sent to table with the latter, a few should be placed alternately with carrots round the dish, as a garnish.

GRAHAM CRACKERS.—Take two pints of cold water, quarter of a pound of butter, quarter of a teaspoonful of soda; mix as stiff as can be worked, cut out, pick with a fork; bake in a moderately hot oven. These crackers, with a cup of sweet cream, make a very light, wholesome meal for dyspeptics.

COLORING FOR GRAVIES AND RAGOUTS.—Take four ounces of sugar (moist) and set it over the fire in a clean stewpan or earthen pipkin. When the sugar is melted and looks frothy, raise it higher from the fire, that it may not burn; keep stirring it all the time till it is a fine brown; pour in some red wine, taking care it does not boil over, add a little salt, lemon, mace, and a few cloves; boil all up gently for ten minutes, and pour it into a basin. When cold, put it into a bottle well corked.

BURNT ONIONS FOR GRAVIES.—Half a pound of onions, half a pint of water, half a pound of moist sugar, a third of a pint of vinegar. Peel and chop the onions fine, and put them into a stewpan (not tinned), with the water; let them boil for five minutes, then add the sugar, and simmer gently until the mixture becomes nearly black, and throws out bubbles of smoke. Ground Rice Cake. Four eggs, eight ounces of ground rice, eight of sugar, eight of butter, four of flour, the juice of half a lemon, the rind of a lemon, grated, and half a teaspoonful of carbonate of soda. Pound the sugar, mix it with the ground rice, flour and lemon-peel; beat the butter to a cream; add it and the eggs well beaten. Next put the lemon-juice and last the soda, mixed with a tablespoonful of milk; beat all together for a quarter of an hour and bake in a tin or mould lined with buttered paper. It will take about an hour to bake. The oven must be very hot.

Cut up the meat small, add the water, and let it simmer for two and three-quarter hours. Now add the vegetables, cut in thin small slices; season, and boil for one hour. Thicken with the rice and serve.

FRIED SHEEP KIDNEYS.—Cut the kidneys open without quite dividing them, remove the skin, and put a small piece of butter in the frying-pan. When the butter is melted, lay in the kidneys the flat side downwards, and fry them for seven or eight minutes, turning them when they are half done. Serve on

RICH SWEET APPLE PUDDING.—Half a pound of breadcrumbs, half a pound of suet, half a pound of currants, half a pound of apples, half a pound of moist sugar, six eggs, twelve sweet almonds, half a saltspoonful of grated nutmeg, one wineglassful of brandy. Chop the suet very fine; wash the currants, dry them, and pick away the stalks and pieces of grit; pare, core, and chop the apple, and grate the bread into fine crumbs, and mince the almonds. Mix all these ingredients together, adding the sugar and nutmeg; beat up the eggs, omitting the whites of three; stir these to the pudding, and when all is well mixed, add the brandy, and put the pudding into a buttered mould; tie down with a cloth, put it into boiling water, and let it boil for three hours.

DIRECTIONS FOR KILLING AND DRESSING POULTRY.—Poultry should be kept from food 24 hours before being killed. In killing and dressing, the best way is to hang the bird up by the legs and open the neck vein with the small blade of a knife, and then pick while the bird is bleeding, which may be done much easier than afterwards; the wings should be picked clean and not cut off as many do. The intestines should be removed while the bird is warm, always making as small an incision as possible for the purpose, draw out the intestines, leaving the gizzard and liver untouched.

Its sittings are held in the City Hall, on the first Wednesday in each month, with power to adjourn to the following day. The last day of issuing summonses for the monthly sittings, is the Monday week previous to the first said Wednesday. The Act gives jurisdiction to the extent of £20 in cases of debt and trover, and to £5 in slander, detinue and replevin.
