Dr. Wilson on University Federation.

Very little exception is likely to be taken from any point of view, to the remarks made on University college in its convocation address on Friday last.

Wilson made no secret of his dislike to the scheme formulated at a year ago. He described it correctly as a compromise, and he was quite correct also in saying that it was accepted by University college council and Toronto university senate as such.

On the other hand each of the other university corporations dealt with in its own way. The scheme was formally declined by the management of Queen's; it was accepted by the management of Trinity with such stipulations as to the acceptance read very like a declaration of war.

On one point Dr. Wilson's position was as sound as it was unmistakable; he protested strongly against allowing sectarian influence to dominate in the interests of French, culture, and higher education, leaving matters as they stand.

FINANCIAL AND COMMERCIAL.
