And they succeeded long before its former possessors suspected exactly what they were about.

Tait of this city. Its Strategical Importance

A glance at the map will serve to show the strategical importance to Germany of this bit of rock. As above stated, it stands in the open sea about 40 miles from their mainland. It is equidistant from the mouths of their great rivers, the Weser and the Elbe, the former with its tremendous system of fortifications at Wilhelmshaven, and the latter with its scarcely less tremendous system at Cuxinaven. It is, therefore, within easy distance of the famous Kiel Canal, which connects the North Sea and the Baltic. When it is remembered that the whole coast-line of Germany does not exceed 200 miles and that its defence is wonderfully aided by the natural advantages of shallow waters and flat, sandy shores, no wonder will be felt that, standing as it does a sleepless sentinel on the watch for the approach of a hostile fleet, Germans have not grudged any expenditure of money and effort, and have exhausted all the resources of science and skill to render Heligoland impregnable from sea and in making it a coaling station for ships and A glance at the map will serve to land impregnable from sea and in mak-ing it a coaling station for ships and a safe anchorage and base of supplies for their submarines. 



No. What I have come out to denounce today are the villains, more mischevious than German spies, who ought to share their fate; who lie in wait to stain the chivalry of our boys, to poison their minds and undermine their characters. They are all traitors to this country.

London, Sept. 9—(Correspondence of The Associated Press.)—The shipping trade of Great Britain while suffering considerable losses from enemy sub-marines is nevertheless quietly strength-ening itself by means of various financial amalgamations of interests to meet the "after war" competition, and by means of fresh tonnage construction, despite the huge increase in cost of material and labor. The investing public also is

showing its belief in the future of British shipping by absorbing all sorts of shipping shares privately and on various stock exchanges.

The recent move by the admiralty in giving certain shipbuilding firms freedom to proceed with construction of mercantile vessels, has led to orders being freely placed in practically all the yards of Great Britain, most of which now have work on hand for the next two years. Overhaul and repair work is particularly brisk on the Clyde and Tyne, and in certain South Wales yards; several new vessels are completing and fitting out which were ordered as far back as early in 1914, while several large oil tankers in 1914, while several large oil tankers have recently been put in hand.

A new shipbuilding project at Chepstowe, for constructing standardized vestings and the constructions of the construction of the constr sels, is well under way and the yards are expected to be begun soon. Engineering firms have also been attracted to the district, which is experiencing a sharp
