WHEAT ROLLED A LITTLE BIT

Do Higher Cables, but the Prices Did Not Hold.

Closing Quotations About the Same as Saturday—Corn Scored an Advance—Good Cash Demand for Oats—Provisions Firm—Latest Commercial News.

Monday Evening, Nov. 20. Chicago wheat market opened with a better feeling on an advance in Liverpool, but did not hold owing to light outside trade and liberal Northwest receipts.

Liverpool wheat futures are stronger to-day, closing bid to bid higher than on Saturday. Corn closed bid to bid higher than on Saturday.

The imports of wheat were 47,700 quarters from Atlantic ports, 31,000 quarters from Pacific ports and 1,000 quarters from Liverpool from Atlantic ports during the past week were 94,000 quarters.

Wheat and flour on passage to the United Kingdom are 1,800,000 quarters, and corn 1,140,000 quarters, wheat and flour to 1,300,000 quarters, Russian shipments are 1,700,000 quarters, and at Montreal 15,000 bushels.

The American visible wheat supply is 54,000,000 bushels, as compared with 52,922,000 bushels a year ago. The corn in sight is 13,033,000 bushels, against 12,882,000 bushels a year ago.
