CONCERNING PEACE

There is a very great difference between peace and peace at any price. If we may judge from the utterances of some of the advocates of peace, they would be willing to accept it at any price, although when the price came to be paid they would undoubtedly be of quiet a different opinion. Such persons appear in regard an outburst of indignation at stories of German brutality as evidences of depravity and of a generally blood-thirsty disposition. Why can they not see that it is peace itself which is attacked by Germany, and that even a violent death with honor is better

After all, the life of an individual or of a whole nation is not of as much importance as that honor he maintained in the world, and righteousness and justice become the guiding principles in the life of the race. Since there are such influences in the world as that of German militarism they must be met and overcome in the only possible way, no matter what the cost to this generation, if the path of the coming generations is to be made more smooth and the triumph of right principles is to be assured.
